Jeremy writes...

Dear friends,

To my mind, Spring is the most wonderful season. Everything around us is beginning to burst into life again.

Bulbs like crocus, daffodil, tulip, which have been buried in the dark, cold underground are waking up. Soon like these crocus they will be flowering. Before long clumps of daffodils will spread their glorious yellows-gold colour.

I'm sure you are familiar with those lines from William Wordsworth (1770-1850)

I wandered lonely as a cloud That floats on high o'er vales and hills, When all at once I saw a crowd, A host, of golden daffodils; Beside the lake, beneath the trees, Fluttering and dancing in the breeze.

Continuous as the stars that shine And twinkle on the milky way, They stretched in never-ending line Along the margin of a bay: Ten thousand saw I at a glance, Tossing their heads in sprightly dance.

Officially the season starts on 20 March but we see and hear all the signs around us. Listen carefully and you'll hear birds returning to their nests or beginning to build them ready to lay eggs in them and bring up their young.

Soon blossom will be out on the trees. The sweet smells of newly open flowers will make their presence known.

In different measures and in different ways, these remind us of the beauty and bounty of our God. At this time of year there is surging, fertile power in the world, as animal and plant life begins to burst out, grow and flourish. I always enjoy those time-lapse films in a garden, when every living thing seems to be coming to life with great rapidity green shoots, stalks, then flowers appearing in a riot of colour and uncontrolled exuberance. Viewed from this perspective, creation can be understood as an act of God shaping, moulding and bringing life and beauty from emptiness and darkness.

Supremely, of course, we see God desiring to working precisely in this way in human lives - shaping, forming, moulding us like potter's clay,

and ultimately imprinting his image and likeness upon us. Yet we know that at the very point when humankind transgressed the bounds set for them, the relationship between God and humanity was fractured, and a relationship of cooperation between nature and humankind was replaced by enmity and struggle.

In Jesus, and in his life, death, resurrection, ascension and glorification we see God's willingness to restore that relationship, to send a new Spirit into our hearts bringing new life, forgiveness, restoration, reconciliation and love.

We often quote John 3:16: "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes on him shall not perish but have eternal life." But it's also worth reminding ourselves of 1 John 3: 16: "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us". And then we are promptly told to be prepared to lay down our lives for one another."

Every Spring, as we witness the world around us bursting into new life, we are reminded that nature is giving her very best for us. This year, let us remember that God's desire for us is so much more than what we may have settled for both as individuals and as a church. In Disney's film The Lion King the young lion cub born to rule the animal kingdom had to be reminded and reassured by his father, who appeared one night in a vision with these words: "Remember who you are. You are more than what you have become."

As I write this I'm conscious that Lent is only just around the



corner. Just as our lives so far this season have been dominated by storms and strong winds, so may we pray for the wind of the Spirit of Jesus to sweep through our lives and our church, blowing away all the dross that we have accumulated over the years so that we may truly reflect the glory of God in our lives and in our church.

Sanderstead News

Last month we marked the retirement of Revd Canon Martin Greenfield, our rector. He and his wife Emma have moved to Chichester after almost 9 years of ministry in Sanderstead. Changes like this are always bittersweet. We will miss them greatly, but are happy for them and wish them a long and happy retirement. I have been ministering alongside Martin as part-time Assistant Priest for 6 1/2 of those years and we have had many happy and joyful times.

Of course, the church doesn't close down when a minister leaves. Together with the wardens, I will be helping the church through this period of "interregnum". Having already retired myself, I have agreed to stay until a new rector is appointed. Far from stagnating during the vacancy, we have lots of plans, and as we move out of COVID restrictions, we plan to resume our activities in the local community. Our vision is "Proclaiming Jesus, Changing Lives and Serving our Community".

It is worth reminding everyone that All Saints is not only God's church but it is also *your* church. The building and its surroundings are wonderful, historic and very special. Our regular congregations shoulder the burden (both financial and physical) of maintaining them - it may surprise you to know that we don't get any external financial support the upkeep of either the historic buildings or the churchyards. Moving forward, I hope we can explore ways of sharing this burden with the local community because we are increasingly hard-pressed and it would be tragic to see them falling to disrepair.

In just 8 years time, we will be celebrating our 800th anniversary. It's amazing to think that local people have been worshipping and praying in our buildings for all that time. I'm beginning to think about how we might celebrate by leaving a lasting memorial for generations to come. At the moment, I'm thinking of a bright, colourful stained glass window to celebrate 800 years of faith and worship. If you've ever seen the spectacular stained glass windows recently installed in places like Salisbury Cathedral, you'll know the kind of thing I mean. It would be wonderful to see the whole Sanderstead community coming together to support a project like that - and we will need to get it underway sooner rather than later because a huge project like this takes a great deal of planning before anything can get underway. We shall be putting out some "feelers" in the new few weeks to gauge how much interest there

Update on our Covid Policies



As we are all aware the Government has removed most legal requirements relating to Covid and has moved instead to a system of guidance and self regulation.

What does that mean for us at All Saints?

- We will continue to follow the guidance issued by The Church of England and in particular the Diocesan Coronavirus task force.
- 2. We will continue with our approach of placing the health and safety of congregation as the highest priority when we meet together. This will mean that other important matters will take a lower priority. An example of this is that we will continue the practice of increasing ventilation in the church when we meet, this is proven to decrease the risk of the virus being airborne. This will mean it will be a bit colder in church, but that then takes a lower degree of importance.
- We encourage the use of face masks. The guidance advises that face masks provide a benefit to protect other people from the possible transmission of the virus if you or an asymptomatic person attends our meetings.
- We will continue with the choir in the area behind the font if they are greater than 6 in number. If they are 6 or less they can sing from the choir stalls.
- We will retain St Catherine's aisle area for those who require more space and who feel vulnerable.

We will review these arrangements again prior to Easter as the weather warms up.

ALL SAINTS CHURCH - AV PROJECT 2021

Thank you all for your patience over the last 5 months whilst our upgrades to the church audio, visual and live streaming have been taking place; and many thanks also to those on the Techy Team who have so willingly coped with all the changes to operating the techy desk that have been thrown at them.

I thought that you might like to know that the Family Service on Sunday 27th February 2022 was the first service where the full upgraded system was used, both for 'in church' and for 'live streaming': having had to wait several months for the new audio mixer to be delivered – it's not just cars that have been delayed due to the 'chip-set' shortage, it seems!

- **Q.** So what is it that has been changed?
- A. In simple terms; we have upgraded our main camera and made it easier to operate; we have added a second camera that we can zoom remotely and provides better pictures than our hand held camera; we have simplified the way we live stream and record services; we have properly integrated the sound and the visual systems to provide better quality; we have changed our audio mixer so that from anywhere in the church we can adjust the volume from a mic, or a song video, during the service so that it sounds good both in the church, and on the live stream.
- **Q.** So why doesn't it always look and sound perfect?
- A. The system can be operated by just switching it on, but it will always be better if we can man the Techy Desk and make adjustments to 'fine tune' the sound and visual output. However, none of our Techy Team are sound engineers by profession, so we are all still 'learning the ropes' and 'learning by our mistakes'. On the whole it goes quite well and you can already see and hear the improvement; and they say, 'practice makes perfect'!
- **Q.** Why is the Hearing Loop quiet when the mics are being used?
- **A.** Good question! We noticed that on Sunday and are looking into it. I anticipate a simple fix, which currently and temporarily eludes us, will very soon be found to correct this. With the best will in the world there will always be teething problems to iron out; I regret at present this is one of those.

- **Q.** Will I appear on the Live Stream of services?
- A. We use our best endeavours to minimise close-up shots, unless you are a reader, intercessor, leading the service, choir member, or leading an activity. At Eucharist Services, we attempt to show the choir whilst they sing. At the moment, whilst they sing from the seats behind the font, it is impossible to show them without including some people in the row immediately in front of the font also appearing. If that is a problem for you, then probably best to avoid that particular row of seats or stay seated during hymns - if that's your favouring row of seats to use.

Q. How do I view the Service as a Live Stream if I can't make it to church one week?

A. The You Tube link is always provided on the church website for the Live Stream of the next coming Sunday service. Alternatively, you will find it on our You Tube Channel.

Q. On You Tube, what does it mean when it asks if I want to subscribe to a Channel?

- A. It does not cost you anything to subscribe to a channel; our channel is called `Sanderstead Parish Channel' where you can find all of our recorded and Live Streamed services available to view. If you subscribe to our Channel it not only makes it easier for you to find, but it also lets us know how many of you are watching our Live Streamed Services, and so gives us some feedback.
- **Q.** What is the best device to watch the Live Streamed Services on?
- A. Without a doubt, if you own a Smart TV and have given it access to your broadband at home; find the You Tube App and search for the Sanderstead Parish Channel, and watch from there. You will gain a much better appreciation of the upgraded quality of our pictures and sound if you can watch on your TV.

I am sure you will have other questions that I haven't covered but I cannot cover everything here. Catch me or one of the Techy Team though and we will do our best to provide answers.

The project being supported is Glass Door, which coordinates the UK's largest network of open-access services for the homeless.

Week 4 – Woolwich

The projects being supported are Robes, a charity which helps homeless people in two south London boroughs find their way to a better quality of life, and the Greenwich Winter Night Shelter, a local charity which provides warmth, emergency accommodation and support for the homeless in Greenwich during the winter months.
