



Ley Lines and Vortices

Ley lines are currents of energy in the Earth. When two ley lines cross they create a vortex which rises up out of the Earth. These vortices can be linked to each other across a landscape creating the ley line or track.

Locating Ley lines can be done by dowsing for crossing points or vortices and then sensing the connection. Indigenous people understood the connections and used them to site their villages. They saw from mountaintop to mountaintop, from rivers to the sea and knew the connections between the landscapes.

Ancient sacred sites had different uses and values than they do today. We all know about Lourdes and other sites where the Virgin Mary has appeared like the Basilica of the Virgin de Guadalupe in Mexico. These places are now used by the “faithful” for balancing health, resolving pain or conflict. Sacred sites were often gathering places, trading places, spiritual places where the veils were thin and peace could be found with death and dying, giving birth or experiencing the profound transitions and special initiations of a life.

Ley lines are a recent understanding of ancient wisdom and unspoken knowledge housed in the Earth itself. They originated from the archeological theories of the Englishman- Alfred Watkins who published a book called *The Old Straight Track* in 1925. Ley is an old Anglo Saxon word that means “a clearing in the woods.” Watkins thought that points of historical and archeological interest were linked with what he called tracks, or ley lines, acting as a powerful lines of connection between primarily ancient sites.

Watkins shared a revelation of when he was riding his horse in the hills of Blackwadine in 1921. In his book he reported what he called “a flood of ancestral memory” which showed him the connection between sites like standing stones and other ancient stone ruins.



Through the years these ideas were built upon by “foot archeologists” as Watkins called them. Basically folks who have been rambling across the English countryside for the last 100 years and feeling the connections between sacred sites and Earth energies at old Druidic and Celtic sites. This mapping has been done mainly in the British Isles. Today we know that ley lines are global and that we can link manmade and geological sacred sites across the planet.

In the Sacred Earth Anatomy these ley lines are occurring in the Planetary Template or the subtle nervous system of the globe. The center of this is the molten core at the center of the Earth. This is equivalent to the Star Point of the Human Energy Structure. We can work with this anatomy and better understand the power of these single ley lines as they come together in a subtle anatomy system.
