- Old Dominion continues its three-game road trip following the bye as the Monarchs open Sun Belt Conference play on Saturday, Oct. 5 at Coastal Carolina.
- Old Dominion delivered a hard-earned 30-27 come-from-behind win at Bowling Green last Saturday, as Aaron Young scooted in from four yards out for the winning score.
- Backup quarterback Colton Joseph completed six-of-13 passes for 26 yards, including a game-saving 15-yard completion to Pat Conroy on fourth and six on the game-winning drive. Joseph rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown on nine carries.
- ODU rushed for 189 yards on 36 carries in the win over Bowling Green. Aaron Young had a game-high 74 yards and a touchdown.
- Pat Conroy had three receptions for 99 yards and two touchdowns. He caught touchdowns of nine and 75 yards.
- ODU played a Division I record 11 one-score games in 2023, going 6-5 in those games. So far this season 3-of-the first-4 have been one score games and 15 of-the-last 18.
- Coastal Carolina is coming off a bye. The chanticleers won their first three games of the year against Jacksonville State, William & Mary and Temple, before falling to Virginia, 43-24.
- Jahron Manning had a career-high 11 tackles for the Monarchs. Defensive tackle Denzel Lowry also set a new career-best with nine stops against Virginia Tech.
- Old Dominion's 57 newcomers are the 15th most in the country and the 28 transfers (JUCO and Four-Year) are tied for 15th most in the country.

Ricky Rahne has taken Old Dominion Football to bowl games in two of the last three years as he enters his fifth season as head coach of the Monarchs.

ODU went 6-7 in 2023 and clinched a bowl berth by winning its final two games of the regular season on the last play of each game. The Monarchs played Western Kentucky in the Famous Toastery Bowl in Charlotte, North Carolina and fell 38-35 in overtime.

The Monarchs worked in 16 new starters, nearly 60 new players and returned the sixth fewest starts in the country heading into the season. A year after finishing last in the Sun Belt in most offensive categories, Rahne hired former Fordham offensive coordinator Kevin Decker to take over the offense, and it showed improvement as ODU finished eighth in the league in rushing and 11th in scoring offense. Quarterback Grant Wilson, a transfer from Fordham, improved each week and the combo of Keshawn Wicks and Kadarius Calloway combined to rush for 1,212 yards and eight touchdowns. Wide receivers Isiah Paige, Kelby Williams and Reymello Murphy led the young unit as Paige led the team in receptions and Williams and Murphy were in the top-50 in the country in yards per catch.

For the second-straight year, linebacker Jason Henderson made history, becoming the first FBS Monarch to earn first-team All-America honors, as he received the honors from a variety of media outlets, including Walter Camp and The Sporting News. Henderson led the country in tackles per game for the second-straight year and finished third in the country in tackles for loss per game. Along with Wayne Matthews and Terry Jones, ODU was the only team in the country to have three players with more than 100 tackles.

To get to six wins, ODU exorcised a few demons, defeating App State and Georgia Southern for the first times in program history. ODU played in 11 one-score games and went 6-5 in those games. Six of those games were not decided until the final play of the game.

Old Dominion went 3-9 in Rahne's second season on the field but the wins were two of the biggest in program history and the accolades were aplenty throughout the season. ODU defeated Virginia Tech 20-17 in the season opener, marking the second win in program history over the Hokies. A few weeks later, the Monarchs defeated Arkansas State 29-26 in the first Sun Belt Conference game in program history. Two weeks later on national television, the Monarchs knocked off previously undefeated and eventual Sun Belt East Division Champion Coastal Carolina, 49-21 in Conway, South Carolina.

In individual honors, linebacker Jason Henderson led the country in tackles and became ODU's first FBS All-American, earning the honor from five different publications. Wide receiver Ali Jennings finished third in the country in receiving yards, while right tackle Nick Saldiveri was selected to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl, just the third player in ODU history to play in the most prestigious college football all-star game. ODU finished in the top-20 in the country in a handful of categories, including 12th in red zone defense, and in what has become a cornerstone of the program, special teams. ODU ranked 10th in the country in blocked kicks, 13th in punt return defense and 19th in net punting.

In his first season on the field in 2021, Rahne took a team that went 1-11 in 2019, and did not play in 2020, to a bowl game. ODU started the season 1-6 and won five-straight behind Rahne's 1-0 mentality, to earn a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl to play Tulsa. ODU became just the third team since 1936 (AP Poll era) to start the season 1-6 or worse and win six games.

Rahne helped lead Zack Kuntz to first-team All-Conference USA honors at tight end and 12 additional Monarchs to spots on the C-USA honorable mention team. Kuntz finished second in the country among tight ends with 73 receptions, while running back Blake Watson became the first ODU running back since 2016 to rush for over 1,000 yards and finished 22nd in the country with 101.1 yards per game.

ODU had its best scoring defense since 2016 and tied a school record by allowing 20 points or less five times. Linebacker Jordan Young broke the 100-tackle barrier for the first time in his career and set the ODU career record for tackles with 350. The Monarchs finished third in Conference USA and 35th in

the country in rushing defense.

Rahne has built the Monarchs on being aggressive on the field and that was epitomized by the special teams units. ODU tied for the national lead with four blocked punts and six total blocked kicks. LaMareon James finished the season ranked ninth in the country with a 29.4 yard average on kickoff returns, and was one of two players to have two, 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns.

During ODU's winning streak, the Monarchs outscored teams by a 36-22 margin, and became bowl eligible in the regular season finale, dispatching Charlotte 56-34.

Rahne was the offensive coordinator at Penn State for two seasons and on the Nittany Lions coaching staff for six years.

Rahne (pronounced ronnie) developed an increasing national profile as a key component of Coach James Franklin's staff at both Penn State and Vanderbilt. The coaching staff has guided those teams to bowl games in each of the nine years and have won nine or more games in six of the last eight seasons.

Rahne spent six seasons at Penn State, including the last two as offensive coordinator. Despite having a new starting quarterback, Rahne helped lead the Nittany Lion offense to 34 points per game during that season, while six offensive players earned all-Big10 honors this season.

Known as a terrific offensive mind that can adjust to his personnel, Rahne demonstrated that again in 2019. Despite the loss of the No. 2 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft (Saquon Barkley), Penn State rushed for the most yards per game in the last 10 years at 204.9. PSU had nine players earn all-conference accolades, and the Nittany Lions led the Big10 with 42 red zone touchdowns, good for 16th in FBS.

Rahne was the quarterbacks coach in four of his six seasons at Penn State, as both of the quarterbacks he worked with were drafted into the NFL. In 2015, Christian Hackenberg (Jets, 2016) became the all-time leader in career yards passing with 8,457 yards, three years later, Rahne guided Trace McSorely (Ravens, 2019) past that mark in 2018 with 9,899 yards. He also coached the tight ends in 2016 and 2017, guiding Mike Gesicki who was drafted by the Miami Dolphins.

Penn State played in a bowl game in every year Rahne was there, including a 2016 Big10 Championship and 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl win over Washington. In that time, Penn State has had four-straight seasons of at least nine wins, and the Nittany Lions are one of five teams to rank in the Top-15 of the College Football Playoff final rankings in each of the last four years.

Prior to joining Penn State, Rahne was the quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt for three years.

Prior to Rahne's time at Vanderbilt, the program had been to four bowl games in 121 years of football, none in consecutive seasons. The Commodores were ranked in the Top-25 in the final polls in 2012 and 2013 marking the first time they were ranked in back-to-back seasons in program history.

He spent five years at Kansas State, starting as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching the running backs and tight ends. He helped the Wildcats to two bowl appearances.

Rahne started his coaching career on the defensive side at Holy Cross coaching the defensive line. The following year he coached the running backs at his alma mater, Cornell.

He was a three-year starter at quarterback at Cornell (2002), and graduated as the Big Red's all-time leader in completions (678), passing yards (7,710), touchdown passes (54) and total offense (7,994). He was inducted into the Cornell Hall of Fame in 2014.

Rahne and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Ryder and Jake.

### Captains

Head Coach Ricky Rahne named six captains for the 2024 season.

**Grant Wilson:** Set to become the first ODU QB since Taylor Heinicke to start back-to-back season openers. Was a captain last season.

**Santana Saunders:** Started all 13 games bouncing between left and right tackle last season. First time captain

**Jason Henderson:** Led the country in tackles per game for the second-straight year. Was a captain last season.

**Koa Naotala:** Former walk-on earned a scholarship prior to last season. Made his first career start in the Famous Toastery Bowl last year in place of Henderson.

**Denzel Lowry:** Lowry started all 13 games last season at defensive tackle.

**Seamus Hall:** A transfer from Sioux Falls University, Hall is in his first season with the Monarchs.

### Random Notes About Captains

Grant Wilson and Jason Henderson are captains for the second-straight season.

Hall makes four-straight years under Rahne a specialist has been a captain. Kicker Nick Rice was a captain in 2021, long snapper BR Hatcher in 2022 and punter Ethan Duane in 2023.

Naotala is ODU's first former walk-on to be a captain since Brandon Addison in 2017.

Hall is the first transfer to be named captain in his first season as a Monarch under Head Coach Ricky Rahne.

### Young Coaching Staff - Again

Since Ricky Rahne was hired in 2020 Old Dominion has had one of the youngest coaching staffs in the country. The Monarchs had the youngest staff in the country in 2021 and 2023 and were second youngest in 2022. The 2024 staff is the second youngest staff in the country behind only Sun Belt Conference foe, Georgia Southern.

### Sixth Year Monarchs

Old Dominion has five players on the team that are in their sixth year of college football. Due to student-athletes from nearly every sport receiving an extra year of eligibility due to Covid-19 there has been an uptick in sixth-year players in all sports. All of ODU's sixth-year players this year are transfers.

Aaron Young is a running back transfer from Rutgers and the younger brother of former ODU linebacker and current ODU graduate assistant, Jordan Young.

Will Jones II is a safety from South Florida. Jones began his college career at Kansas State playing for ODU Defensive Coordinator Blake Seiler.

Wide receiver Demariyon Houston transferred from Missouri and also was at Nebraska. He has battled injuries at both spots.

Tight end Pat Conroy transferred to the Monarchs from FCS Merrimack.

Cornerback Dywan Griffin played five years at UTSA, beginning his career with the Roadrunners as a wide receiver before moving to defense.

## Game 5 · ODU at Coastal Carolina

### From FCS to FBS

Grant Wilson started 11-of-12 games at quarterback for ODU last season. The Fordham transfer completed 178-of-312 passes for 2,149 yards and 17 touchdowns with eight interceptions last season.

He is also ODU's leading returning rusher with 289 yards and four touchdowns.

### TD Streak Continues

With his pair of touchdown passes at Bowling Green, Grant Wilson has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 10-straight games. The streak began in last year's Week seven win over App State.

Wilson completed 6-of-14 passes for 118 yards and the two touchdowns.

The 75-yard touchdown pass to Conroy was Wilson's second 70+ yard touchdown pass of the season. He completed a 72-yard TD pass to Isiah Paige in the opener at South Carolina.

### Joseph Takes Over

Quarterback Colton Joseph replaced Wilson in the second half and completed 6-of-13 passes for 26 yards.

Joseph's 14-yard touchdown run gave ODU a 23-21 lead early in the fourth quarter. He carried nine times for 65 yards and the TD.

### Conroy Writes New Chapter

Heading into Bowling Green, tight end Pat Conroy had four catches for 44 yards. He eclipsed that yardage total after his second grab at BGSU. He got ODU on the board with a nine-yard catch and then on ODU's third possession had a 75-yard catch and run touchdown pass from Grant Wilson.

The touchdowns were Conroy's first since November 19, 2022 against St. Francis (Pa.). The 75-yard touchdown tied Conroy's longest career reception since September 25, 2021 against Delaware State.

Conroy is the first ODU tight end to have a two touchdown game.

### Manning Continues to Take Away

Jahron Manning notched a key interception in the win at Bowling Green, with his pick and 42-yard return setting up Colton Joseph's go-ahead touchdown.

Manning's interception was his third of the season. He is tied for third in the country and is tied with James Madison's Terrence Spence for the top spot in the Sun Belt.

His 87 return yards are the second most in a single-season in ODU history. Just two shy of Joe Joe Headen's record 89 yards in 2021.

### Interceptions Galore

Jahron Manning totaled his third interception of the year with an INT in the win at Bowling Green.

Angelo Rankin Jr. notched his first interception as a Monarch against Virginia Tech.

ODU tied the single-game record for interceptions in a game with four in week two against East Carolina. Three came in the first half. Jahron Manning had two, one in the second and fourth quarters, while Patrick Smith-Young and Will Jones had one each.

The six interceptions through four games is the most by an ODU defense since the opening campaign in 2009 when the Monarchs had seven interceptions in the first three games.

### Manning Makes Plays

Manning continued his hot start to the season with nine tackles and an interception in the win at Bowling Green. His three interceptions is already tied for fourth most in program history.

### Hard Nosed Running

Aaron Young had his lowest carry total of the season at Bowling Green but his highest average as he registered 12 carries for 74 yards and a score. He's led ODU in rushing in three of the first four games.

Aaron Young had 67 yards on 17 carries against Virginia Tech and a season long 17 yard carry.

Young carried 25 times for 83 yards and a touchdown against ECU. Fifty-five of his 83 yards came in the second half. The 25 carries for 83 yards was a career-high. His previous highs were 13 carries for 67 yards.

Young is third in the Sun Belt Conference with 70 yards per game.

### Koa Leads the Way

Linebacker Koa Naotala registered nine tackles, one sack and 1.5 tackles for loss in the win at Bowling Green.

Naotala leads the Sun Belt Conference and is tied for 11th in the nation with 10.3 tackles per game. The former walk-on had a career-high 18 tackles against East Carolina.

The 18 tackles Naotala had against ECU was his second career double-digit tackle game as he had 14 tackles in the Famous Toastery Bowl against WKU.

Naotala's 18 tackles are the fifth most in a single-game in program history.

### Block Party

ODU blocked its second kick of the season with a blocked field goal against Virginia Tech by Ricardo Williams. A transfer from Georgia State, it was the first blocked kick of his career.

In the opener at South Carolina, safety Markus Knight blocked a punt for the Monarchs. He blocked his first career punt last season in the win at Georgia Southern.

Williams became the 12th different player in the last three years to block a kick. Knight and Jason Henderson are the only players with two blocked kicks.

### Opening Drive Struggles/Success

For the first time this season, the Old Dominion offense scored on its opening possession of the game. ODU got the ball first and went 75 yards in eight plays.

The ODU defense in turn got its first stop on an opening drive of the year, forcing a Bowling Green punt.

Prior to Saturday's win over BGSU, ODU was outscored 30-7 in the first quarter. ODU led 14-7 after one quarter of play at BGSU.

The Monarchs' only first quarter touchdown prior to Saturday was Grant Wilson's 72-yard touchdown pass to Isiah Paige in the opener at South Carolina.

### Big Plays Monarchs

For the second time this season Grant Wilson competed a pass 70+ yards. In the opener he tossed a 72-yard strike to Isiah Paige and in the win at Bowling Green had a 75-yard score to Pat Conroy.

It was the third completion of 70+ yards by Wilson in his career. He completed a 78-yard pass to Kelby Williams last year at Southern Miss.

### Two-Time All-American Jason Henderson

For the second-straight season Henderson led the country in tackles per game with 14.2 and finished second in the country with 170 tackles, one behind Jay Higgins of Iowa, who played two more games than Henderson.

He broke the ODU single-season record with 19.5 tackles for loss, finishing fourth in the country.

#### Quick Hits

- ODU Head Coach Ricky Rahne played quarterback at Cornell from 1998-2001 and is the Cornell Sports Hall of Fame. He completed 678-of-1226 passes for 7710 yards and 54 touchdown passes. All rank second in program history to Jeff Matthews, who briefly played in the NFL and CFL.

- ODU Defensive Coordinator Blake Seiler wrestled at Oklahoma State as a freshman on the Cowboys' National Championship team. He transferred to Kansas State the following year as a walk-on to the football team and was a starting defensive lineman and captain as a senior.

- ODU Wide Receivers coach Kody Cook also played at Kansas State, and also beginning his career with the Wildcats as a walk-on. He became an all-conference wide receiver and played one game at quarterback, helping the Wildcats become bowl eligible as all of their quarterbacks were injured.

- ODU running back Aaron Young is the younger brother of former Monarch and current GA Jordan Young. Jordan is ODU's second all-time leading tackler behind Jason Henderson. Aaron transferred from Rutgers where he played along side another brother, Avery. Their father, Anthony, is in the Temple Sports Hall of Fame and was a third round pick of the Indianapolis Colts. He played in 14 games as a rookie but suffered a career-ending injury.

- Linebacker Jason Henderson has been named to every watch list he is eligible for, including the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus, Bednarik and Lombardi Awards. Wide receiver Kelby Williams has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List, which is given to the best player either from Texas or that plays at a University in the state of Texas.

### Tough Sledding

By any measure Old Dominion has a tough 2024 schedule. Ten-of-12 opponents played in a bowl game in 2023, while South Carolina and East Carolina did not, are typically in bowl contention. ODU is also one of 17 FBS schools that do not play an FCS team this season. ODU also did not play an FCS team in 2022. A pair of ODU opponents, App State and Virginia Tech, do also not play an FCS team this season.

### New Rules

College Football has introduced several new rule changes for the 2024 season.

• **Coach to player communication.** One player on each team will have radio receiving capability and the player must be identified by an unbranded green dot on the back midline of the helmet. Coach-to-player communications will be cut off when the play clock reaches 15 seconds or at the snap, whichever comes first. When the play clock resets to 25/40, the communications will be turned back on. If more than one green dot helmet is detected on the field by the game officials, the result is a live ball 5-yard equipment violation penalty, and this penalty initiates a conference review.

• **Standard Tablets for in-game video only is permissive in 2024 for all football playing subdivisions and are subject to the following guidelines:** Tablets shall be restricted to “in-game video” (current game) and may not include analytics, data or data-access capability or any other communications access. No other video is allowed (e.g., scouting video, practice video, etc.). Tablets may be used in the coach’s box, sideline, and locker room and may not be interconnected to other devices to project larger/additional images. Video may include coach’s sideline, coach’s endzone, and a program feed per play from the current game only and may also display “game circumstances,” including down / distance / time / quarter / play-number / score. A team may have up to 18 standard tablets active, and all team personnel may view the tablets. If any team personnel engages an official with a tablet to show or review video, an automatic Unsportsmanlike Conduct foul will result.

• **Two-Minute Timeout.** When the game clock is running and the ball is not live, the Referee shall stop the clock with exactly two minutes remaining in the second and fourth quarters for a Two-Minute Timeout. If the ball is live when the game clock reaches two minutes in the second and fourth quarters, the play will continue, and the Referee shall stop the clock when the ball is subsequently declared dead for a Two Minute Timeout.

• **Horse Collar Tackle.** For player safety, Horse-collar tackles that occur within the tackle box will be penalized as a 15-yard personal foul penalty. Currently, a horse-collar tackle within the tackle box is not a foul.

### About Old Dominion University

Old Dominion University was founded in 1930 by the College of William and Mary, the second oldest university in the United States. Established as an extension of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, and Virginia Tech, Old Dominion began educating teachers and engineers. The two-year school rapidly evolved into a four-year institution, and was granted independence in 1962 as Old Dominion College.

Considerable growth in enrollment, the expansion of research facilities and preparation for the addition of graduate programs led the Board of Visitors to approve the name change to Old Dominion University. Now Old Dominion is a powerhouse for higher education with six colleges: Arts and Letters, Business and Public Administration, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences and Sciences. Old Dominion has offered master’s degrees since 1964, became Old Dominion University in 1969 and Ph.D.s since 1971.

### World’s Largest Naval Base

Naval Station Norfolk is the largest Naval Base in the world and just minutes from Old Dominion University.

### Big Blue

When ODU became independent from the College of William & Mary in 1962, while there was no official mascot, Old Dominion College took on a mace and crown as their symbols in publications and athletics.

Big Blue made his debut during a basketball game in December 1971.

Ironically, the first costume was more orange than blue, and when trying to dye the costume made it more grey-green than blue, the university had to hire a seamstress to sew on powder blue fake fur to approximate the school colors at the time. Through the 1970s and into the 1980s, Big Blue evolved from a fierce lion into a soft, friendly lion. By the 1990s and early 2000s, Big Blue has morphed into his current look with little changes over the years.

In 2011, Big Blue was voted as the Capital One National Mascot of the Year.

In October 2013, a seven-foot-tall bronze sculpture of Big Blue was unveiled in Webb University Center to start a new campus tradition. Students take their photograph with Big Blue at the start and end of their Monarch journey. The statue was conceived by the Student Government Association (SGA) and created by sculptor Richard Stravitz. Throughout their time at Old Dominion, students can rub Big Blue’s belly for good luck and prosperity.

### Monarchs in the NFL

Old Dominion has eight players on 53-man NFL rosters and two on practice squads. In just 14 years of football, Old Dominion has had five players drafted and another handful of players make it to the NFL via undrafted free agency. Former ODU quarterback Taylor Heinicke and long snapper Rick Lovato enter their 10th year in the NFL this season, both as undrafted free agents. Heinicke initially signed with the Minnesota Vikings and spent time on their roster and practice squad, but never actually played a game for the Vikings. He has played for the Houston Texans, Carolina Panthers, Washington Commanders and Atlanta Falcons.

Lovato was originally signed by the Chicago Bears but was cut during training camp. He saw his first action with the Green Bay Packers and is the first Monarch to play in an NFL regular season and postseason game. He has played for the Washington Redskins and is currently with the Philadelphia Eagles, who he won a Super Bowl with in 2018.

## Game One Recap · South Carolina 23 Old Dominion 19

### ODU Drops Opener at South Carolina, 23-19

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Defeat with honor is a statement that isn't in the lexicon of Old Dominion Head Football coach Ricky Rahne. But that clearly described what happened Saturday night at Willams-Brice Stadium.

ODU went toe-to-toe Saturday night with an SEC opponent on its own home turf. The Monarchs were often more physical than South Carolina and at times, outplayed the Gamecocks.

But the ODU offense could not generate enough points and committed two crucial turnovers that led to two South Carolina touchdowns and allowed the Gamecocks to claim a 23-19 victory.

Both South Carolina touchdowns came after Monarch turnovers inside the ODU 10.

Both turnovers came on fumbles from quarterback Grant Wilson, who completed 22 of 38 passes for 197 yards a passing and rushing touchdown and two interceptions.

ODU trailed 16-7 midway through the third quarter when the previously moribund Monarch offense kicked into gear.

Wilson completed two passes to Myles Alston, and then on third down, was rushed from the pocket, and raced 36 yards for the touchdown to trim the South Carolina lead to 16-13 with 4:57 left in the third quarter.

Then, after ODU's defense held the Gamecocks on downs, the Monarchs drove from their own 40 to the Gamecock 24, where the drive stalled.

Ethan Sanchez, who had a PAT blocked on the previous score, then drilled a 40-yard field goal to knot the score at 16-all with 14 seconds left in the third quarter.

Sanchez then kicked a 33-yard field goal to give ODU its first lead, 19-16, with 9:54 to play as the 1,000 or so Monarch faithful began chanting "ODU" in an otherwise quiet stadium.

The ODU defense then held the Gamecocks on downs and with 7:52 left, and the Monarchs started at their own 10 yard line.

But that's when things became undone. On third down, Wilson scrambled up the middle and was stripped of the ball by lineman Dylan Stewart. Lineman DeAndre Jules recovered.

It took two plays for South Carolina to retake the lead, 23-19, on a three-yard Sellers rush with 6:11 left.

Wilson was somber in the postgame press conference, but answered tough questions forthrightly.

ODU's offense got the ball back twice more but was unable to get into scoring position. Defensive back Jalone Kilgore iced the game with 1:21 left when he intercepted Wilson at the ODU 41.

The Monarchs got off to a rough start. On the game's first drive, Wilson was rushed from the pocket and corralled by two South Carolina defenders, including Kyle Kennard, who knocked the ball loose. The Gamecocks recovered at the three.

Raheim Sanders scored three plays later and the Gamecocks led, 7-0.

Wilson recovered quickly from his mistake and quieted the boisterous crowd with a 72-yard TD pass to Isiah Paige that knotted the score at 7-7 just seconds later. He found Paige at the 25, and the speedster from Richmond junked to his right and then left again to shake off a defender and bounded into the end zone.

South Carolina made it 10-7 on a 40-yard field goal from Alex Herrera – the field goal was forced by a third-down sack by ODU's Mario Thompson.

South Carolina led, 10-7, early in the second quarter when a lightning strike several miles away forced a 40-minute delay.

## ODU Drops Another Tight One to ECU, 20-14

**NORFOLK, Va.** – There was a festive, sellout crowd of 21,944 on hand at S.B. Ballard Stadium and the crowd was on its feet screaming as the Monarchs drove from their own 9 to the East Carolina 33 in the final minutes.

But as has so often happened when the Monarchs and Pirates lock horns, ECU did just enough to win a very close game.

ODU quarterback Grant Wilson was tackled with eight seconds left, and the Monarchs were unable to get lined up to spike the ball, and the Pirates escaped with a 20-14 victory Saturday.

It was the second week in a row when mistakes cost the Monarchs. Last week ODU gave away two touchdowns with fumbles inside the 10 in a 23-19 loss at South Carolina.

Offensive turnovers weren't the issue this week as much as offensive production. The Monarch defense forced four interceptions, but only one led to a touchdown. One interception came on a first and goal at the ODU 7, and thus spared the Monarchs at least a field goal.

The Monarchs were outgained, 466-287, and often shot themselves in the foot with uncharacteristic penalties. ODU had 10 penalties for 95 yards, and half were holding penalties.

ODU also had a costly muffed ball on a kickoff that led to an ECU field goal.

ODU led, 7-6, at the half but the Pirates wasted little time retaking the lead for good early in the third quarter.

On third down and 13, Rahjai Harris raced 63 yards for a touchdown. ECU quarterback Jake Garcia then found Chase Sowell in the end zone for the two-point conversion, and the Pirates led, 14-7, five minutes into the second half.

ODU then muffed the kickoff, and the Pirates recovered. That set up a 33-yard field goal by ECU's Andrew Conrad, and six minutes into the second half, the Pirates led, 17-7.

ODU's offense then rattled off its best scoring drive of the night, driving 75 yards in five minutes with an equal mix of passing and rushing plays. Young, the senior transfer from Rutgers, bulled over from the one-yard line for the TD with 4:11 left in the third quarter to close the gap to 17-14.

Young finished with 83 yards rushing on 25 carries. Naotala, who started in place of injured All-American linebacker Jason Henderson, had a career-high 18 tackles.

ECU again looked to extend the lead early in the fourth quarter as the Pirates had a first down on the ODU seven. But then Jahron Manning, the junior college transfer from New Orleans, Louisiana, picked off a pass in the corner of the end zone to end the threat.

It was his second interception of the game.

Wilson, who completed 20 of 34 passes for 192 yards, threw a 44-yard TD pass in the first half to Kelby Williams that staked ODU to a 7-6 lead. But other than the one TD drive in the third quarter, the Monarchs were unable to get their offense going in the second half.

ECU's Conrad booted a 50-yard field goal with 9:09 left in the game to give the Pirates a 20-14 lead, which meant the Monarchs had to score a touchdown.

## Game Three Recap - Virginia Tech 37 Old Dominion 17

### ODU Drops 37-17 Contest to Virginia Tech

NORFOLK, Va. -- Defeating a Virginia Tech football team that many prognosticators think can win an ACC championship was going to be difficult under the best of circumstances.

But being forced to face the Hokies with two freshmen quarterbacks who had never played a down of college football made it a particularly daunting task for Old Dominion.

With starting quarterback Grant Wilson out with an injury, Quinn Henicle, a true freshman from Downingtown, Pennsylvania, came off the bench and quickly rushed 65 yards for a touchdown that gave ODU new life in the second quarter.

He then led ODU on a 69-yard scoring drive that allowed the Monarchs to trim the lead to 14-10 at halftime.

But the Hokies got their offense in gear, scored 23 unanswered points and claimed a 37-17 victory over the Monarchs Saturday night before a sellout crowd of 22,208, the largest ever to see a game at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The victory was the first by Tech (2-1) in three tries in Norfolk. The Monarchs upset then 13th-ranked Tech, 49-35, in 2018, and two years ago, rallied to claim a 20-17 victory in Tech Coach Brent Pry's first game.

This was by far the best Tech team to play at ODU, which fell to 0-3.

Quarterback Kyrone Drowns rushed for 117 yards and a touchdown and passed for 176 more and another TD. Tailback Bhayshul Tuten had 115 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

Meanwhile, the Hokies dominated the line of scrimmage when the Monarchs were on offense. Tech had five sacks and seven tackles for a loss.

With Wilson out, ODU Head Coach Ricky Rahne elected to start Colton Joseph, a redshirt freshman from Newport Beach, California. Joseph led the team for two possessions but the Monarchs garnered just one first down, and he was replaced by Henicle.

On his fourth play from scrimmage, Henicle feigned a handoff and then rushed untouched for a touchdown.

"We were always going to play Quinn," Rahne said. "I decided to stay with him because he gave us a spark."

Late in the second quarter, Henicle led ODU down the field again, as Bryce Duke, who played for Virginia Tech last season, began the drive with a 48-yard run, the longest of his career. That set up a 28-yard field goal by Ethan Sanchez that narrowed the lead to four, 14-10.

Duke, a junior from Leesburg, Virginia, led the Monarchs with 85 yards rushing.

As ODU headed into the locker room, the Monarchs thought that for a third week in a row, the game would go down to the wire.

"We felt really confident," said running back Aaron Young. "It felt just like our other games, that we needed to find a way to get over the hump."

But the Hokies took control in the third quarter largely by shutting down ODU's offense. They continually applied pressure to Henicle, who didn't have enough time to set and throw and was sacked four times.

Rahne said the failure to protect the quarterback was a team failure, but that his offensive line played poorly.

Tech built the lead to 20-10 on two third-quarter field goals and it could have been worse -- both times the Hokies were inside the 15 but were held out of the end zone by ODU's defense.

Tech was driving in ODU territory, and on the search for more points, when ODU cornerback Angelo Rankin Jr. intercepted in the end zone.

Then the Hokies finally scored an elusive touchdown, driving 59 yards on a drive capped by Tuten's 16-yard TD run on the first play of the fourth quarter.

It was 37-10 when the Monarchs finally scored on a 16-yard TD run by Tariq Sims with 3:32 left.

ODU was again without All-American linebacker Jason Henderson, who played sparingly in a 23-19 defeat at South Carolina and sat out last weekend's 20-14 home loss to East Carolina.

That meant the Monarchs were without both their offensive and defensive leaders -- Wilson and Henderson are team captains.

ODU has a bye week next weekend, meaning they have 14 days before they play their next game, Sept. 28 at Bowling Green.

## ODU Wins First Sun Belt Game, 29-26 Over Arkansas State

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio – Backup quarterback Colton Joseph led a game-winning 13 play, 79-yard drive culminated by a four-yard touchdown run from Aaron Young to lift Old Dominion Football to a 30-27 win at Bowling Green on Saturday night.

The Monarchs took a 17-14 halftime lead over Bowling Green behind quarterback Grant Wilson, who returned from an injury that kept him out of the Virginia Tech game.

Rushed from the pocket four minutes into the fourth quarter, Joseph ran for a 14-yard TD that gave the Monarchs a 23-21 lead.

That touchdown was set up by a Jahron Manning interception, and a subsequent 42-yard return, that gave ODU possession deep in Bowling Green territory.

Bowling Green retook the lead after a costly ODU penalty.

With 3:55 left, and ODU holding the 23-21 lead, Bowling Green place-kicker Jackson Kleather attempted to give the Falcons the lead with a 51-yard field goal.

The field goal attempt was short, but officials ruled that ODU defenders had used an illegal leap in an attempt to block the kick. That gave Bowling Green a first down on the ODU 18 and new life.

Two plays later, Terion Stewart rushed 13 yards for a touchdown and a 27-23 Falcons lead.

Perhaps the game's biggest play came on fourth and six at the ODU 40 when Joseph passed 15 yards to tight end Pat Conroy, who caught three passes for 99 yards and two touchdowns.

The next biggest play came with 39 seconds left, when Joseph was again rushed from the pocket and broke loose for 21 yards and a first and goal at the Bowling Green 4.

ODU's hurry-up offense immediately stepped to the line, and Joseph handed to Young, who hit defenders at the two but bulled over into the end zone.

ODU (1-3) begins its eight-game Sun Belt Conference schedule with back-to-back games at Coastal Carolina and Georgia State the next two weeks before hosting Texas State on Oct. 19 for Homecoming.

ODU opened the game with a 75-yard touchdown drive that took just three minutes and three seconds, and in which Wilson made several key plays.

On third and 4 at the ODU 34, Wilson was forced from the pocket and broke free for a 30-yard gain that put the Monarchs in Bowling Green territory.

Aaron Young rushed for 17 yards, and Wilson completed two passes including a 9-yard touchdown pass to Conroy for the touchdown with 11:57 remaining.

It took nearly 12 minutes but Bowling Green tied it back up on an 18-yard pass from Bazalak to Fannin with 31 seconds left.

ODU then stunned the Doyt L. Perry Stadium crowd of 19,140 into silence with a trick play on its next snap from scrimmage. Wilson rushed to the line as if he was running and everyone, including the Bowling Green safeties, bit on the fake.

Conroy, meanwhile, was streaking up the field and Wilson found him at the ODU 40. Conroy, a 6-foot-2, 235-pound redshirt senior transfer from Merrimack College of Massachusetts, then ran untouched for a 75-yard touchdown pass that took just 10 seconds off the clock.

After Bowling Green tied the scored at 14-all, ODU's Ethan Sanchez kicked a 53-yarder with 8:33 to go that gave ODU a 17-14 lead. It was the second-longest field goal in ODU history.
