Series Record vs. Old Dominion: Hofstra has won two of the last three meetings against the Lady Monarchs, including a 83-72 victory in the first matchup this season at the Mack Sports Complex on Jan. 20.

Overall in 2012-13, Hofstra has won two of the last four and has been victorious in two of the last three CAA road games with wins at UNC Wilmington and Georgia State.

Old Dominion entered Thursday morning ranked fourth in the CAA in scoring offense and third in team defense. The Lady Monarchs have also been protective of the basketball, leading the league in turnover margin with a plus-3.65 differential.

Hofstra is 4-19 in the all-time series.

Quick Hitters...

- Shante Evans became the first player in program history to crack 2,000 career points at Georgia State on Feb. 10.
- Dating to last season, senior forward Shante Evans has notched a double-double in 33 of Hofstra's last 47 games and has a streak of 10 in a row.
- Shante Evans has scored in double figures in 24 of 25 games for Hofstra this season.
- Shante Evans had back-to-back 20-point games before scoring 19 against Norfolk State.
- Andreana Thomas has taken on an increased workload this season, averaging 35.2 minutes per game.
- Anma Onyeuku is second in the CAA in field goal percentage at 54 percent.

Rebounding Record: Senior forward Shante Evans made history in Hofstra's road game at Marist on Nov. 28. By corralling the first of her 14 rebounds in the contest, Evans became Hofstra's all-time leading rebounder. She surpassed Kate Gordon's previous record of 1,031 career rebounds, which she set in a career that spanned 1994-98.

Milestone Reached: Evans picked up another cherished program record on the road, setting Hofstra's all-time points mark at George Mason on Jan. 13. Evans surpassed Dia LaBella's record of 1,840 career points set in a career that spanned 1978-82.

2,000 Club: Shante Evans became the first player in program history to reach 2,000 career points with her layup with less than a minute left in a 72-59 win at Georgia State on Feb. 10. Evans had 19 points and 11 rebounds. All three of her biggest milestones this season – the school's scoring and rebounding records along with her ,2000th point—have come on the road.

Career High: Junior guard Annie Payton set a career high when she scored 17 points to lead the Pride to a season-opening win against Stetson on Nov. 9. Her previous high was 15 set against Delaware on Jan. 2, 2011.

Career High, Part II: Junior Anma Onyeuku continued her stellar start to her first season as a starter when she hauled in a career-high 13 rebounds as part of a double-double effort against Harvard on Dec. 1.

Onyeuku continued her breakout season when the Fayetteville, Ga. native scored a career-high 21 points against SEC-member Auburn in front of her family at Auburn Arena on Dec. 9. Onyeuku went 9-of-14 from the floor and was 3-for-3 on foul shots against the Tigers.

Onyeuku scored in double figures in nine straight games, starting with Jan. 13 at George Mason before scoring four points at Drexel. She is one of two Hofstra players averaging in double figures.

Action Jackson: Asia Jackson gave Hofstra more than a lift off the bench against Norfolk State. The freshman guard set a personal high with 20 points and seven steals while racking up a season-high seven steals in the victory. Jackson also notched five assists.

At Georgia State, Jackson went 3-for-3 on three-pointers to help power Hofstra to a road CAA win on Feb. 10.

Team Effort: In holding Norfolk State to 47 points, Hofstra allowed the fewest points in almost three years. The Pride held Northeastern to just 37 points on Feb. 28, 2010 before limiting

the Spartans to a 29.4 percent shooting percentage from the field.

Hofstra then set a new season low when the pride held Drexel to 43 points, marking the second time the Pride has held a team below 50 points and a run of three straight games where Hofstra has limited opponents to fewer than 60 points.

SEC Success: With Hofstra's victory over Ole Miss on Dec. 21, the Pride posted the first regular season victory in program history against a member of the SEC. Hofstra's only previous win against a SEC team at any time was a third round victory over South Carolina in the 2007 WNIT.

Titles: Hofstra won the New York Life Holiday Invitational for a second consecutive season. Shante Evans had back-to-back 20-point games to earn tournament MVP honors as the Pride defeated Ole Miss and Northwestern in a three-day span. Anma Onyeuku joined Evans on the all-tournament team.

Recognizing Success: Before Hofstra's contest against Harvard on Dec. 1, the Pride unveiled a WNIT banner in the

Mack Sports Complex's rafters to commemorate the appearance in 2011-12. Last season marked the fourth time Hofstra had qualified for the WNIT.

Tiger Time: Hofstra played a team with the same nickname in back-to-back games. The Pride opposed the Princeton Tigers before taking on the Auburn Tigers on Dec. 9. The last time Hofstra played two teams with the same nickname in such a short span was 2005-06 when Hofstra played the UConn Huskies and Northeastern Huskies in a three-game span (Harvard was the middle game).

Helping Hand: Andreana Thomas has more than triple the assists of the next-closest teammate, racking up 156 helpers through 24 games. She has five individual 10-assist games this season, including a pair of 13-assist efforts.

Double-Digit Assists: Thomas fell just one assist shy of matching Candice Bellocchio's Hofstra single-game record of 14 assists when she finished with 13 helpers in an 83-72 win over Old Dominion on Jan. 20. Thomas had nine assists in the second half, nearly matching a mark set by Bellocchio at St. Francis on Nov. 18, 2009.

Thomas tallied 10 assists against just one turnover in Hofstra's victory over Ole Miss on Dec. 21 while also picked up five rebounds in that game. Seven of Thomas' 10 assists came in the second half.

Thomas notched her second 13-assist game at Georgia State on Feb. 10.

She nearly compiled the first recorded triple-double in Hofstra women's basketball history when she scored 10 points and added nine rebounds and eight assists against William & Mary on Jan. 6. Thomas tallied 10 assists and seven points in a win over Mason on Jan. 31.

Near Triple-Double: After her performance against William & Mary, Thomas again flirted with a triple-double in Hofstra's next game against CAA opponent Georgia State. Thomas posted a double-double with 11 points and 10 assists. She finished just two rebounds shy of the triple-double, grabbing all eight boards on the defensive end. Thomas became the first Hofstra player to post a double-double in points and assists since Candice

Bellocchio notched 21 points and 10 assists versus Delaware on Feb. 16, 2012.

She Can Do More: Besides her ability to facilitate the offense, Thomas showed she can score effectively as well. The guard scored a career-high 23 points at UNCW on Feb. 5. Thomas was also clutch at the line, going 11-for-12 on free throw attempts. Against the Seahawks, Thomas had 23 points and nine assists while notching three steals.

League Leader: Thomas leads the CAA in assists, averaging 6.6. She was also the first player in the league to crack the century mark in 2012-13. Her average is more than two full assists better than the next-closest competitor in the conference. Below is the league leaderboard in assists.

Nationally, Thomas entered the week 13th in assists per game. Akron's Kacie Cassell was first at 7.8 per contest. Thomas is also in the CAA's top-10 in assist-to-turnover ratio and free-throw percentage.

Streaks, Trends and Notes:

- Hofstra has won 17 of its last 37, 18 of its last 39, 22 of its last 44 games, 25 of its last 48, 31 of its last 55, 35 of its last 60, 50 of its last 86 and 56 of its last 96.

- Hofstra had won 14 straight games against teams from the state of New York, including 2-0 in 2011-12, before falling to nationally ranked St. John's on Nov. 17.

- Hofstra has won five of its last seven games against schools from the Big East Conference.

- Hofstra has won 20 of its last 29 home games and 39 of its last 54 home games (including 28 of its last 39 and 32 of its last 44). The Pride is 8-4 at home this season.

- Shante Evans averaged 19.2 points and 10.5 rebounds per game last season, becoming the first player to lead the team in scoring and rebounding in three straight years since Kate Gordon achieved that feat from 1995-98.

- Hofstra has made a three-pointer in 426 of its last 433 games. The streak ended at 109 games in a row on Feb. 6 after the Pride went 0-for-10 against Northeastern.

- Hofstra had made at least four three-pointers in every game this season through the first five contests before the streak was snapped on Dec. 1.

- The Pride is 78-18 in its last 96 games when they hold their opponent under 60 points.

- Since becoming a Division I program in the 1982-83 season, Hofstra is 65-13 all-time when scoring 80 or more points in a game.

- Hofstra has won four of its last six overtime contests and seven of its last 11 overtime games.

Good Competition: Hofstra packed the non-conference portion of the schedule with quality teams, giving the Pride a chance to match up against power conference schools that are playoff tested. The Pride's first seven games came against postseason qualifiers in 2011-12, with a win over WNIT participant Stetson before falling to a Texas squad that was nationally ranked in the second week and a St. John's squad that was ranked 20th in the Associated Press poll when Hofstra visited the Red Storm.

Before playing Auburn on Dec. 9, every team Hofstra had played qualified for the postseason last year. Princeton, which was the preseason favorite in the Ivy League, has already been the fourth NCAA Tournament team Hofstra has opposed in the non-conference portion of the schedule in the current campaign with Texas, St. John's and Marist also on that list.

Overall, Hofstra will play 12 teams that made the postseason last year. Head Coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey's squad will oppose five teams that made the NCAA Tournament and has already played multiple playoff teams already, including a road loss against a St. John's squad that advanced to the Sweet 16 and an upcoming home-and-home with CAA rival Delaware, which was a three-seed.

This year's schedule has already featured teams from some of the nation's top conferences including the Big 12 (Texas), Big East (St. John's) Southeastern (Auburn) along with wins against SEC-member Mississippi and a Big 10 opponent in Northwestern.

Hofstra faced schools from the Ivy League in consecutive games as the Pride made the short trip to face preseason favorite Princeton on Dec. 5.

The always-difficult CAA schedule began on Jan. 6 against William & Mary. Hofstra played Delaware on Feb. 3 and will conclude the home-and-home series against the Blue Hens on Feb. 28. The Pride will conclude the regular season March 6 at Northeastern. The CAA Championship will once again be held in the Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md.

50/50: Hofstra has shot better than 50 percent from the field three times this season after going 29-of-58 from the field at Georgia State on Feb. 10. Hofstra also shot 51.7 percent (30-for-58) at George Mason on Jan. 13 and shot 51.7 percent against Norfolk State.

Speed Limit Defense: Hofstra has lost just twice this season when holding teams to fewer than 60 points. The Pride is 6-2 with only Drexel and Northeastern posting wins in scoring less than 60 points.

Playing Percentages: Hofstra has forced opponents to shoot less than 40 percent from the field on 12 occasions this season, resulting in nine wins with the only losses coming on the road against No. 25 Delaware and at home versus Northeastern and James Madison.

CAA Preseason Poll: The Hofstra women's basketball program was picked third in the Colonial Athletic Association preseason poll. The poll was conducted by the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members and announced at the conference's annual media day.

Senior forward Shante Evans was also named to the preseason All-CAA First Team.

Delaware, which returns all five starters from last season's team that finished 31-2, was picked to win the CAA Women's Basketball championship. The results of the poll were announced during CAA Basketball Media Day at Champps-Pentagon Row in Arlington, Va.

AO Excels at REB: Junior Anma Onyeuku has become one of the best rebounders on the team, posting 10 boards in back-to-back games against St. John's and Saint Joseph's, respectively, to tie a career high.

She then shattered that mark with a 13-rebound effort versus Harvard on Dec. 1. By scoring 12 points in that contest, she notched her first double-double of the season and the second of her career.

Onyeuku then grabbed 15 rebounds, including 14 defensive boards, versus Drexel on Feb. 14 for the new career high. She accounted for nearly one-third of Hofstra's total rebounding total of 46 in that contest. Onyeuku then had 14 rebounds, including nine on the offensive glass, against James Madison.

Offensively, Onyeuku has found a groove from the field. She is second in the league in shooting percentage.

All-Around Game: Candace Bond has continued to be an impact player on the defensive side of the ball, entering the game first in the CAA in steals with 2.84 per game. She also made the league-leader board in blocked shots, currently tied for 11th place with 0.9 blocks per contest.

Bench Boost: Though the box scores won't usually list Annie Payton as a starter, the junior guard has logged minutes worthy of those who are out for the opening tap. Payton gave Hofstra huge lift as a reserve against Marist, scoring 16 points, including a pair of three-pointers. For the season, Payton is one of just four players to average more than nine points despite starting just eight of the first 25 games (9.1 PPG).

Payton added 13 points off the bench at James Madison on Jan. 27. She reached double figures in the first half, notching 10 points. She also scored in double figures against nationally ranked Delaware, adding 15 points in 30 minutes as a reserve.

Payton drilled a key three-pointer with 1:40 left at UNCW, helping Hofstra to a 75-69 victory over the Seahawks on the road on Feb. 5. In earning the start at Georgia State on Feb. 10, Payton contributed 12 points.



The Evans File: Senior forward Shante Evans is averaging a double-double and continues her bid to earn her third consecutive All-America selection.

Evans scored in double figures in the first seven games for Hofstra this season and posted back-to-back 20-point game

against BCS-member teams in wins over Ole Miss and Northwestern., Evans has made numerous watch lists for prestigious awards, as seen below:

Wooden Award: Forward Shante Evans continues to pile up the accolades for her strong play. The senior was named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top-30 watch list by the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

Evans was one of just 30 women's basketball players who were tabbed as early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. The selections were based on last year's individual performance and team records. The list was chosen by a preseason poll of national college women's basketball media members.

Last season, Evans was named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top-20 list. As a junior, Evans garnered her second *Associated Press* All-American selection. She averaged 19.2 points and 10.5 rebounds per game. Evans was one of just two players from the Colonial Athletic Association to make the list, joining Delaware's Elena Delle Donne.

The 37th annual Wooden Award ceremony will honor the men's and women's Wooden Award winners the weekend of April 5-7, 2013. It will include the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams.

She was Hofstra's first ever nominee for either award and following her sophomore season she was Hofstra's first-ever *Associated Press* All-American (honorable mention) before duplicating that feat at the end of the 2011-12 season.

Senior CLASS Award: Shante Evans was selected as a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award.

Evans (West Chester, PA) was one of just 30 women's basketball players picked to be a candidate for the prestigious award. To be eligible, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

From the list of 30 candidates, a national media committee will select ten finalists for the 2012 Senior CLASS Award in February. Those ten names will then be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award.

Besides her athletic accomplishments, Evans' off-the-court work helped her earn the nomination. She has served as a team captain while also participating with teammates and staff in charitable initiatives like volunteering with the Interfaith Nutrition Network. In the classroom, she is pursuing a degree in history. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award honors the attributes of senior student-athletes in four areas: community, classroom, character and competition. The award program is designed exclusively for college seniors who are utilizing their complete athletic eligibility, remaining committed to their university and pursuing the many rewards a senior season can bring.

Naismith Trophy: Shante Evans was named to the Naismith Trophy early season watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Nov. 15.

Evans was one of just 50 players selected to the list for an award that is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's player of the year.

The West Chester, Pa. native made the Naismith Trophy watch list for the second consecutive season. Evans earned the distinction last November and was also one of just 32 players selected to the midseason list for 2012.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. In March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

Notable Naismith Women's College Player of the Year winners include Chamique Holdsclaw, Lisa Leslie, Rebecca Lobo, and Tina Charles.

Evans is one of just two players from Colonial Athletic Association schools to be added to the list, joining Delaware's Elena Delle Donne.

Double Up: Shante Evans picked up the 17th double-double of the season and the 67th double-double of her career when she added 10 points and 11 rebounds at Towson in the last game.

Evans' most dominant double-double performance came on Jan. 31 when she scored 33 points and 23 rebounds versus George Mason.

Perfect: Shante Evans shot 6-for-6 from the field in the win over George Mason on Jan. 13, marking the first time a Hofstra player was perfect from the field (minimum five attempts) since Amaka Agugua also went 6-for-6 versus Georgia State on Feb. 10, 2006.

Double-Record: After setting Hofstra's all-time points and rebounding record in her senior season, Evans joined a select list of active players who are hold their program's career records in both prestigious categories. Evans joined Kennesaw State's Sametria Gideon, Loyola Marymount's Alex Cowling and NAU's Amy Patton on that list. Like Evans, Gideon is a 6-0 forward. At 5-10, Cowling has played both guard and forward.

Stay Active: Among active players, Shante Evans' 67 career doubles-doubles is the most of any Division I women's basketball player, according to STATS LLC. Evans total is more than three-time All-America and AP Player of the Year Brittney Griner from Baylor among an impressive list. Griner is currently third in double-doubles while Saadia Doyle from Howard is second.

Chasing CAA History: With 1,280 career rebounds, Shante Evans will now be looking to pick up the conference record in addition to Hofstra's all-time mark. The CAA record is held by James Madison's Meredith Alexis (2004-07) who hauled in 1,313 rebounds. Evans will challenge Alexis' mark. With a minimum of five games left (including at least one CAA Tournament contest), Evans would need to average 6.8

rebounds per game to break the record. Evans' current average is 11.5 boards per game.

As an interesting side note, Hofstra head coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey helped recruit and develop Alexis when she served as an assistant coach at JMU for four years prior to taking the head coaching job for the Pride.

Defensively Speaking: Senior Candace Bond earned her second straight CAA All-Defensive team selection. She led the CAA in steals for a second consecutive season. As a junior, her 84 steals was sixth-highest single season total in program history. While averaging 28.7 minutes per game, she also showed a good offensive game to complement her defensive prowess. Bond score a career-high 18 points in WNIT loss to Harvard. She also added a career-best 14 rebounds versus Marist to go along with 15 points. She had at least one steal in 28 games.

Stolen Away: Candace Bond continued her propensity for steals, swiping 71 balls through the first 25 games. Against Princeton on Dec. 5, Bond set a season-high and a team season high with five steals. That was part of a solid all-around game in which the senior scored nine points, grabbed six rebounds, tallied an assist and blocked a shot against a Tigers squad that was picked to win the Ivy League in the preseason.

Home Cooking: Hofstra has historically had success at home. The Pride was successful at the Mack Sports Complex last season, going 10-5. Since the 2008-09 season, Hofstra is 46-18 at home, including 10-win home finishes in each of the last three campaigns.

For Three: Shante Evans has accomplished much in a career that has already netted two All-American selections. But Evans notched a first in her four-year career against Princeton on Dec. 5 when she knocked down a three-point attempt. For the first time in six attempts, she made a three-pointer. Entering the season, Evans was 0-for-3 during the last three years on three-point attempts. She missed her first two attempts this year before burying a right-wing shot against the Tigers.

Free Throw Shooting: Hofstra shot 10-of-11 on free throw attempts at Drexel on Jan. 17 for a 90.9 percentage. That marked the first time the Pride cracked the 90 percent threshold in almost three years. Hofstra last accomplished that when it shot 92.3 percent (24-of-26) at William & Mary on March 2, 2011. Against Drexel, the Dragons also shot 13-of-14 (92.9 percent), with the teams combining to go 23-of-25.
