Advantages

- ✓ Helps to kick-start and make the case for Digital Champion work in a local area
- ✓ Effective and consistent monitoring / activity reporting
- ✓ Specialists in Essential Digital Skills (more than just tech skills!)
- ✓ They are mobile and adaptable, good reach and impact

Challenges

- They cost money!
- They need good training, induction and support
- Specialists in Digital Skills but can't give guidance on specific areas
- Can be hard to recruit candidates with required mixed skillset (people skills & tech skills)
