NOT IN OUR HOUSE:

Last Sunday's game, a 69-61 victory over #16/19 Rutgers improved Old Dominion's home win-streak to 20 straight games and gave the Lady Monarchs its third victory over a ranked opponent at the Ted Constant Convocation Center since the building opened for the 2002-03 season. Last season the Lady Monarchs went a perfect 17-0 at home with their lass loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center being back on March 22, 2003 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament with a 73-74 setback to "Sweet 16" participant Boston College. The Lady Monarchs have suffered just four home losses since moving to the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2001.

AND WE'RE OFF:

The Lady Monarchs are off to a 3-1 start in 2004-05, the best start by the Old Dominion women's basketball team since the 1999-2000 season. That year, the Lady Monarchs opened the season with a 7-1 record with their only loss coming at the hands of Connecticut, 66-109. Among the seven victories included Hampton, Clemson, Memphis, Syracuse, Virginia, Denver, and Vermont. That team, which advanced to the "Sweet 16" and ended the year with a 29-5 record, featured two seniors (Nicole Bellinghausen, Natalie Diaz), three juniors (Lucienne Berthieu, Tanty Maiga, Mandy Olley), two sophomores (Sharron Francis, Tiffany Thompson), and three freshman (Kim Giddens, Okeisha Howard, Alli Spence).

THE VIRGINIA SERIES:

Old Dominion may hold a 16-11 all-time series advantage over the University of Virginia, but its the Cavaliers who have won five of the last seven meetings. The Cavaliers were Old Dominion's first ever opponent at the Ted Constant Convocation Center where the Lady Monarchs fell 55-63 back on November 22, 2002. Virginia held just a 2-10 record at the Fieldhouse, but on their home court at University Hall, the Cavaliers hold a 8-4 record against the Lady Monarchs. In the 16 losses suffered at the hands of Old Dominion, 12 those games Virginia has lost by 20 or more points.

SORRY NANCY:

Shareese Grant managed to take a record away from Nancy Lieberman in Sunday's victory over #16/19 Rutgers. Although Grant shot just 2-of-12 from the field, the Virginia Beach, Virginia native sunk an incredible 17-of-18 from the floor and ended the afternoon with a game-high 21 points. The 17 free throws made surpassed the previous record of 15 held by Lady Monarch legend Nancy Lieberman against Pittsburgh back on Jan. 10, 1978. Liebermann record stood for over 26 years.

MORE FROM THE LINE:

Shareese Grant wasn't the only Lady Monarchs to have an impressive performance at the free throw line on Sunday against Rutgers. Junior Lawona Davis took her first free throws of the year against the Scarlet Knights and managed to hit all 10 of her attempts. Head coach Wendy Larry joked about both Shareese Grant's and Lawona Davis' free throw abilities after the game. She noted that even though Grant broke a nearly 26 year old record held by Lady Monarch legend Nancy Lieberman, its Davis who earns the team's sticker for going perfect from the line. Grant actually missed a free throw going 17of-18. The coaches award stickers following each game based on various performances.

CHARITY STRIPE POINTS:

Old Dominion shot the ball well from the free throw line against the Yellow Jackets in the season. The Lady Monarchs miss just one free throw hitting eight of their nine attempts from the line for a 88.9 percentage. Among those going perfect were Corrina Turner (2-of-2), Shahida Williams (2-of-2), and Megan

Pym (4-of-4). Last season, Old Dominion shot at a 69.7 percent clip and hit the 80.0 percent mark only three times. Tuesday's free throw percentage was the highest since ODU hit 11-of-12 (91.7 percent) against Delaware in the 2003 CAA Championship game back on March 15th, 2004.

1,000 AND COUNTING:

With 21 points against the Scarlet Knights of Rutgers, senior guard Shareese Grant continued to move up the all-time scoring leaders list. Last Tuesday against East Tennessee State, Grant surpassed Aubrey Eblin (1995-1999) for the 22nd on the all-time list surpassing Rhonda Rompola (1978-1981). With 1,074 career points under her belt, Grant has her sights on moving past former teammate and WNBA draftee Sharon Francis (1998-02) who sits in 21st with 1,085. Grant eclipsed the 1,000 career point mark becoming the 24th Lady Monarch in history to reach the milestone. Grant reached the mark with her fifth point in season opening 64-71 setback at Georgia Tech in the first of a two free throw award with 8:53 remaining in the first half.

LAST TIME SINCE #1 UCONN:

In their first victory of the season, Old Dominion handed in-state rival a 87-56 loss. The 31-point defeat was the biggest loss for the Hokies since a 42-77 setback to then top ranked Connecticut back on February 10th, 2002

CHAIRWOMAN OF THE BOARDS

Sherida Triggs has certainly done her job of crashing the boards. The sophomore from Norcross, Georgia is currently averaging 10.5 boards per game, ranking her third in the CAA in the category. Against Virginia Tech in the home opener the 6-1 forward collected a career-high 17 rebounds (eight offensive, nine defensive), the most rebounds by a Lady Monarch since Monique Coker grabbed 17 on three occasions last season (2/29 - at George Mason, 2/5 - at Towson, 12-15 vs. Florida International). Triggs' previous high was nine against a ranked Colorado squad in the first game of the season last year.

PRIME TIME PYM:

Rookie center/forward Megan Pym has quickly become of fan favorite impressing Lady Monarchs fans with her skill and hustle. Making her first appearance as a Lady Monarch on November 23rd, Pym came off the bench to become one of three Old Dominion players in double digits netting 12 points in 16 minutes of play. The first-year

Lady Monarch shot 4-of-5 from the field and a perfect 4-of-4 from the field. She followed by playing 22 minutes against Virginia Tech, the most minutes by any of the Old Dominion rookies thus far in the young season. Against the Hokies, Pym had six points, six rebounds, and four steals. The Newfield, New York native made her first career start against a ranked Rutgers squad.

A TALE OF TWO ACL'S:

Both junior Paula Muxiri and sophomore Corrina Turner will miss the 2004-05 season after suffering an ACL tears in their knees. Muxiri tore her ACL in her left knee in mid-November. The 6-1 forward from Angola in Africa will undergo surgery in December following her final exams on December 19th. Last season, Muxiri averaged 3.7 points and 2.6 rebounds as one of the top Lady Monarchs off the bench. She averaged 14.2 minutes per game and shot .480 from the field. Center Corrina Turner has elected to receive surgery on her left knee after suffering a tear in her anterior cruciate ligament during the Lady Monarchs' season opener at Georgia Tech on November 23rd. In the meantime, she will complete her degree in communications this December with in the intention of continuing with a post-graduate degree in the spring. The 6-6 center from Miami, Florida has been a member of the Lady Monarchs since the Fall of 2000. During her career she has averaged 6.8 points and 7.0 rebounds. During Old Dominion's run to the "Elite Eight" in 2002, Turner's first full season, she made 25 starts averaging 6.2 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Turner has suffered two torn ACL's in her right knee, the first occurring after six games in her first season with Old Dominion in 2000 and the second right before the start of the preseason in 2001. She originally tore her left ACL right after the start of preseason practice for the 2003-04 season. Turner will undergo surgery on December 15th.

WE'LL BE BACK:

The Lady Monarchs visited the city of Atlanta, Georgia in their 2004-05 season opener and the city will be one the Lady Monarchs will become familiar with in the near future. Georgia State, located in Atlanta with approximately 28,000 students along with Northeastern in Boston, Massachusetts, will join the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) as the conference expands to 12 members for the first time in its 20-year history in the 2005-06 season. The new members will give the CAA a presence in five of the nation's nine largest media markets (#1 New York, #4 Philadelphia, #6 Boston, #8 Washington, D.C. and #9 Atlanta). Headquartered in Richmond, Virginia., the CAA showcases the talents of student-athletes, coaches and administrators who stand out not only on the playing field, but also in the classroom. CAA schools have produced 16 national team champions in five

different sports, 33 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year, 11 national players of the year, 12 Honda Award winners, 16 NCAA post-graduate scholars, five Rhodes Scholars and four Nobel Prize winning faculty.

ALL THAT JAZZ:

Jazzmin Walters, a 5-2 guard from Lake Taylor High School in Norfolk, Virginia, has signed a national letter of intent to play women's basketball at Old Dominion beginning next fall. Walters averaged 19.9 points, seven assists, and six steals as a junior, leading her school to a 20-4 record and an appearance in the East Region quarterfinals. Entering her senior season, she has accumulated 1,286 career points and scored in double figures in each of her 24 appearances last season. Additionally, she also earned Eastern District Defensive Player of the Year, a First Team All-Eastern District, Street & Smith Honorable Mention All-America, and AP Second Team All-State honors. Walters was ranked 87th in the Blue Star Report of the country's Top 100 senior high school women's basketball athletes. She also attended the Nike All-America Camp and was a Co-MVP at the End of the Trail Tournament, an all-star event in Oregon. Walters becomes the fifth student-athlete to sign with Old Dominion from the Hampton Roads area in the last three seasons.

RESERVE ROOMS NOW:

The CAA women's basketball tournament is right around the corner and the athletic department has put together a fan hotel package for the big event in Fairfax, VA., March 9-12. The Best Western Fairfax is holding a block of rooms for ODU fans until Feb. 23, 2005 at the low rate of \$69 per night (double/double or king). Rooms are being held beginning Wednesday, March 9 through Saturday, March 12 and the CAA championship game. FAMILIAR FACE RETURNS:

Adrienne Goodson, a WNBA All-Star, Kodak District All-American, and a member of the 1985 NCAA National Championship women's basketball team, has joined the Lady Monarch coaching staff. Goodson will serve as a replacement for assistant coach Juliet McGee Schweiter who is on maternity leave. Schweiter and her husband, Herb, welcomed their first child, Gavin Richard, on October 15th. During her career at Old Dominion, Goodson was a two-time second team All-Sun Belt performer and was also on the Sun-Belt All-Tournament squad in 1987. As a junior in 1987, she was named the Sun Belt Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player and as a senior in 1988, she was named the Sun Belt Player of the Year. During her freshman sea-

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

11/29 - Shareese Grant:

Shareese Grant averaged 20 points per game against ACC opponents Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech and scored her 1,000th career point in an Old Dominion uniform last week. Grant scored a team-high 18 points on 7-of-16 shooting against Georgia Tech. The senior from Virginia Beach, Va. led all scorers with a 22 point outing on 10-of-19 shooting in the Lady Monarchs' win over Virginia Tech. Additionally, she dished out a game-high six assists against the Hokies.

12/6 - Shareese Grant:

Grant led Old Dominion to two victories, a 30 + point victory over East Tennessee State and a 69-61 win over #16/19 Rutgers. Grant led all scorers in the 86-52 win over the Lady Bucs as Old Dominion posted back-to-back 30-point wins for the first time since the 2001-02 season. Grant once again led all scorers with 21 points against a ranked Scarlet Knight squad to give Old Dominion its third victory over a ranked opponent at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Of her 21 points, Grant scored 17 of them from the free throw line setting a new school record for free throws made in a game. She resets the record held by Nancy Lieberman that was set back on January 10, 1978 against Pittsburgh.

son, Goodson was a member of the 1985 NCAA National Championship squad. She averaged 9.5 points per game as she scored 323 points, which is the seventh most points scored in Lady Monarch history for a freshman. In the NCAA title game, Goodson scored nine points and hauled in six rebounds to help the Lady Monarchs defeat Georgia, 70-65 in Austin, Texas as Old Dominion rolled to a 31-3 record. With Goodson on the floor, the Lady Monarchs won the Sun Belt Conference title in 1985 and in 1987 and helped lead Old Dominion to three NCAA tournaments. Goodson closed out her career with 1,574 career points and 863 career rebounds. She ranks 11th all-time in scoring. Following her graduation in 1988 with a degree in secondary education, Goodson captained the 1993 USA National Basketball team and was a two-time All-Star in the American Basketball League for the Richmond/ Philadelphia Rage. She has spent the last six years in the WNBA. Selected by the Starzz in the third round (27th overall) in the 1999 WNBA Draft, she spent four years in Utah before playing the last two seasons with the San Antonio Silver Stars. In 2002, she was selected to the WNBA All-Star Team.

The Lady Monarchs are in the NCAA record books for capturing the most consecutive conference championships. In league play, Old Dominion holds a 233-11 overall record, which includes eights seasons of undefeated play. The Lady Monarchs hold a 126-1 record at home and a 107-10 road record. The lone CAA loss on Old Dominion's homecourt was back at the ODU Fieldhouse, the former Lady Monarch homecourt from 1969-2002, against Richmond, now of the Atlantic-10, with a 70-74 defeat on February 19, 1992. Four schools in the league have yet to beat the Lady Monarchs - Drexel (6-0), George Mason (34-0), UNC-Wilmington (30-0), and Towson (6-0).

Points of Pride

The pride of Old Dominion University and its athletic programs reflects the...

Recognition of the excellence of our program...

- Over the last 20 years, 87% of Old Dominion's student-athletes that have exhausted their eligibility have graduated, a percentage far above the national average.
- Old Dominion University athletic teams have captured 28 team national championships and four individual titles, including a men's basketball crown in Division II in 1975, three titles women's basketball, nine in field hockey, 15 in sailing, and individual championships in wrestling and women's tennis.
- Old Dominion has been the site of five NCAA women's national championships including the 1982 and 1983 basketball "Final Four" and the 1985, 1986 & 2000 field hockey tournaments.
- Old Dominion was selected as one of 45 institutions nationally for the NCAA Pilot Certification Program, a pioneer program that looked at the athletic department's overall operations, including philosophy, academic requirements, competition, etc.
- Old Dominion was among one of the first institutions to implement a successful drug testing and education program, now entering its thirteenth year.
- The SACS Committee commended the University and the Athletic Department on its program oh high integrity, honesty, fiscal soundness and effective management, noting that excellent people, facilities and services are in place
- Old Dominion University was the first institution in Virginia to offer grants-in-aid for women athletes, beginning in 1974.
- Old Dominion's nine national titles in field hockey are unprecedented in NCAA record books for most titles in that sport by the same school.
- Old Dominion has had 100 first team All-Americans and 82 Academic All-Americans since 1976.
- Old Dominion has been the host site of three ICSA Sailing national championships, including 1985 Team Race, Dinghy, Women 1993 Team Race and 2001 men's and women's singlehanded.

Reaching the pinnacle of achievement and honor within sport...

- Seven former Old Dominion coaches or athletes have been inducted into national sports halls of fame. Former Old Dominion basketball standout and three-time Olympian Anne Donovan was inducted into the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American Hall of Fame in May of 1994, and was inducted into the Hall of Fame on May 15, 1995. Nancy Lieberman-Cline was inducted into the Basketball Naismith Hall of Fame in 1996 and both Nancy and Anne were in the first class of inductees in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998. In 2002, former women's basketball coach Marianne Stanley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Retired wrestling coach Gray Simons is an inductee of the U.S. Wrestling Hall of Fame, Beth Anders is enshrined in the U.S. Field Hockey Association Hall of Fame, and the late Bud Metheny is remembered in the Collegiate Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. Sue Stahl, named Lacrosse Magazine's Coach of the Century, was inducted into Virginia Lacrosse Hall of Fame and the United States Lacrosse Hall of Fame.
- Ten Monarch coaches and athletes have been enshrined in the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in Portsmouth, Va.- Bud Metheny, Paul Webb, Gray Simons, Dave Twardzik, Nancy Lieberman, Tom Scott, Anne Donovan, Yogi Hightower-Boothe, Joseph "Scrap" Chandler and Lou Plummer.
- Three former Old Dominion University women's basketball players have been recognized as national players of the year; Nancy Lieberman 1979 and 1980 Wade Trophy winner and Honda-Broderick Cup winner in 1980 (nation's top female athlete); Anne Donovan 1983 Naismith Award winner; and Ticha Penicherio 1998 Wade Trophy winner.
- Seven women athletes have earned the Honda award as the nation's top athlete in their sport. Nancy Lieberman won the award in 1979 and 1980 in women's basketball, Anne Donovan in 1983, while Yogi Hightower, Kelli James, Chrisy Morgan, Mimi Smith, Marina Digiacomo and Tiffany Snow were named the Honda Award winners for field hockey in 1983, 1984, 1993, 1998, 2000 and 2002.
