

Lancashire Connectivity and Rurality

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- Publically funded intervention since 2015 in about 22% of Lancashire Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) area premises, mainly rural but not exclusively.
- Majority of Lancashire premises addressed by commercial coverage (B4RN/Openreach/Virgin)
- Objective to provide Superfast Broadband (30mbps+) connectivity
- Current Superfast Broadband coverage across
 - Lancashire LEP Area 98.5%
 - Lancashire County 97.3%
 - Lancashire Authorities above 20% rural popn. 95.9%
- Current 100mbps+ coverage
 - Lancashire LEP Area 65.9%
 - Lancashire County 48.16%
 - Lancashire Authorities above 20% rural popn. 30.5%

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- Lancashire Superfast Broadband project due to completed by December 2019.
- Leaves approx. 3% of premises (20,000 ?) without access to 30mbps+ speeds
- Take up in public intervention areas approx. 55%
- Commercial activity ongoing
- Universal Service Obligation 10 mbps
- Future Developments
 - Rural Gigabyte Vouchers £3,500 per SME and £1,500 per domestic premise
 - Outside In creation of 'hubs' to improve rural connectivity
 - Reuse of existing infrastructure
