URGENT DESPERATE PLEA

Two Ukrainians, Tanya aged 54 and Alex, her 17 year old son, have been in the UK since May under the Government 'Homes for Ukraine Scheme' but owing to a change of circumstances, their Sponsor is no longer able to offer accommodation, thus in one month's time they will be homeless.
