Martín wrítes ...

Resurrection, NOW, because of Jesus.

The Old Testament passage set for Sunday, 2nd April, is Ezekiel's vision of the Valley of Dry Bones – *"Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord!"* The Lord promised the Resurrection (the raising-to-life-from-death) of the people of Israel in exile. As the prophet spoke the word, the Lord sent his Spirit, or breath, to bring new life.

"Then you, my people, will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and bring you up from them. I will put my Spirit in you and you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know that I the Lord have spoken, and I have done it, declares the Lord" (Ezekiel 37:13-14).

Because God has power over death, what was dead was made alive.

So, let's see if we might apply this resurrection hope to one of the questions facing us in All Saints: <u>Can</u> <u>we revive our children's work?</u> The Lord is the God of Resurrection, and therefore we must have hope and not give up.

Margaret Pritchard Houston, from the Diocese of St Albans, has written a very helpful and encouraging article on *Struggling to attract or keep children and their families?* This is available in hard copy or by email from alice@sanderstead-parish.org.uk . She says many churches tell the same story: 'Once upon a time we had loads of children and an active youth group... but now we have hardly anyone under 50'. She says that the context in which we do children's work has changed in the past 30 years, and agrees that attracting children to church, and keeping them, is a struggle. The task can feel overwhelming. Yet it is crucial, not only to the survival of the church, but also because the body of Christ is richer when all ages belong, and because young people matter.

Ms Houston mentions most of the things we are doing at All Saints, and commends them: Children's area; Toddler Groups; 'Family Fun' (though she doesn't call it that). In addition, we are also building relationships with our Uniformed Groups. There is great potential in Toddler Groups, as they attract many who have no previous connection with church. Her article is full of perceptive comments and practical ideas to consider and think about.

Sunday's Gospel reading from John tells how Jesus raised Lazarus from death. The key to Resurrection is to *"believe"*. Jesus wanted his disciples to believe; he challenged Martha to believe that he is the Resurrection and the Life. Before he called Lazarus out of the tomb, he prayed to his Father God that all who saw it would *believe* in him.

Jesus said, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me will live, even though they die. Whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?

We want to bring children and their families to the church and to Jesus. It is not easy! Jesus calls us all to continue to believe in him, and to carry on the work. In some cases, the opposite of believing is not so much doubting, but giving up; running out of energy; stopping trying. The task may seem overwhelming, and almost hopeless; but we have the Lord with us. He brings life from the dead, and nothing is impossible. Will we choose to continue to believe, and carry on?

I warmly commend Ms Houston's article, for you to read and think about. I also express my thanks to all in All Saints who work so hard and with such devotion for children and families in our various activities. May we continue to believe in Jesus, who makes the dead alive, and carry on working to bring children and their families to the church and to him.

Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labour in the Lord is never a waste of effort (1 Corinthians 15:58).

Christian Aid Week is 14-20 May 2017 *Standing with refugees like Nejebar.* Nejebar and her family have fled horrors in Afghanistan, where her husband was threatened with torture and death for being a government worker. But now they've arrived in Greece, all they have is a tent. They have no other protection against wind and rain. There's no school for their five children. And they have no certainty or clear idea of what will happen to them now. They thought they would stay here for 10 days, but it's already been six months and there's no end in sight. Nejebar's husband Noor describes their initial reaction to arriving in the camp in Greece: 'It was like suicide for us. But we took the decision that it is better to die here than to die there from war.' You've helped us be there for refugees since 1945. Thanks to you, Christian Aid has been there for refugees like Nejebar since 1945, providing essential food, shelter

and legal assistance for people far from home. And we still believe in life before death. This Christian Aid Week, 14-20 May, our church is continuing to walk with refugees by collecting from local streets and by a sponsored walk. We're not going to turn our backs on refugees now. Kenya Pastor Patrick who visited All Saints last year wrote about the current drought in Kenya that there has been little or no rain since June; the ground is dried up and most of the water holes are now dry. The villagers on the Masai live from their cattle and goats, but due to the drought their cows have either died or gone dry. They depend on the milk both for food and to sell for the money they need to buy other essentials . The villagers were not getting to church as they were too tired from lack of food. He writes *"Today we gave the food to those who came to church, after we left the pastor says another 70 women with their children came running to the church but the food was finished. People are desperately hungry and people are indeed starving but the government is claiming it is on top of things which is not true".* With the addition of grant aid, we were able to send £400 from All Saints and Patrick would like to thank everyone for their generosity and support. With our gifts he was able to take a hot meal to the church one Sunday and buy maize and rice to feed about 14 families for a week. Please pray for rain and more support for these families. Any donations to help the immediate need can be given at the church.
