I love the way Edward Burne-Jones caught that sublime moment when a distraught Mary, thinking that he was the gardener before her, gazes in astonishment and amazement when he says to her quietly: ""Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father..." (John 20:17);

But I am neither a poet nor an artist. I simply love and appreciate the work of others. Yet I do have three cameras, and I tend to let them do the talking. And my cameras have to work overtime during this season with all its variety, dazzling colours, amazing wildlife activity. I have taken my cameras all over the world - from Samarkand, to Buenos Aires, from Reykjavik to Alice Springs, on the Trans-Siberian Railway and on Safari in the Kruger National Park. We live on a beautiful planet, full of rich colour, sustained through intricate balances and cycles of nature. In the coming weeks we are going to hear from world leaders as they meet in

Glasgow for the COP26 Conference on Climate Change (COP26=26th annual summit of the UN Conference of the Parties) and we are all hoping that they will work out a way of reducing the damaging impact which humans have made on the climate. Christians are people of hope. It is easy to be downcast when we look around and see what is happening. Yet it is an important part of our faith to believe that one day the whole creation will be renewed and restored. The Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ reminds us that God is in control, and we need to remember this whether or not our world leaders can agree a sensible and realistic way forward.

The same is true of our way forward as a Parish. You will, by now, have heard that Canon Martin has announced his retirement; and also that we will be losing Chris, our children and families pastor very shortly. We wish them the very best as they move on, and we will certainly miss them! But as we look to the future, we need not be downcast - we can be confident that God's work will continue as we PROCLAIM JESUS, CHANGE LIVES and SERVE OUR COMMUNITY. A period of vacancy can be a time of great blessing, encourage-ment, renewal and restoration, and I am looking forward to working with our Wardens, Mike Fixter and Sue Thomas. And already Judith, Sue and Sandra have started developing plans for continuing the excellent foundation that Chris has laid down for our children's work. The challenges ahead of us might seem no less daunting than the world leaders face in Glasgow, but by pulling together and trusting in God I am confident that the next few months can be rich, beautiful and fruitful.

A few weeks ago in church I gave notice of my intention to retire in early 2022, so Emma and I are now looking ahead to a different kind of life in Chichester where we have bought a home. Our last Sunday in Sanderstead will be 23rd January, nearly nine years after the licensing by the Bishop of Croydon on 19 March 2013.

My journey in Anglican mission began forty two years ago when I was ordained Deacon in St Paul's Cathedral by Gerald Ellison, then the Bishop of London. I served as one of two curates at Christ Church Cockfosters (either the end of the Piccadilly Line, or the beginning, depending on your point of view). My training vicar was Rev David Ernest Donald [Don] Churchman; apparently I was the 26th curate to learn ministry 'under the DEDC'. (Yes, it's a feeble joke, I know.)


After serving in the dioceses of London, Europe, Aba (Nigeria), Chelmsford, Ely and Southwark, this part of the journey is now drawing to an end.

Retirement? Well, of course it's not an end to serving the Lord Jesus Christ; that is a joyful commitment for the whole of one's life, and in that sense, as Christians, we never retire. So, perhaps it's not so much 're-tire-ment' as a 're-treading' for the ongoing journey in the service of Jesus.

These years with you all in Sanderstead have been rich and precious, and we shall miss you. For the vacancy / interregnum, Rev Jeremy and the Churchwardens, along with the Church Council, have matters in hand and will guide All Saints in the right path each step of the way.

For the next nearly three months, however, we are still here; so let's continue to give all we have in service of the Lord Jesus as we worship together and shine his light to all around.

Thank you for the Harvest Gifts

Thank you so much for organising the Harvest gifts from All Saints' Church community; we are truly grateful, and all the things we

desperately needed.

They will soon be put to good use as some of the refugees have only the clothes they were wearing when the airlift in Kabul started, or when they arrived from Calais.

We started the Refugee Centre 22 years ago. At the time it was in close proximity to Lunar House where anyone requesting Asylum or Refugee Status had to report, and we used to provide



hot meals and a social area for them to meet others from their own country; they were also given food and clothing.

Covid-19 changed the world as we used to know it with lockdowns and a list of do's and don'ts. We decided we needed to change our way of working, whilst also keeping all volunteers safe. We have changed our method of delivery, food parcels delivered, clothing on request etc.

However since July the need has been greater, with many refugees coming from Afghanistan, Iran, Africa and even North Korea. We now are working with several hotels which the Home Office supply and most get meals provided (not always to their liking) and some are in accommodation that do not supply meals. For clothing, numbers and sizing are collected, and parcels are delivered to mainly Croydon Hotels, but we have had several trips to Napier barracks in Folkstone, Hotels near Heathrow and many others. As a charity we are also working in partnership with Care4Calais who come and help sort donations and do some deliveries. The Salvation Army are working with us, often donating missing sizes of clothing nappies and vice versa.

All this work is done by volunteers who very generously give their time. Our grateful thanks to all at your Church.


