Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

- Appropriate engineering controls** : Use only with adequate ventilation. Conclusion/Summary : Low acute inhalation toxicity. As with exposure to high concentrations of any dust, minimal irritation of the respiratory tract may occur. Pure carbon black, a minor component of this product, has been listed by IARC as a group 2B (possible carcinogen). This classification is based on rat "lung particulate overload" studies performed with airborne particulate. Toner is not listed by IARC, NTP, or OSHA.
