

- 366 people have been supported to access training across 22 Local Authority Areas
- 23 Digital Champions have been recruited
- 98% of participants reported an increase in digital confidence
- Increased job outcomes

- Work in partnership with your clients to build your materials
- Provide information in accessible formats
 - Use pictures and videos as much as possible
 - Make use of accessibility features online and assistive tech
- Provide materials in easy read format
- Prepare for clients to work at different speeds
 - Allow clients to go over materials
 - Repetition is key
