Philippians 2:1-11 (Good News Translation)

Christ's Humility and Greatness

2 Your life in Christ makes you strong, and his love comforts you. You have fellowship with the Spirit, and you have kindness and compassion for one another. ² I urge you, then, to make me completely happy by having the same thoughts, sharing the same love, and being one in soul and mind. ³ Don't do anything from selfish ambition or from a cheap desire to boast, but be humble toward one another, always considering others better than yourselves. ⁴ And look out for one another's interests, not just for your own. ⁵ The attitude you should have is the one that Christ Jesus had:

⁶ He always had the nature of God, but he did not think that by force he should try to remain equal with God.

⁷ Instead of this, of his own free will he gave up all he had and took the nature of a servant. He became like a human being and appeared in human likeness.

⁸ He was humble and walked the path of obedience all the way to death— his death on the cross.

⁹ For this reason God raised him to the highest place above and gave him the name that is greater than any other name.

¹⁰ And so, in honour of the name of Jesus all beings in heaven, on earth, and in the world below will fall on their knees, ¹¹ and all will openly proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 14:27-33 (Good News translation)

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁷ Those who do not carry their own cross and come after me cannot be my disciples. ²⁸ If one of you is planning to build a tower, you sit down first and figure out what it will cost, to see if you have enough money to finish the job. ²⁹ If you don't, you will not be able to finish the tower after laying the foundation; and all who see what happened will make fun of you. ³⁰ You began to build but can't finish the job!' they will say. ³¹ If a king goes out with ten thousand men to fight another king who comes against him with twenty thousand men, he will sit down first and decide if he is strong enough to face that other king. ³² If he isn't, he will send messengers to meet the other king to ask for terms of peace while he is still a long way off. ³³ In the same way," concluded Jesus, "none of you can be my disciple unless you give up everything you have.

Father, on the night before he died, Jesus shared a meal with his friends. He took the bread, and thanked you. He broke it, and gave it to them, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.

After the meal, Jesus took the cup of wine. He thanked you, and gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you. This is my blood, the new promise of God's unfailing love. Do this to remember me.

Father, as we bring this bread and wine, and remember his death and resurrection, send your Holy Spirit, that we who share these gifts may be fed by Christ's body and his blood. **Amen.**

Pour your Spirit on us that we may love one another, work for the healing of the earth, and share the good news of Jesus, as we wait for his coming in glory. Amen.

If you would like both bread and wine please say "both" and the Priest will then dip your wafer in the wine and place it in your hands. When receiving communion, it is customary to say 'Amen 'as you receive the elements.

If you do not wish to receive Communion, please come up to the altar and bow your head for a prayer of blessing.

After a time of Quiet, we say together:

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen. Any notices and announcements.

May Christ give you grace to grow in holiness, to deny yourselves, to take up your cross daily and follow him; And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen**.
