Brian O. Hemphill, Ph.D., Old Dominion University's ninth president effective July 1, 2021, is an unwavering champion for access and

opportunity, as well as innovation and research, with a deep commitment to forward-focused leadership. President Hemphill is proud to lead ODU with a steadfast dedication to excellence, a firm commitment to accountability and transparency, and — most importantly — a strong focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion, as well as student success.

President Hemphill's road to ODU has taken him from the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville, a flagship university, where he served as Associate Vice Chancellor and Dean of Students; to Northern Illinois University, a large, public, research university, where he served as Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management and Associate Professor for eight years; West Virginia State University, a public, land-grant, research university, where he served as the 10th President and Professor for four years; and, most recently, Radford University, a comprehensive university, where he served as the seventh President and Professor for five years.

President Hemphill earned a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration and Policy Studies from the University of Iowa, a Master of Science degree in Journalism and Mass Communication from Iowa State University of Science and Technology, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Organizational Communication from Saint Augustine's University. President Hemphill is a published author with a multitude of writings covering topics related to gun violence and threat preparedness on college campuses; emerging financial concerns affecting the collegiate sphere; STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and economic-related issues pertaining to education;

and a myriad of additional scholarly perspectives pertinent to the higher education environment. President Hemphill co-edited a book, titled "College in the Crosshairs: An Administrative Perspective on Prevention of Gun Violence." He is a highly sought-after keynote speaker, guest presenter, and panelist with frequent appearances across the country.

President Hemphill's passion for life and unparalleled commitment to excellence begins at home where he shares his life with his loving and supportive wife, Dr. Marisela Rosas Hemphill, who proudly serves as ODU's First Lady. The Hemphills are the proud parents of energetic twins, Catalina and Cruz. President Hemphill also has two adult children, Jada, a public school teacher in Fort Worth, Texas, and Jordan, assistant director of athletics development at the University of Iowa. DR. CAMDEN WOOD SELIG



Dr. Camden Wood Selig is in his 15th year as Director of Athletics at Old Dominion University, where his “Championship Effort” philosophy has helped guide the department as one of the most respected and successful intercollegiate programs in the nation. Of the 133 FBS Athletic Directors, Selig is the 12th longest FBS tenured in the country. He is in his 26th year as a Division I AD.

During his tenure, Selig has directed the University’s move through two FBS conferences and has Old Dominion positioned strongly in the Sun Belt Conference. He has overseen the transition of a startup FCS football program to the FBS level, led major athletic facility expansion and enhancement for virtually all 18 programs, and added women’s volleyball in 2019.

One needs only to visit the ODU campus to see Selig’s contributions to the growth and improvement of Monarch athletic venues with well over \$100 million invested in Intercollegiate athletic facilities since his arrival. Projects completed and initiated under Selig include:

- ODU opened the \$70 million Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium on Saturday, August 31, 2019 against Norfolk State. The stadium rebuilding was completed in nine months.
- A \$22 million baseball renovation began in the fall of 2022. The new stadium, which should be complete for the 2026 season, will be called the Ellmer Family Baseball Complex.
- The Bernett & Blanche Mitchum Basketball Performance Center, a privately funded \$8.4 million state-of-the-art facility, is complete and is the new training center for the ODU men’s and women’s basketball teams.
- The \$3.5 million repurposing of the arena in the Jim Jarrett Athletic building is now the brand-new 900 seat home of the ODU women’s volleyball program.
- A \$3.5 million expansion of L.R. Hill support facility for football, women’s field hockey, and women’s lacrosse, including a new state-of-the-art weight room.
- The addition of a \$2.3 million video replay scoreboard, LED ribbon panels, and digital tables at Chartway Arena.
- The \$600,000 Paul A. Keyes Indoor Hitting Complex, which opened in the fall of 2014.

As collegiate athletic costs continue to rise, Selig has placed a premium on increasing privately generated revenue. Since his arrival in 2010:

- Total ODAF philanthropic gifts for athletics have surpassed \$140 million.
 - Corporate sponsorship revenue has surpassed \$33 million.
 - Staff giving to the Old Dominion Athletic Foundation (ODAF) has remained at 100% for 14 consecutive years.
- And, in ODU’s first year in the Sun Belt Conference, they led in attendance for men’s and women’s basketball and set a single-season ODU record for football.

One of the most dramatic and gratifying accomplishments for Selig has been the academic success of the 18 teams. Highlights from 2023-24 include:

- An ODU record 197 student athletes (49%) earned Dean’s List honors with a 3.4 or higher GPA.
- An ODU record 3.28 cumulative GPA for all 423 student-athletes.
- A 3.0 GPA or higher for 17 of 18 teams.

Monarch teams have performed well on the playing fields under Selig, highlighted by:

- Nineteen Conference Championships since 2010, including back-to-back-to-back championships for women’s soccer and four-straight conference championships for women’s tennis. ODU had three Sun Belt-Conference Championships for the second-straight year, with women’s soccer, women’s tennis and men’s tennis all defending their titles from the season prior. The field hockey team won its first Big East Championship defeating Liberty in the championship game.

In Selig’s tenure there have also been numerous firsts and achievements that haven’t been accomplished in many years, including:

- Linebacker Jason Henderson in 2022-23 became the first ODU football player to earn All-America honors at the FBS level. And the first football player to earn first-team All-America honors.

- In 2016, ODU participated in its 1st bowl game in the Bahamas. In 2021, went to its 2nd bowl game in Myrtle Beach and last year it's third bowl game with the Famous Toastery Bowl in Charlotte, North Carolina.
- Women's soccer won its first C-USA Championship in 2022 and first conference championship since 2006.
- In June 2022, baseball first baseman Matt Coutney was named C-USA Player of the Year and honored on four All-American teams. Additionally, he earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors becoming the first baseball player in 17 years to be named an Academic All-American.
- In May 2021, the women's tennis team won the Conference USA Championship for the first time, its first conference championship since 2001. They have since won three-straight conference championships and have won an NCAA first round Tournament match three-straight years, including wins over Arkansas and South Carolina, and has advanced to the final 32 each of the last three seasons.
- Over the 2021 and 2022 baseball seasons, ODU was one of just 11 schools in the country and the only school in Virginia to have back to back 40+ win seasons.
- ODU baseball has the 17th best winning percentage in the country since 2021.
- Twenty baseball players have been drafted under current head coach Chris Finwood, who Selig hired in 2010.
- The baseball team won its first C-USA Championship, earned a No. 1 seed at the NCAA Regionals and received its highest final ranking in July 2021 of No. 16 in the Top-25 poll.



Hampton Roads Community outreach and support has been a staple under Selig's leadership:

- Selig spearheaded the return of the annual Khedive Shriners' Oyster Bowl game to Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium in 2011 and helped raise over \$250,000 for the Shriners' Children's Burn Hospital since that time.

Selig spent 11 years directing the Western Kentucky University Hilltopper athletic program, which won 70 Sun Belt Conference Championships from 2000-2010 and a national record 19 crowns in two seasons, 2008-2010. He also led WKU from FCS to FBS and is the only AD in the country to lead two institutions in this transition.

Prior to his stint at WKU, Selig served as the Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Virginia from 1988-1999, overseeing external operations his last five years. He began his athletic career as the Director of Ticketing at VCU, where he served from 1985-1988, finishing his stint as Assistant to the Athletic Director.

Selig was a four-year member (2006-2010) of the NCAA Women's Basketball Committee and served as Chair of the Final Four site selection committee. He served as Chair for both the Sun Belt Conference Athletic Directors and the Men's Basketball Committees during his tenure at WKU. He has served on the prestigious Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet representing the CAA and is currently on the Elizabeth River Trail Board of Directors and serves on the executive committee for the Norfolk Forum and was recently named the groups secretary. He is a two-time winner of the Tom Fergusson Metropolitan Person of the Year award by the Norfolk Sports Club (2014, 2023), symbolic of his impact on the region's sports profile.

Selig was born in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, and raised in Norfolk, Virginia, where he attended Norfolk Collegiate School. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Washington and Lee University, a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University and a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Virginia, with a minor in business from the UVA Darden School of Business. His dissertation "The Study of Donor Predictability Among Alumni Athletes", won the 2002 CASE Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation.

Selig and his wife Ellen of Annapolis, MD, have three children, Lex, 27, Nick, 25 and Julianna, 20

4th Season / 5th Overall
Cornell, 2002



Ricky Rahne has taken Old Dominion Football to bowl games in two of the last three years as he enters his fifth season as head coach of the Monarchs.

ODU went 6-7 in 2023 and clinched a bowl berth by winning its final two games of the regular season on the last play of each game. The Monarchs played Western Kentucky in the Famous Toastery Bowl in Charlotte, North Carolina and fell 38-35 in overtime.

The Monarchs worked in 16 new starters, nearly 60 new players and returned the sixth fewest starts in the country heading into the season. A year after finishing last in the Sun Belt in most offensive categories, Rahne hired former Fordham offensive coordinator Kevin Decker to take over the offense, and it showed improvement as ODU finished eighth in the league in rushing and 11th in scoring offense. Quarterback Grant Wilson, a transfer from Fordham, improved each week and the combo of Keshawn Wicks and Kadarius Calloway combined to rush for 1,212 yards and eight touchdowns. Wide receivers Isiah Paige, Kelby Williams and Reymello Murphy led the young unit as Paige led the team in receptions and Williams and Murphy were in the top-50 in the country in yards per catch.

For the second-straight year, linebacker Jason Henderson made history, becoming the first FBS Monarch to earn first-team All-America honors, as he received the honors from a variety of media outlets, including Walter Camp and The Sporting News. Henderson led the country in tackles per game for the second-straight year and finished third in the country in tackles for loss per game. Along with Wayne Matthews and Terry Jones, ODU was the only team in the country to have three players with more than 100 tackles.

To get to six wins, ODU exorcised a few demons, defeating App State and Georgia Southern for the first times in program history. ODU played in 11 one-score games and went 6-5 in those games. Six of those games were not decided until the final play of the game.

Old Dominion went 3-9 in Rahne's second season on the field but the wins were two of the biggest in program history and the accolades were aplenty throughout the season. ODU defeated Virginia Tech 20-17 in the season opener, marking the second win in program history over the Hokies. A few weeks later, the Monarchs defeated Arkansas State

29-26 in the first Sun Belt Conference game in program history. Two weeks later on national television, the Monarchs knocked off previously undefeated and eventual Sun Belt East Division Champion Coastal Carolina, 49-21 in Conway, South Carolina.

In individual honors, linebacker Jason Henderson led the country in tackles and became ODU's first FBS All-American, earning the honor from five different publications. Wide receiver Ali Jennings finished third in the country in receiving yards, while right tackle Nick Saldiveri was selected to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl, just the third player in ODU history to play in the most prestigious college football all-star game.

ODU finished in the top-20 in the country in a handful of categories, including 12th in red zone defense, and in what has become a cornerstone of the program, special teams. ODU ranked 10th in the

country in blocked kicks, 13th in punt return defense and 19th in net punting.

In his first season on the field in 2021, Rahne took a team that went 1-11 in 2019, and did not play in 2020, to a bowl game. ODU started the season 1-6 and won five-straight behind Rahne's 1-0 mentality, to earn a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl to play Tulsa. ODU became just the third team since 1936 (AP Poll era) to start the season 1-6 or worse and win six games.

Rahne helped lead Zack Kuntz to first-team All-Conference USA honors at tight end and 12 additional Monarchs to spots on the C-USA honorable mention team. Kuntz finished second in the country among tight ends with 73 receptions, while running back Blake Watson became the first ODU running back since 2016 to rush for over 1,000 yards and finished 22nd in the country with 101.1 yards per game.

ODU had its best scoring defense since 2016 and tied a school record by allowing 20 points or less five times. Linebacker Jordan Young broke the 100-tackle barrier for the first time in his career and set the ODU career record for tackles with 350. The Monarchs finished third in Conference USA and 35th in the country in rushing defense.

Rahne has built the Monarchs on being aggressive on the field and that was epitomized by the special teams units. ODU tied for the national lead with four blocked punts and six total blocked kicks. LaMareon James finished the season ranked ninth in the country with a 29.4 yard average on kickoff returns, and was one of two players to have two, 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns.

During ODU's winning streak, the Monarchs outscored teams by a 36-22 margin, and became bowl eligible in the regular season finale, dispatching Charlotte 56-34.

Rahne was the offensive coordinator at Penn State for two seasons and on the Nittany Lions coaching staff for six years.

Rahne (pronounced ronnie) developed an increasing national profile as a key component of Coach James Franklin's staff at both Penn State and Vanderbilt. The coaching staff has guided those teams to bowl games in each of the nine years and have won nine or more games in six of the last eight seasons.

Rahne spent six seasons at Penn State, including the last two as offensive coordinator. Despite having a new starting quarterback, Rahne helped lead the Nittany Lion offense to 34 points per game during that season, while six offensive players earned all-Big10 honors this season.

Known as a terrific offensive mind that can adjust to his personnel, Rahne demonstrated that again in 2019. Despite the loss of the No. 2 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft (Saquon Barkley), Penn State rushed for the most yards per game in the last 10 years at

204.9. PSU had nine players earn all-conference accolades, and the Nittany Lions led the Big10 with 42 red zone touchdowns, good for 16th in FBS.

Rahne was the quarterbacks coach in four of his six seasons at Penn State, as both of the quarterbacks he worked with were drafted into the NFL. In 2015, Christian Hackenberg (Jets, 2016) became the all-time leader in career yards passing with 8,457 yards, three years later, Rahne guided Trace McSorely (Ravens, 2019) past that mark in 2018 with

9,899 yards. He also coached the tight ends in 2016 and 2017, guiding Mike Gesicki who was drafted by the Miami Dolphins.

Penn State played in a bowl game in every year Rahne was there, including a 2016 Big10 Championship and 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl win over Washington. In that time, Penn State has had four-straight seasons of at least nine wins, and the Nittany Lions are one of five teams to rank in the Top-15 of the College Football Playoff final rankings in each of the last four years.

Prior to joining Penn State, Rahne was the quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt for three years.

Prior to Rahne's time at Vanderbilt, the program had been to four bowl games in 121 years of football, none in consecutive seasons. The Commodores were ranked in the Top-25 in the final polls in 2012 and 2013 marking the first time they were ranked in back-to-back seasons in program history.

He spent five years at Kansas State, starting as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching the running backs and tight ends. He helped the Wildcats to two bowl appearances.

Rahne started his coaching career on the defensive side at Holy Cross coaching the defensive line. The following year he coached the running backs at his alma mater, Cornell.

He was a three-year starter at quarterback at Cornell (2002), and graduated as the Big Red's all-time leader in completions (678), passing yards (7,710), touchdown passes (54) and total offense (7,994). He was inducted into the Cornell Hall of Fame in 2014.

Rahne and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Ryder and Jake.

Before coming to ODU, Snodgrass spent his entire career at his alma mater, West Virginia as a strength and conditioning coach. For the previous seven seasons he has been an assistant strength and conditioning coach working exclusively with the football team. The Mountaineers played a bowl game in eight of Snodgrass's nine seasons as a full-time strength and conditioning coach.

He began his career as a strength and conditioning graduate assistant, working with the football and women's soccer teams.

Snodgrass played on the offensive line at West Virginia, spending time at guard and tackle, from 2007-11.

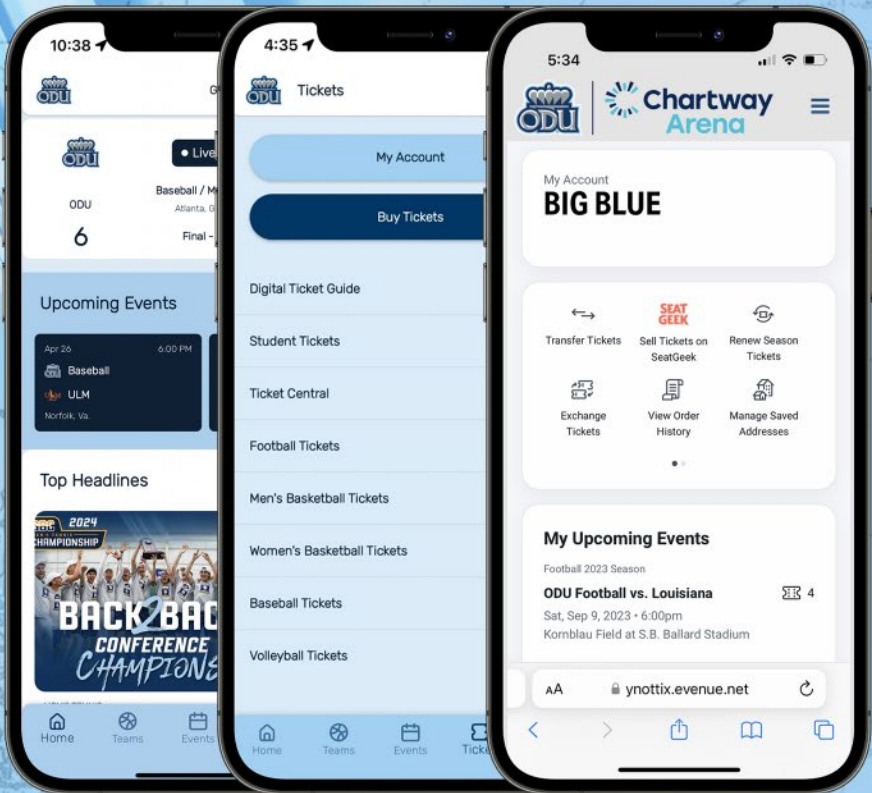

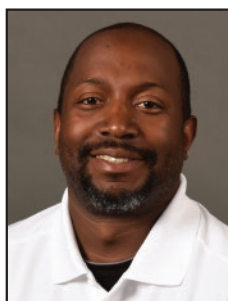

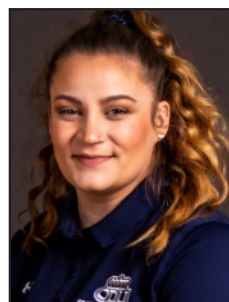

• For the second time in three years and third time in the series, Old Dominion will host Virginia Tech.

• ODU won the previous two meetings, 49-35 in 2018 and 20-17 in 2022. The home team has won all five games in the series. Virginia Tech leads the series 3-2.

• ODU lost its second-straight one-score game to start the season, 20-14 to East Carolina. Jahron Manning interception two passes as ODU picked off ECU four times tying a single-game school record. Patrick Smith-Young and Will Jones also intercepted passes.

• ODU played a Division I record 11 one-score games in 2023, going 6-5 in those games. Of the 11 one-score games, six came down to the final play of the game. ODU went 3-3 in those games.

• For ODU, 14-of-its-last 16 games have been decided by one score.

• Virginia Tech defeated Marshall last week, 31-14 in Blacksburg.

• Linebackers Koa Naotala and Mario Thompson registered double-digit tackles against ECU, as did safety Jahron Manning. Naotala had a game-high and career-best 18 tackles, while Thompson had a career-best 12 stops and Manning a career-high 10 tackles.

• Patrick Smith-Young and Will Jones also had interceptions for the Monarchs.

• Old Dominion's 57 newcomers are the 15th most in the country and the 28 transfers (JUCO and Four-Year) are tied for 15th most in the country.

Ricky Rahne has taken Old Dominion Football to bowl games in two of the last three years as he enters his fifth season as head coach of the Monarchs.

ODU went 6-7 in 2023 and clinched a bowl berth by winning its final two games of the regular season on the last play of each game. The Monarchs played Western Kentucky in the Famous Toastery Bowl in Charlotte, North Carolina and fell 38-35 in overtime.

The Monarchs worked in 16 new starters, nearly 60 new players and returned the sixth fewest starts in the country heading into the season. A year after finishing last in the Sun Belt in most offensive categories, Rahne hired former Fordham offensive coordinator Kevin Decker to take over the offense, and it showed improvement as ODU finished eighth in the league in rushing and 11th in scoring offense. Quarterback Grant Wilson, a transfer from Fordham, improved each week and the combo of Keshawn Wicks and Kadarius Calloway combined to rush for 1,212 yards and eight touchdowns. Wide receivers Isiah Paige, Kelby Williams and Reymello Murphy led the young unit as Paige led the team in receptions and Williams and Murphy were in the top-50 in the country in yards per catch.

For the second-straight year, linebacker Jason Henderson made history, becoming the first FBS Monarch to earn first-team All-America honors, as he received the honors from a variety of media outlets, including Walter Camp and The Sporting News. Henderson led the country in tackles per game for the second-straight year and finished third in the country in tackles for loss per game. Along with Wayne Matthews and Terry Jones, ODU was the only team in the country to have three players with more than 100 tackles.

To get to six wins, ODU exorcised a few demons, defeating App State and Georgia Southern for the first times in program history. ODU played in 11 one-score games and went 6-5 in those games. Six of those games were not decided until the final play of the game.

Old Dominion went 3-9 in Rahne's second season on the field but the wins were two of the biggest in program history and the accolades were aplenty throughout the season. ODU defeated Virginia Tech 20-17 in the season opener, marking the second win in program history over the Hokies. A few weeks later, the Monarchs defeated Arkansas State 29-26 in the first Sun Belt Conference game in program history. Two weeks later on national television, the Monarchs knocked off previously undefeated and eventual Sun Belt East Division Champion Coastal Carolina, 49-21 in Conway, South Carolina.

In individual honors, linebacker Jason Henderson led the country in tackles and became ODU's first FBS All-American, earning the honor from five different publications. Wide receiver Ali Jennings finished third in the country in receiving yards, while right tackle Nick Saldiveri was selected to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl, just the third player in ODU history to play in the most prestigious college football all-star game. ODU finished in the top-20 in the country in a handful of categories, including 12th in red zone defense, and in what has become a cornerstone of the program, special teams. ODU ranked 10th in the country in blocked kicks, 13th in punt return defense and 19th in net punting.

In his first season on the field in 2021, Rahne took a team that went 1-11 in 2019, and did not play in 2020, to a bowl game. ODU started the season 1-6 and won five-straight behind Rahne's 1-0 mentality, to earn a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl to play Tulsa. ODU became just the third team since 1936 (AP Poll era) to start the season 1-6 or worse and win six games.

Rahne helped lead Zack Kuntz to first-team All-Conference USA honors at tight end and 12 additional Monarchs to spots on the C-USA honorable mention team. Kuntz finished second in the country among tight ends with 73 receptions, while running back Blake Watson became the first ODU running back since 2016 to rush for over 1,000 yards and finished 22nd in the country with 101.1 yards per game.

ODU had its best scoring defense since 2016 and tied a school record by allowing 20 points or less five times. Linebacker Jordan Young broke the 100-tackle barrier for the first time in his career and set the ODU career record for tackles with 350. The Monarchs finished third in Conference USA and 35th in

the country in rushing defense.

Rahne has built the Monarchs on being aggressive on the field and that was epitomized by the special teams units. ODU tied for the national lead with four blocked punts and six total blocked kicks. LaMareon James finished the season ranked ninth in the country with a 29.4 yard average on kickoff returns, and was one of two players to have two, 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns.

During ODU's winning streak, the Monarchs outscored teams by a 36-22 margin, and became bowl eligible in the regular season finale, dispatching Charlotte 56-34.

Rahne was the offensive coordinator at Penn State for two seasons and on the Nittany Lions coaching staff for six years.

Rahne (pronounced ronnie) developed an increasing national profile as a key component of Coach James Franklin's staff at both Penn State and Vanderbilt. The coaching staff has guided those teams to bowl games in each of the nine years and have won nine or more games in six of the last eight seasons.

Rahne spent six seasons at Penn State, including the last two as offensive coordinator. Despite having a new starting quarterback, Rahne helped lead the Nittany Lion offense to 34 points per game during that season, while six offensive players earned all-Big10 honors this season.

Known as a terrific offensive mind that can adjust to his personnel, Rahne demonstrated that again in 2019. Despite the loss of the No. 2 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft (Saquon Barkley), Penn State rushed for the most yards per game in the last 10 years at 204.9. PSU had nine players earn all-conference accolades, and the Nittany Lions led the Big10 with 42 red zone touchdowns, good for 16th in FBS.

Rahne was the quarterbacks coach in four of his six seasons at Penn State, as both of the quarterbacks he worked with were drafted into the NFL. In 2015, Christian Hackenberg (Jets, 2016) became the all-time leader in career yards passing with 8,457 yards, three years later, Rahne guided Trace McSorely (Ravens, 2019) past that mark in 2018 with 9,899 yards. He also coached the tight ends in 2016 and 2017, guiding Mike Gesicki who was drafted by the Miami Dolphins.

Penn State played in a bowl game in every year Rahne was there, including a 2016 Big10 Championship and 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl win over Washington. In that time, Penn State has had four-straight seasons of at least nine wins, and the Nittany Lions are one of five teams to rank in the Top-15 of the College Football Playoff final rankings in each of the last four years.

Prior to joining Penn State, Rahne was the quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt for three years.

Prior to Rahne's time at Vanderbilt, the program had been to four bowl games in 121 years of football, none in consecutive seasons. The Commodores were ranked in the Top-25 in the final polls in 2012 and 2013 marking the first time they were ranked in back-to-back seasons in program history.

He spent five years at Kansas State, starting as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching the running backs and tight ends. He helped the Wildcats to two bowl appearances.

Rahne started his coaching career on the defensive side at Holy Cross coaching the defensive line. The following year he coached the running backs at his alma mater, Cornell.

He was a three-year starter at quarterback at Cornell (2002), and graduated as the Big Red's all-time leader in completions (678), passing yards (7,710), touchdown passes (54) and total offense (7,994). He was inducted into the Cornell Hall of Fame in 2014.

Rahne and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Ryder and Jake.

Quick Hits

• ODU Head Coach Ricky Rahne played quarterback at Cornell from 1998-2001 and is the Cornell Sports Hall of Fame. He completed 678-of-1226 passes for 7710 yards and 54 touchdown passes. All rank second in program history to Jeff Matthews, who briefly played in the NFL and CFL.

• ODU Defensive Coordinator Blake Seiler wrestled at Oklahoma State as a freshman on the Cowboys' National Championship team. He transferred to Kansas State the following year as a walk-on to the football team and was a starting defensive lineman and captain as a senior.

• ODU Wide Receivers coach Kody Cook also played at Kansas State, and also beginning his career with the Wildcats as a walk-on. He became an all-conference wide receiver and played one game at quarterback, helping the Wildcats become bowl eligible as all of their quarterbacks were injured.

• ODU running back Aaron Young is the younger brother of former Monarch and current GA Jordan Young. Jordan is ODU's second all-time leading tackler behind Jason Henderson. Aaron transferred from Rutgers where he played along side another brother, Avery. Their father, Anthony, is in the Temple Sports Hall of Fame and was a third round pick of the Indianapolis Colts. He played in 14 games as a rookie but suffered a career-ending injury.

• Linebacker Jason Henderson has been named to every watch list he is eligible for, including the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus, Bednarik and Lombardi Awards. Wide receiver Kelby Williams has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List, which is given to the best player either from Texas or that plays at a University in the state of Texas.

• Known as the 757 due to the area code, ODU has 13 players that are from the 757. Of the 13, 10 have seen in action over the last three seasons.

Tough Sledding

By any measure Old Dominion has a tough 2024 schedule. Ten-of-12 opponents played in a bowl game in 2023, while South Carolina and East Carolina did not, are typically in bowl contention. ODU is also one of 17 FBS schools that do not play an FCS team this season. ODU also did not play an FCS team in 2022. A pair of ODU opponents, App State and Virginia Tech, do also not play an FCS team this season.

New Rules

College Football has introduced several new rule changes for the 2024 season.

• **Coach to player communication.** One player on each team will have radio receiving capability and the player must be identified by an unbranded green dot on the back midline of the helmet. Coach-to-player communications will be cut off when the play clock reaches 15 seconds or at the snap, whichever comes first. When the play clock resets to 25/40, the communications will be turned back on. If more than one green dot helmet is detected on the field by the game officials, the result is a live ball 5-yard equipment violation penalty, and this penalty initiates a conference review.

• **Standard Tablets for in-game video only is permissive in 2024 for all football playing subdivisions and are subject to the following guidelines:** Tablets shall be restricted to “in-game video” (current game) and may not include analytics, data or data-access capability or any other communications access. No other video is allowed (e.g., scouting video, practice video, etc.). Tablets may be used in the coach’s box, sideline, and locker room and may not be interconnected to other devices to project larger/additional images. Video may include coach’s sideline, coach’s endzone, and a program feed per play from the current game only and may also display “game circumstances,” including down / distance / time / quarter / play-number / score. A team may have up to 18 standard tablets active, and all team personnel may view the tablets. If any team personnel engages an official with a tablet to show or review video, an automatic Unsportsmanlike Conduct foul will result.

• **Two-Minute Timeout.** When the game clock is running and the ball is not live, the Referee shall stop the clock with exactly two minutes remaining in the second and fourth quarters for a Two-Minute Timeout. If the ball is live when the game clock reaches two minutes in the second and fourth quarters, the play will continue, and the Referee shall stop the clock when the ball is subsequently declared dead for a Two Minute Timeout.

• **Horse Collar Tackle.** For player safety, Horse-collar tackles that occur within the tackle box will be penalized as a 15-yard personal foul penalty. Currently, a horse-collar tackle within the tackle box is not a foul.

About Old Dominion University

Old Dominion University was founded in 1930 by the College of William and Mary, the second oldest university in the United States. Established as an extension of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, and Virginia Tech, Old Dominion began educating teachers and engineers. The two-year school rapidly evolved into a four-year institution, and was granted independence in 1962 as Old Dominion College.

Considerable growth in enrollment, the expansion of research facilities and preparation for the addition of graduate programs led the Board of Visitors to approve the name change to Old Dominion University. Now Old Dominion is a powerhouse for higher education with six colleges: Arts and Letters, Business and Public Administration, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences and Sciences. Old Dominion has offered master’s degrees since 1964, became Old Dominion University in 1969 and Ph.D.s since 1971.

World’s Largest Naval Base

Naval Station Norfolk is the largest Naval Base in the world and just minutes from Old Dominion University.

Big Blue

When ODU became independent from the College of William & Mary in 1962, while there was no official mascot, Old Dominion College took on a mace and crown as their symbols in publications and athletics.

Big Blue made his debut during a basketball game in December 1971.

Ironically, the first costume was more orange than blue, and when trying to dye the costume made it more grey-green than blue, the university had to hire a seamstress to sew on powder blue fake fur to approximate the school colors at the time. Through the 1970s and into the 1980s, Big Blue evolved from a fierce lion into a soft, friendly lion. By the 1990s and early 2000s, Big Blue has morphed into his current look with little changes over the years.

In 2011, Big Blue was voted as the Capital One National Mascot of the Year.

In October 2013, a seven-foot-tall bronze sculpture of Big Blue was unveiled in Webb University Center to start a new campus tradition. Students take their photograph with Big Blue at the start and end of their Monarch journey. The statue was conceived by the Student Government Association (SGA) and created by sculptor Richard Stravitz. Throughout their time at Old Dominion, students can rub Big Blue’s belly for good luck and prosperity.

Running Back Awareness

ODU's top two rushers from 2023 transferred, leaving quarterback Grant Wilson as the Monarchs' leading returning rusher with 289 yards. The top three running backs from 2023 are gone leaving Devin Roche as the top returning running back. He played in five games, rushing for 182 and was able to red-shirt.

ODU brought in a pair of transfers in Aaron Young from Rutgers and Bryce Duke from Virginia Tech, along with true freshman Maurki James, from Delaware.

Roche returns along with Tariq Sims, who rushed for 41 yards last season and had a great off-season.

ODU and Virginia Tech Ties

Head Coaches Ricky Rahne and Brent Pry worked together at both Vanderbilt and Penn State. The pair were offensive and defensive coordinators at PSU in 2018 and 2019.

ODU special teams coach Kevin Smith and Virginia Tech offensive coordinator Tyler Bowen were also on those Penn State staffs.

Tech defensive coordinator Chris Marve worked with Rahne while at Vanderbilt.

Virginia Tech wide receivers coach Fontel Mines coached at ODU in 2021, while strength coaches Dwight Galt IV, Greg Allen and Ryan Hardie all were at ODU before going to Blacksburg.

Tech wide receiver Ali Jennings was a two-time All-Conference performer at ODU before transferring to Virginia Tech before the 2023 season. He was an honorable mention honoree in 2021 and first-team All-Sun Belt in 2022. Jennings caught 120 passes for 2,025 yards and 14 touchdowns in his two years in Norfolk.

ODU running back Bryce Duke transferred in from Virginia Tech. He had one carry for four yards for Tech in last year's meeting.

Old Dominion has eight players in NFL training camps this year. In just 14 years of football, Old Dominion has had five players drafted and another handful of players make it to the NFL via undrafted free agency. Former ODU quarterback Taylor Heinicke and long snapper Rick Lovato enter their 10th year in the NFL this season, both as undrafted free agents. Heinicke initially signed with the Minnesota Vikings and spent time on their roster and practice squad, but never actually played a game for the Vikings. He has played for the Houston Texans, Carolina Panthers, Washington Commanders and Atlanta Falcons.

Lovato was originally signed by the Chicago Bears but was cut during training camp. He saw his first action with the Green Bay Packers and is the first Monarch to play in an NFL regular season and postseason game. He has played for the Washington Redskins and is currently with the Philadelphia Eagles, who he won a Super Bowl with in 2018.

ODU Drops Opener at South Carolina, 23-19

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Defeat with honor is a statement that isn't in the lexicon of Old Dominion Head Football coach Ricky Rahne. But that clearly described what happened Saturday night at Willams-Brice Stadium.

ODU went toe-to-toe Saturday night with an SEC opponent on its own home turf. The Monarchs were often more physical than South Carolina and at times, outplayed the Gamecocks.

But the ODU offense could not generate enough points and committed two crucial turnovers that led to two South Carolina touchdowns and allowed the Gamecocks to claim a 23-19 victory.

Both South Carolina touchdowns came after Monarch turnovers inside the ODU 10.

Both turnovers came on fumbles from quarterback Grant Wilson, who completed 22 of 38 passes for 197 yards a passing and rushing touchdown and two interceptions.

ODU trailed 16-7 midway through the third quarter when the previously moribund Monarch offense kicked into gear.

Wilson completed two passes to Myles Alston, and then on third down, was rushed from the pocket, and raced 36 yards for the touchdown to trim the South Carolina lead to 16-13 with 4:57 left in the third quarter.

Then, after ODU's defense held the Gamecocks on downs, the Monarchs drove from their own 40 to the Gamecock 24, where the drive stalled.

Ethan Sanchez, who had a PAT blocked on the previous score, then drilled a 40-yard field goal to knot the score at 16-all with 14 seconds left in the third quarter.

Sanchez then kicked a 33-yard field goal to give ODU its first lead, 19-16, with 9:54 to play as the 1,000 or so Monarch faithful began chanting "ODU" in an otherwise quiet stadium.

The ODU defense then held the Gamecocks on downs and with 7:52 left, and the Monarchs started at their own 10 yard line.

But that's when things became undone. On third down, Wilson scrambled up the middle and was stripped of the ball by lineman Dylan Stewart. Lineman DeAndre Jules recovered.

It took two plays for South Carolina to retake the lead, 23-19, on a three-yard Sellers rush with 6:11 left.

Wilson was somber in the postgame press conference, but answered tough questions forthrightly.

ODU's offense got the ball back twice more but was unable to get into scoring position. Defensive back Jalone Kilgore iced the game with 1:21 left when he intercepted Wilson at the ODU 41.

The Monarchs got off to a rough start. On the game's first drive, Wilson was rushed from the pocket and corralled by two South Carolina defenders, including Kyle Kennard, who knocked the ball loose. The Gamecocks recovered at the three.

Raheim Sanders scored three plays later and the Gamecocks led, 7-0.

Wilson recovered quickly from his mistake and quieted the boisterous crowd with a 72-yard TD pass to Isiah Paige that knotted the score at 7-7 just seconds later. He found Paige at the 25, and the speedster from Richmond junked to his right and then left again to shake off a defender and bounded into the end zone.

South Carolina made it 10-7 on a 40-yard field goal from Alex Herrera – the field goal was forced by a third-down sack by ODU's Mario Thompson.

South Carolina led, 10-7, early in the second quarter when a lightning strike several miles away forced a 40-minute delay.

ODU Drops Another Tight One to ECU, 20-14

NORFOLK, Va. – There was a festive, sellout crowd of 21,944 on hand at S.B. Ballard Stadium and the crowd was on its feet screaming as the Monarchs drove from their own 9 to the East Carolina 33 in the final minutes.

But as has so often happened when the Monarchs and Pirates lock horns, ECU did just enough to win a very close game.

ODU quarterback Grant Wilson was tackled with eight seconds left, and the Monarchs were unable to get lined up to spike the ball, and the Pirates escaped with a 20-14 victory Saturday.

It was the second week in a row when mistakes cost the Monarchs. Last week ODU gave away two touchdowns with fumbles inside the 10 in a 23-19 loss at South Carolina.

Offensive turnovers weren't the issue this week as much as offensive production. The Monarch defense forced four interceptions, but only one led to a touchdown. One interception came on a first and goal at the ODU 7, and thus spared the Monarchs at least a field goal.

The Monarchs were outgained, 466-287, and often shot themselves in the foot with uncharacteristic penalties. ODU had 10 penalties for 95 yards, and half were holding penalties.

ODU also had a costly muffed ball on a kickoff that led to an ECU field goal.

ODU led, 7-6, at the half but the Pirates wasted little time retaking the lead for good early in the third quarter.

On third down and 13, Rahjai Harris raced 63 yards for a touchdown. ECU quarterback Jake Garcia then found Chase Sowell in the end zone for the two-point conversion, and the Pirates led, 14-7, five minutes into the second half.

ODU then muffed the kickoff, and the Pirates recovered. That set up a 33-yard field goal by ECU's Andrew Conrad, and six minutes into the second half, the Pirates led, 17-7.

ODU's offense then rattled off its best scoring drive of the night, driving 75 yards in five minutes with an equal mix of passing and rushing plays. Young, the senior transfer from Rutgers, bulled over from the one-yard line for the TD with 4:11 left in the third quarter to close the gap to 17-14.

Young finished with 83 yards rushing on 25 carries. Naotala, who started in place of injured All-American linebacker Jason Henderson, had a career-high 18 tackles.

ECU again looked to extend the lead early in the fourth quarter as the Pirates had a first down on the ODU seven. But then Jahron Manning, the junior college transfer from New Orleans, Louisiana, picked off a pass in the corner of the end zone to end the threat.

It was his second interception of the game.

Wilson, who completed 20 of 34 passes for 192 yards, threw a 44-yard TD pass in the first half to Kelby Williams that staked ODU to a 7-6 lead. But other than the one TD drive in the third quarter, the Monarchs were unable to get their offense going in the second half.

ECU's Conrad booted a 50-yard field goal with 9:09 left in the game to give the Pirates a 20-14 lead, which meant the Monarchs had to score a touchdown.

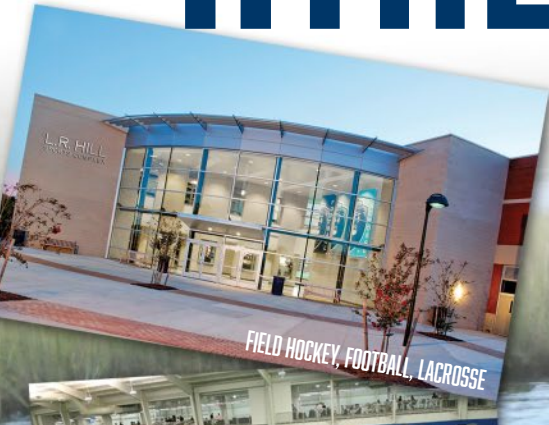

TAILGATING INFORMATION

Old Dominion University wants you to have an enjoyable experience during your visit to campus. The parking and tailgating policies below are designed to ensure your safety and comfort. Tailgating is permissible in surface lots and designated spots on campus. Admission to campus surface lots will be by display of a proper vehicle pass, provided by the ODAF.

1. Tailgating areas will open four (4) hours prior to each football game's kickoff.

TAILGATING AT HALFTIME AND DURING THE GAME IS PROHIBITED and fans must vacate the parking lots no later than two hours after the completion of the game.

2. University and Virginia state statutes and regulations on drug and alcohol consumption will be strictly enforced. University policy and state law precludes the serving of alcoholic beverages to anyone less than 21 years of age. Hosts who furnish alcohol to underage students may incur criminal risks and personal civil liability exposure.

3. Glass containers are not permitted in the tailgating area.

4. Kegs, party balls, drinking apparatus, drinking games and/or mass consumption purchases of alcohol are prohibited.

5. Grills are permitted in University surface lots and restricted areas of Kaufman Mall only and must be elevated at least one foot above the parking surface so that heat does not cause damage to the asphalt. Coals from charcoal grills must be disposed in marked fire retardant receptacles on campus. Open pit fires are prohibited. Gas grills are restricted to 10 gallon propane tanks per vehicle.

6. Gas generators are prohibited.

7. Pegging tents in parking lots is not permissible.

8. No animals will be permitted in any designated tailgate areas and/ or spaces, with the exception of trained service animals for fans with disabilities.

9. Waste food items and trash must be disposed of in appropriate containers provided throughout campus.

10. Tailgating areas may not extend beyond the designated parking space per vehicle, and may not impede vehicular traffic in the assigned lots/areas.

11. No household furniture, sofas, recliners, etc., are allowed within designated tailgate areas and/or spaces.

12. Bicycles, scooters, skateboards, and roller blading is prohibited within the designated tailgate areas and/or spaces.

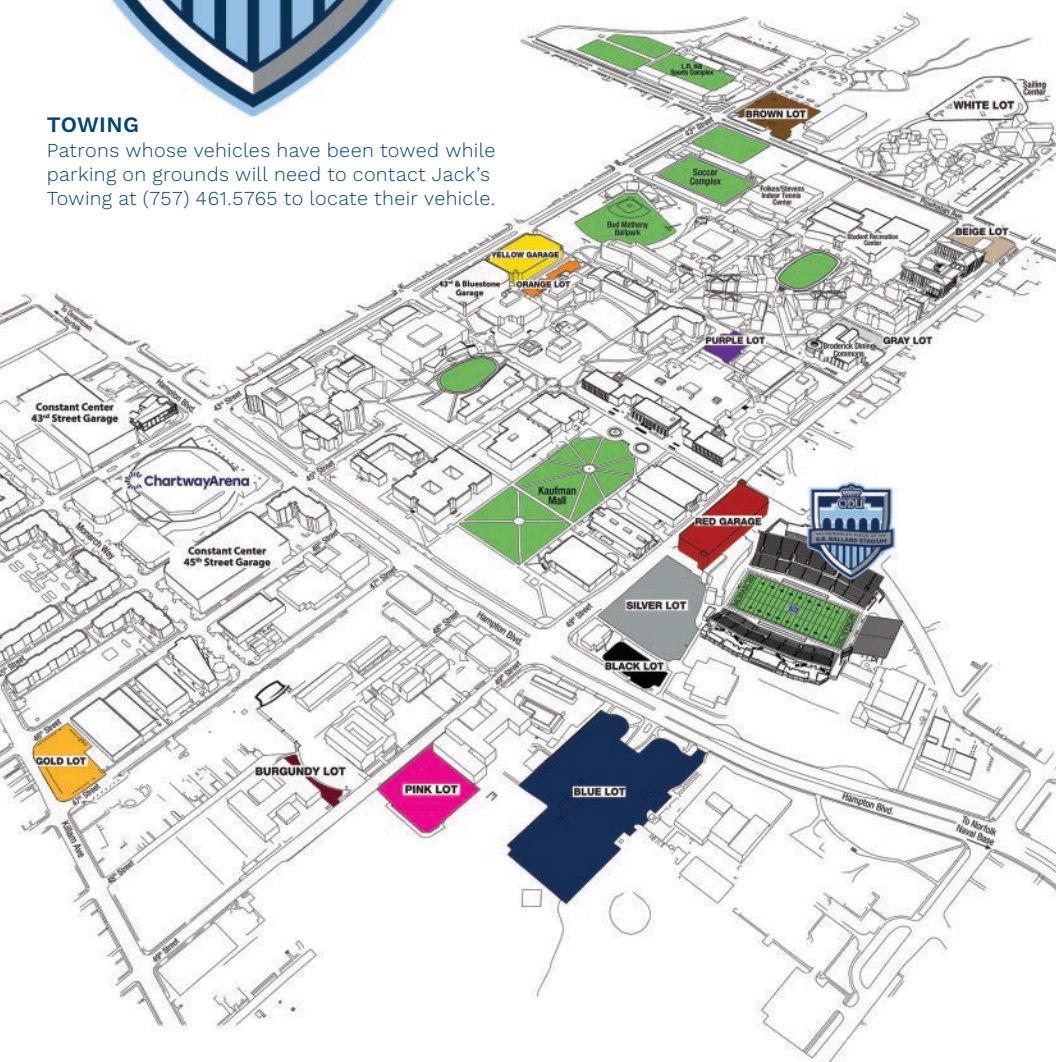
13. Any violation of the above policies may result in termination of tailgating privileges, criminal prosecution and/or disciplinary action through the Office of Student Conduct & Academic Integrity if the violator is an ODU student.

The Atlantic Bay Football Complex features spacious suites including patio, loft, and standard styles. Suites include tiered stadium seating, upholstered furniture, televisions and food and beverage service. Please contact the ODAF for additional information.

Suites will open two (2) hours before each game. Suites entrances are located at Gate S (south) or Levels 3 and 4 of the Red Garage. Access to the suite levels requires proper wristbands/credentials.

PRIORITY LEXUS **FIELD PASS TERRACE**

The Lexus Field Pass Terrace will open 90 minutes before game time and remain open throughout the game. Alcohol will be served on the Terrace until the start of the fourth quarter. Lexus Field Pass Terrace is only accessible to guests who have the appropriate designation on their ticket or a valid wristband/credential for the Terrace.

COX BUSINESS LOGE LOUNGE

Located on the second floor of the Atlantic Bay Football Complex, the COX Business Loge Lounge seats are available in two and four-seat packages. The COX Business Loge Lounge ticket holders receive exclusive access to the terrace level and scholarship lounge, which includes a full service bar and upscale concessions. Standing Room Only Tickets are also available.

The COX Business Loge Lounge seats will open two hours before each game. Loge Level ticket holders can enter through Gate S (south) or the second level of the Red Garage. Access to the COX Business Loge Lounge requires proper wristbands/tickets/credentials.

THE SCHOLARSHIP LOUNGE

The Scholarship Lounge is located on the second floor of the complex and opens two hours prior to kickoff, and is open throughout the game. The lounge is open to suite and the COX Business Loge Lounge seat holders, who may purchase a buffet meal and beverages in a climate controlled environment.

STADIUM GUIDELINES

PRIORITY **LEXUS** GUEST SERVICES TENT

Our friendly, helpful, well-trained staff will ensure that your event experience will be an enjoyable and memorable one. The Guest Services Tent is located at the southeast corner of the stadium, near section E108.

GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES

The Stadium is accessible to all guests and features accessible seating in sections E101, E105, E106, W114, W117, N121, N122, E205, E206, E207, E208, W211, W212, W217, Loge Level and Suites. ADA parking is available on the first level of the Red Garage located on the corner of 49th Street and Bluestone Ave. To obtain more detailed information regarding our services for guests with disabilities, you may contact the Box Office at (757) 683.4444.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Outside alcoholic beverages or containers of any kind are NOT permitted inside the stadium. Persons identified with alcohol will be asked to leave the premises. Guests appearing intoxicated will be subject to ejection and turned over to police.

ANIMALS

Animals are not permitted in or on stadium grounds, with the exception of trained service animals for our fans with disabilities.

BABY CHANGING STATION

All family restrooms are equipped with a baby changing station. Changing stations are also located on the east and west side of the stadium in the restrooms.

BAG CHECKS

All bags will be inspected prior to entrance to Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. Clear bag policy in effect.

BANNERS / SIGNS / FLAGS

Handheld banners/signs are approved as long as they represent good sportsmanship and do not block the view of others. Flags are approved, however, flag poles are not allowed and flags cannot block the view of others.

CAMERAS

Still cameras and mobile phones with lenses less than six inches are allowed, however flash photography and stands/tripods are prohibited. Videos cameras are not allowed in the stadium.

CONCESSIONS

ARAMARK is the concessionaire for games at the stadium. Points of sale locations are located behind the east and west sides of the stadium. All food and beverage transactions are cashless.

DRONE USE

FAA regulations prohibit the operation of unmanned aerial vehicles, a.k.a. drones, in the immediate vicinity of Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium during game days.

EMERGENCIES AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES

In the event of a serious emergency, all Event Staff, Ushers, and Law Enforcement are available to assist guests, including those with disabilities. Information will also be provided over the public address system and on the videoboard. In the event of an evacuation due to severe weather, please tune to 94.1 FM for updates.

STADIUM GUIDELINES

FIRST AID

If medical assistance is required, notify the nearest Event Staff person. They will escort you to the nearest Bon Secours First Aid station. The facilities are fully equipped to handle all minor injuries. First Aid stations are located on the ground level near sections E107 and W110 and on the first floor of the Atlantic Bay Football Complex building.

FAN BEHAVIOR

Individuals attending athletic events at Old Dominion University are expected to conduct themselves in a manner respectable of the nature and character of the University. Persons acting in a disruptive, disrespectful, or disorderly manner may be asked to leave the premises or be subject to criminal sanctions. Students may also be subject to sanctions of the University's Code of Student Conduct.

Old Dominion University offers an in-stadium, fan assistance program at football games to assist fans in alerting game management on a variety of concerns ranging from ticket and medical emergencies to inappropriate language. Fans should report their concerns to the nearest usher or a member of the game management staff. A member of the game management staff will respond to the message immediately.

GATE OPENINGS

The South Gate will open two hours prior to game time for Suite and Loge Level ticket holders. Entrance to the Priority Automotive Club will begin 90 minutes prior to game time. All other gates will be open 90 minutes prior to game time for all ticket holders.

INCLEMENT WEATHER AND CLOSURE

Decisions on whether to cancel athletic events will be made by the Director of Athletics or the designated athletic administrator in accordance with NCAA Guidelines and any conference guidelines in coordination with the opposing head coach and team. Announcements will be made on the Athletic Department website at ODUsports.com, media outlets throughout Hampton Roads, and social media. Every attempt will be made to conduct an athletic event, barring any unsafe local, or regional conditions especially if the visiting opponent has arrived at the athletic venue or is in the city limits.

MERCHANDISE

Official Monarch gear can be purchased at the University Village Bookstore, operated by Follett, on game day in store or online; as well as at both Monarch Shops inside the S.B. Ballard Stadium. Sales tents will be located in the Kaufman Mall. Please visit the bookstore's website, ShopODU.com for additional hours and location information.

MERCHANDISE LICENSING REGULATIONS

Any non-Follett vendor that is selling merchandise on the campus will be served with a cease and desist letter, will have their merchandise seized and be asked to leave the campus by University Police. Any vendor that is selling merchandise off the ODU campus should have the appropriate peddler's license from the City of Norfolk. The Norfolk Police Department will patrol the outlying areas of campus to make sure vendors have the appropriate license. Any vendors without a license will be written a citation by the Norfolk Police. Only merchandise items bearing the CLC approved hologram emblem on the tag are official ODU licensed items. If an item does not have this hologram, it is not an Old Dominion University authorized item. PLAYING FIELD

Guests do not have access to the playing field at any time.

VIOLATORS ARE SUBJECT TO ARREST AND MAY BE PROSECUTED.

RESTROOM FACILITIES

Restroom facilities are located on the east and west sides of the stadium and in the Atlantic Bay Football Complex.

SOLICITATION

The selling and/or distribution of any item by anyone other than University authorized personnel in and around Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium and the ODU campus, including parking lots, is prohibited. Violators are subject to prosecution.

SMOKING

Smoking is not permitted in the seating areas, plaza/concourse, or restrooms.

STADIUM RE-ENTRY

Re-entry to stadium is prohibited.

CLUB / SUITE WRISTBAND POLICY

All Suite, Priority Automotive Club, and Loge Level ticket holders should always wear their designated wristbands securely on their wrist while within the stadium. Wristbands that serve as tickets must be securely fastened to the wrist prior to entering the stadium gates.

The stadium box office is located near Gate SE of the stadium. The box office will open four hours prior to kickoff.

Old Dominion University students, who have paid the student activity fee, are admitted free to all Old Dominion University athletic events. Student tickets can be transferred to other ODU Students ONLY by logging on to ODUSports.com/students. The resale or attempted resale of the ticket at a higher price than appearing on the ticket is grounds for seizure and voided without compensation. Tickets which are lost, stolen, and counterfeit or obtained from an unauthorized source will be voided. The ticket claim schedule for ODU Student Ticket is available at ODUSports.com/students. Students will need to type in their UIN number and password and select the appropriate game. One student ticket is permitted per UIN number.

STUDENT GUEST TICKETS

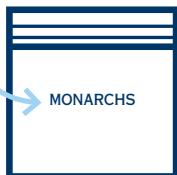

Guidelines

NCAA GAME DAY ENVIRONMENT AND FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

NCAA Sportsmanship and Ethical Conduct Best Practices identify reasonable efforts to ensure the fan experience is safe and enjoyable. To this end, proactive measures to encourage positive behavior must be balanced with strict consequences and swift measures to deter and remedy unruly behavior. Policies and media should target two outcomes:

- 1) recognize responsible behavior; and
- 2) communicate the message that inappropriate behavior in violation of NCAA, conference, school, team, or facility rules, endangers or threatens others, or is otherwise detrimental to others will not be tolerated.

NCAA GAME DAY ENVIRONMENT

The NCAA and its member institutions are committed to creating a safe, comfortable and enjoyable game day experience. The NCAA and member institutions pledge to protect a fan's right to:

- Watch the game in a safe, clean and healthy environment.
- Be treated in a courteous, consistent and professional manner.
- Be treated with dignity and respect by other spectators attending the game and those organizing the event.
- Support his or her team, provided the support is in good taste and does not adversely impact the event experience of fellow spectators or negatively impact the game.
- Expect displays of good sportsmanship.

THE NCAA EXPECTS FANS TO:

- Cheer, sing, and otherwise support their team while remaining respectful and courteous to their fellow patrons, referees, opposing team fans and players.
- Enjoy the game experience free from fighting, thrown objects, attempts to enter the playing field, political or inciting messages, and disorderly behavior, including foul, sexist, racial, obscene or abusive language or gestures.
- Comply with requests from athletics facilities staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures.
- Conduct themselves in a lawful manner to avoid incidents in the stadium and in the parking lots.

For any game where alcohol is available, at tailgating or inside the venue, fans who consume alcoholic beverages will do so in a responsible manner. Intervention with an impaired, intoxicated or underage guest will be handled in a prompt and safe manner.

NCAA FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

- The following violations should be identified as actions that may result in sanctions:
- Behavior that is reckless, dangerous, disruptive, or illegal in nature.
- Demonstrating signs of impairment from alcohol or other substances.
- Foul or abusive language or obscene gestures.
- Interference with the progress of the game (including entering the field of play or throwing objects onto the field).
- Failing to follow instructions of stadium personnel or law enforcement officers.
- Verbal or physical harassment of the opposing team's players or fans, field officials, or stadium personnel.

Fans have several options to report their concerns, to include alerting the nearest usher or a member of the game management staff, or sending a text to 757-617-7457 with your seat location and concern during the game. A member of the game management staff will respond to the message immediately.

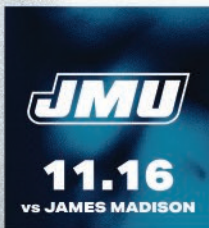
