Brian O. Hemphill, Ph.D., who became Old Dominion University's ninth president effective July 1, 2021, is an unwavering champion

for access and opportunity, as well as innovation and research, with a deep commitment to forward-focused leadership. President Hemphill is proud to lead ODU with a steadfast dedication to excellence, a firm commitment to accountability and transparency, and – most importantly – a strong focus on student success.

President Hemphill's road to ODU has taken him from the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville, a flagship university, where he served as Associate Vice Chancellor and Dean of Students; to Northern Illinois University, a large, public, research university, where he served as Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management and Associate Professor for eight years; West Virginia State University, a public, land-grant, research university, where he served as the tenth President and Professor for four years; and, most recently, Radford University, a comprehensive university, where he served as the seventh President and as a Professor for five years.

President Hemphill earned a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration and Policy Studies from the University of Iowa, a Master of Science degree in Journalism and Mass Communication from Iowa State University of Science and Technology, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Organizational Communication from Saint Augustine's University. President Hemphill is a published author with a multitude of writings covering topics related to gun violence and threat preparedness on college campuses; emerging financial concerns affecting the collegiate sphere; STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and economic-related issues pertaining to education;

and a myriad of additional scholarly perspectives pertinent to the higher education environment. President Hemphill co-edited a book, titled "College in the Crosshairs: An Administrative Perspective on Prevention of Gun Violence." He is a highly sought-after keynote speaker, guest presenter, and panelist with frequent appearances across the country.

President Hemphill's passion for life and unparalleled commitment to excellence begins at home where he shares his life with his loving and supportive wife, Dr. Marisela Rosas Hemphill, who proudly serves as ODU's First Lady. The Hemphills are the proud parents of energetic twins, Catalina and Cruz. President Hemphill also has two adult children, Jada, a public school teacher in Fort Worth, Texas, and Jordan, assistant director of athletics development at the University of Texas in Austin. DR. CAMDEN WOOD SELIG

HEADING INTO HIS 16TH SEASON AT ODU AND HIS 27TH AS AN ATHLETICS DIRECTOR.

IS THE FIFTH LONGEST TENURED FBS AD IN THE COUNTRY, AND SECOND LONGEST TENURED AD IN THE SUN BELT.

ODU HAS WON 21 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS SINCE HE TOOK OVER IN 2010.

WOMEN'S TENNIS HAS WON FIVE-STRAIGHT CONFERENCE TITLES.

Dr. Camden Wood Selig is in his 16th year as Director of Athletics at Old Dominion University, where his *“Championship Effort”* philosophy has helped guide the department as one of the most respected and successful intercollegiate programs in the nation. Of the 133 FBS Athletic Directors, Selig is the fifth longest FBS tenured in the country. He is in his 27th year as a Division I AD.

During his tenure, Selig has directed the University's move through two FBS conferences and has Old Dominion positioned strongly in the Sun Belt Conference. He has overseen the transition of a startup FCS football program to the FBS level, led major athletic facility expansion and enhancement for virtually all 18 programs, and added women's volleyball in 2019.

One needs only to visit the ODU campus to see Selig's contributions to the growth and improvement of Monarch athletic venues with well over \$100 million invested in Intercollegiate athletic facilities since his arrival. Projects completed and initiated under Selig include:

- ODU opened the \$67.5 million Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium on Saturday, August 31, 2019 against Norfolk State. The stadium rebuilding was completed in nine months.
- A \$20 million baseball renovation began in the fall of 2022. The new stadium, which should be completed for the 2026 season, will be called the Ellmer Family Baseball Complex.
- The Bernett & Blanche Mitchum Basketball Performance Center, a privately funded \$8.4 million state-of-the-art facility, is complete and is the new training center for the ODU men's and women's basketball teams.
- The \$3.5 million repurposing of the arena in the Jim Jarrett Athletic building is now the brand-new 900 seat home of the ODU women's volleyball program.
- A \$3.5 million expansion of L.R. Hill support facility for football, women's field hockey, and women's lacrosse, including a new state-of-the-art weight room.
- The addition of a \$2.3 million video replay scoreboard, LED ribbon panels, and digital tables at Chartway Arena.
- The \$600,000 Paul A. Keyes Indoor Hitting Complex, which opened in the fall of 2014.

As collegiate athletic costs continue to rise, Selig has placed a premium on increasing privately generated revenue. Since his arrival in 2010:

- Total ODAF philanthropic gifts for athletics have surpassed \$140 million.
- Corporate sponsorship revenue has surpassed \$33 million.
- Staff giving to the Old Dominion Athletic Foundation (ODAF) has remained at 100% for 15 consecutive years.

And, in ODU's first year in the Sun Belt Conference, they led in attendance for men's and women's basketball and set a single-season ODU record for football. Men's basketball has led the Sun Belt in attendance three-straight years and football set another attendance record in 2024.

One of the most dramatic and gratifying accomplishments for Selig has been the academic success of the 18 teams. Highlights from 2024-25 include:

- An ODU record 212 student athletes (52%) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.4 or higher GPA.
- An ODU record 3.34 cumulative GPA for all student-athletes.
- 75 percent of student-athletes with a 3.0 GPA and 52 student-athletes with a 4.0 GPA.

Monarch teams have performed well on the playing fields under Selig, highlighted by:

- Twenty-one Conference Championships since 2010, including back-to-back-to back championships for women's soccer and five-straight conference championships for women's tennis. Men's tennis won its third-straight conference championship.

In Selig's tenure there have also been numerous firsts and achievements that haven't been accomplished in many years, including:

- Linebacker Jason Henderson in 2022-23 became the first ODU football player to earn All-America honors at the FBS level. And the first football player to earn first-team All-America honors.
- In 2016, ODU participated in its first bowl game in the Bahamas. In 2021, went to its 2nd bowl game in Myrtle Beach and in 2023 it's third bowl game with the Famous Toastery Bowl in Charlotte, North Carolina.
- Women's soccer won its first C-USA Championship in 2022 and first conference championship since 2006.
- In June 2022, baseball first baseman Matt Coutney was named C-USA Player of the Year and honored on four All-American teams. Additionally, he earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors becoming the first baseball player in 17 years to be named an Academic All-American. In 2024-25, women's tennis player Sofia Johnson became the first women's tennis player to earn Academic All-America honors in 24 years and ODU's first since Coutney.
- In May 2021, the women's tennis team won the Conference USA Championship for the first time, its first conference championship since 2001. They have since won three-straight conference championships and have won an NCAA first round Tournament match three-straight years, including wins over Arkansas and South Carolina, and has advanced to the final 32 each of the last three seasons.
- Over the 2021 and 2022 baseball seasons, ODU was one of just 11 schools in the country and the only school in Virginia to have back to back 40+ win seasons.
- ODU baseball has the 17th best winning percentage in the country since 2021.
- Twenty one baseball players have been drafted under current head coach Chris Finwood, who Selig hired in 2010.
- The baseball team won its first C-USA Championship, earned a No. 1 seed at the NCAA Regionals and received its highest final ranking in July 2021 of No. 16 in the Top-25 poll.

Hampton Roads Community outreach and support has been a staple under Selig's leadership:

- Selig spearheaded the return of the annual Khedive Shriners' Oyster Bowl game to Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium in 2011 and helped raise over \$250,000 for the Shriners' Children's Burn Hospital since that time.

Selig spent 11 years directing the Western Kentucky University Hilltopper athletic program, which won 70 Sun Belt Conference Championships from 2000-2010 and a national record 19 crowns in two seasons, 2008-2010. He also led WKU from FCS to FBS and is the only AD in the country to lead two institutions in this transition.

Prior to his stint at WKU, Selig served as the Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Virginia from 1988-1999, overseeing external operations his last five years. He began his athletic career as the Director of Ticketing at VCU, where he served from 1985-1988, finishing his stint as Assistant to the Athletic Director.

Selig was a four-year member (2006-2010) of the NCAA Women's Basketball Committee and served as Chair of the Final Four site selection committee. He served as Chair for both the Sun Belt Conference Athletic Directors and the Men's Basketball Committees during his tenure at WKU. He has served on the prestigious Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet representing the CAA and is currently on the Elizabeth River Trail Board of Directors and serves on the executive committee for the Norfolk Forum and was recently named the groups secretary. He is a two-time winner of the Tom Fergusson Metropolitan Person of the Year award by the Norfolk Sports Club (2014, 2023), symbolic of his impact on the region's sports profile.

Selig was born in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, and raised in Norfolk, Virginia, where he attended Norfolk Collegiate School. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Washington and Lee University, a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University and a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Virginia, with a minor in business from the UVA Darden School of Business. His dissertation "The Study of Donor Predictability Among Alumni Athletes", won the 2002 CASE Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation.

Selig and his wife Ellen of Annapolis, MD, have three children, Lex, Nick, and Julianna.

ABOUT THE MONARCHS

The Monarchs (2-3) were in Cincinnati on Tuesday and fell 99-69 to the Xavier Musketeers inside of the Cintas Center. LJ Thomas led Old Dominion with 13 points, Drew McKenna was next with 12 points, and Robert Davis Jr. and Caelum Swanton-Rodger added 10 points each in the loss.

Through the team's first five games, KC Shaw and Thomas have paced the offense with 14.2 and 14.0 ppg, respectively. Jordan Battle is third in scoring with 8.2 ppg and is shooting 81% at the free-throw line. Scottie Hubbard (5.4 ppg) has made a team-high seven threes, with Davis Jr. (6.5 ppg) and Jared Turner (4.2 ppg) right behind him with six threes each. Swanton-Rodger averages 6.8 ppg and leads the Monarchs with 26 boards (5.2 rpg) and five blocks, while Battle has grabbed 25 boards (5.0 rpg) and a team-best nine steals.

MIKE JONES - Head Coach

Mike Jones was named the 14th head coach in Old Dominion program history on March 1, 2024. He enters his second season at ODU in 2025-26.

In his first season leading the program, the Monarchs finished 15-20 overall and 8-10 in Sun Belt Conference play. Jones earned his first career win with a 73-71 victory over Maryland-Eastern Shore on Nov. 15. ODU also picked up non-conference wins over Randolph-Macon, William & Mary and Virginia Wesleyan. In league play, the Monarchs swept Coastal Carolina and also defeated ULM, Southern Miss, Louisiana, South Alabama, App State, and Texas State. Sean Durugordon represented Old

Dominion on the All-Sun Belt Third Team. At the Sun Belt Championship, the 10th-seeded Monarchs defeated No. 11 Louisiana, No. 7 Texas State, and No. 6 App State with Durugordon earning a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

Jones is the second ODU alumnus to be head coach of his alma mater, joining Oliver Purnell, who Jones played for his first three seasons at ODU. He also is the third African American head coach in program history, along with Purnell and the late Jeff Capel.

"We are excited to welcome ODU alumnus Mike Jones back as our 14th head men's basketball coach. It was imperative that our new head coach check all the essential boxes including ability to recruit both high school and transfer student-athletes, player development, coaching acumen, style of play, community engagement, impeccable character and a proven history of success. Mike Jones checks all those boxes," ODU Director of Athletics Dr. Wood Selig said. "In Mike Jones, ODU has a leader who has seen success at the highest level and knows what it takes to sustain competitive excellence. The fact that he is one of us is icing on the cake. Welcome home Coach Jones, I know the Hampton Roads community is ready to fill Chartway Arena and help you win Championships."

An Old Dominion alumnus that played for the Monarchs from 1991-95, Jones was a part of two tournament championship teams and one of the greatest wins in ODU history. Jones returns to ODU after spending this season as an assistant coach at Maryland.

"I could not be more excited. This is an opportunity of a lifetime! Representing a world class university under the leadership of President Hemphill and AD Selig, my family and I cannot wait to officially be Monarchs," Jones said. "ODU is home to me and WE are ready to work to build the program back into something that Norfolk and the entire Hampton Roads community will be proud of."

After a highly successful 19-year stint as the head coach at DeMatha High School in Maryland, Jones joined the college ranks in 2021 as the associate head coach at Virginia Tech. He spent two seasons in Blacksburg and helped the Hokies to a 42-28 record in those two years. In his first season, Virginia Tech defeated No. 7 Duke to win its first-ever ACC Tournament Championship. His second season saw the Hokies notch wins over No. 18 North Carolina and No. 6 Virginia and advance to the NIT.

As the head coach at DeMatha High School, Jones won nine Washington Catholic Athletic Conference regular season titles, eight WCAC Tournament crowns, four Maryland Private School Tournament championships and a national championship in 2006. During his tenure nine of his players went on to play in the NBA. Jones went 511-119 (.811) while at DeMatha and has won more than 600 games as a head coach including his games with USA Basketball.



In addition to his experience of developing players at the high school level, Jones has extensive ties to USA Basketball. After serving in three coaching roles with USA Basketball alone in 2019, Jones was named a co-recipient of the 2019 USA Basketball Developmental Coach of the Year award. He led the 2019 USA Basketball Men's U16 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas U16 Championship in Brazil, was a lead coach at the 2019 USA Men's Junior National Team July minicamp and was a court coach at the 2019 USA Men's Junior National Team October minicamp.

Jones has also served as head coach of the USA Nike Hoop Summit Team three times, in 2013, 2014 and 2018, and he served as the USA's Hoop Summit assistant coach in 2012 and 2017.

He got his start with USA Basketball as an assistant coach for the 2004 Youth Development Festival East Team. He won three gold medals with USA Basketball men's junior national teams, including the 2011 U16 team and 2012 and 2016 U17 teams. Prior to 2019, he was a coach at the annual USA Basketball Men's Junior National Team October minicamp eight times (2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018).

Jones played at Old Dominion from 1991-95, was a two-year starter for the Monarchs and earned All-CAA honors as a senior. Jones scored 19 points in ODU's triple overtime win over No. 3 seed Villanova in the first round of the 1995 NCAA Tournament. One of the best three-point shooters in Monarch history, he led ODU as a senior with a 42.6 percent three-point shooting percentage, a clip that ranks as the sixth best in a single-season in program history. His 168 career three-pointers are also sixth most. He scored 1,166 career points in 111 games played.

Jones and his wife, Stayce, have a daughter, Maya, and stepson, Jacques.

ABOUT THE BEARS

The Bears (1-4) have dropped three in a row and are coming off a 79-73 loss to N.C. A&T on Tuesday. Three players are scoring in double figures: Rob Lawson (14.6 ppg), Alfred Worrell Jr. (14.0 ppg), and Elijah Davis (12.4 ppg).

Morgan State leads the MEAC in free throw percentage (76.2%), free throws made per game (19.2), free throw attempts per game (25.2), and fastbreak points (15.80). The team is also second in the MEAC and 37th in the country with 37.60 bench points per game. The Bears have been outscored by an average of 3.0 points, allowing 82.0 ppg while scoring 79.0. The team is shooting 44.4% from the field and 33.0% from long range.



ACCESSIBLE PARKING / DROP OFF

Accessible parking is available in every parking deck and is close to the parking deck elevators. For most events, there is an accessible drop off area located on the 45th Street (North) entrance of the building. There is an elevator located at this entrance, which can take guests up to the concourse and VIP levels. For those guests requiring wheelchair assistance, please call (757) 683-5762 for more information.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Guests are not permitted to bring alcohol into the facility, nor are they permitted to leave with alcohol beverages. Beer and wine will be sold at concession stands. Virginia State laws prohibit the consumption of any alcoholic beverage by any persons under the age of 21. We reserve the right to refuse service to anyone without proper identification.

ANIMALS

Animals or pets of any kind are prohibited with the exception of service animals for guests with disabilities and/or special needs. Service animals are welcomed into the building and must remain on a leash or harness at all times.

BOX OFFICE

The Box Office is located at the Chartway Arena on the corner of 43rd Street and Hampton Blvd. Box Office is open Monday-Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with additional hours on event days. For questions regarding ticketing, please call (757) 683-4444 (tickets cannot be purchased through this phone number). To order tickets go to YNotTix.com.

CAMERAS

The use of still cameras/flash photography and recording devices is prohibited at most Chartway Arena events. If a patron brings a camera or recording device into the center, the patron will be asked to return that item to his/her vehicle, or check it with guest services.

CHILDREN'S TICKETS

Children 2 and under do not require a ticket.

CONCESSIONS

DOORS OPEN

For most events, doors open one hour prior to the event start time. The VIP entrance area is on the North side of the Chartway Arena on the corner of 45th Street and Hampton Blvd. Handicap entrance is also on 45th Street and Hampton Blvd. The Big Blue Room is located on the 43rd Street side of the venue.

ELEVATORS

There are three elevators located in the venue. Two VIP elevators are located behind Sections 107 and 207 on the north end of the building (facing 45th Street). A patron elevator is located behind Section 113 on the east side of the building (facing Monarch Way).

FIRST AID

If medical assistance is required, notify the nearest Chartway Arena representative and he/she will escort you to the first aid station. Our first aid facility is fully equipped to handle all minor injuries.

FAN BEHAVIOR

Individuals attending athletic events at Old Dominion University are expected to conduct themselves in a manner respectable of the nature and character of the University. Persons acting in a disruptive, disrespectful, or disorderly manner may be asked to leave the premises or be subject to criminal sanctions. Students may also be subject to sanctions of the University's Code of Student Conduct.

The Follett/University Village bookstore and its on-campus satellite locations are the exclusive vendors for game days. Merchandise is available in the lobby.

MERCHANDISE LICENSING REGULATIONS

Any non-Follett vendor that is selling merchandise on the campus will be served with a cease and desist

letter, will have their merchandise seized and be asked to leave the campus by University Police. Any vendor that is selling merchandise off the ODU campus should have the appropriate peddler's license from the City of Norfolk. The Norfolk Police Department will patrol the outlying areas of campus to make sure vendors have the appropriate license. Any vendors without a license will be written a citation by the Norfolk Police. Only merchandise items bearing the CLC approved hologram emblem on the tag are official ODU licensed items. If an item does not have this hologram, it is not an Old Dominion University authorized item. If interested in becoming an ODU licensed vendor to sell merchandise off campus, please visit ODU.edu/licensing.

RE-ENTRY

Guests may not leave the center and then re-enter.

RESTROOM FACILITIES

All restrooms in the Chartway Arena have diaper-changing stations available and are accessible to persons with disabilities. The Chartway Arena also has family (gender neutral) restrooms in the main concourse and suite level.

SMOKING

The Chartway Arena is a non-smoking facility, except in designated smoking areas. All seating areas are classified as non-smoking. E-cigs are not allowed inside the building. The designated smoking area is located outside the main lobby.

STROLLERS

Strollers are not permitted in the seating sections of the arena. We offer a stroller check service at Guest Services located in the main lobby. The Chartway Arena is not responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged strollers.



Guidelines

NCAA GAME DAY ENVIRONMENT AND FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

NCAA Sportsmanship and Ethical Conduct Best Practices identify reasonable efforts to ensure the fan experience is safe and enjoyable. To this end, proactive measures to encourage positive behavior must be balanced with strict consequences and swift measures to deter and remedy unruly behavior. Policies and media should target two outcomes:

- 1) recognize responsible behavior; and
- 2) communicate the message that inappropriate behavior in violation of NCAA, conference, school, team, or facility rules, endangers or threatens others, or is otherwise detrimental to others will not be tolerated.

NCAA GAME DAY ENVIRONMENT

The NCAA and its member institutions are committed to creating a safe, comfortable and enjoyable game day experience. The NCAA and member institutions pledge to protect a fan's right to:

- Watch the game in a safe, clean and healthy environment.
- Be treated in a courteous, consistent and professional manner.
- Be treated with dignity and respect by other spectators attending the game and those organizing the event.
- Support his or her team, provided the support is in good taste and does not adversely impact the event experience of fellow spectators or negatively impact the game.
- Expect displays of good sportsmanship.

THE NCAA EXPECTS FANS TO:

- Cheer, sing, and otherwise support their team while remaining respectful and courteous to their fellow patrons, referees, opposing team fans and players.
- Enjoy the game experience free from fighting, thrown objects, attempts to enter the playing field, political or inciting messages, and disorderly behavior, including foul, sexist, racial, obscene or abusive language or gestures.
- Comply with requests from athletics facilities staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures.
- Conduct themselves in a lawful manner to avoid incidents in the stadium and in the parking lots.

For any game where alcohol is available, at tailgating or inside the venue, fans who consume alcoholic beverages will do so in a responsible manner. Intervention with an impaired, intoxicated or underage guest will be handled in a prompt and safe manner.

NCAA FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

- The following violations should be identified as actions that may result in sanctions:
- Behavior that is reckless, dangerous, disruptive, or illegal in nature.
- Demonstrating signs of impairment from alcohol or other substances.
- Foul or abusive language or obscene gestures.
- Interference with the progress of the game (including entering the field of play or throwing objects onto the field).
- Failing to follow instructions of stadium personnel or law enforcement officers.
- Verbal or physical harassment of the opposing team's players or fans, field officials, or stadium personnel.

Fans have several options to report their concerns, to include alerting the nearest usher or a member of the game management staff, or sending a text to 757-617-7457 with your seat location and concern during the game. A member of the game management staff will respond to the message immediately.
