## **URGENT DESPERATE PLEA**

Two Ukrainians, Tanya aged 54 and Alex, her 17 year old son, have been in the UK since May under the Government 'Homes for Ukraine Scheme' but owing to a change of circumstances, their Sponsor is no longer able to offer accommodation, thus in one month's time they will be homeless. They have approached the Council but so far they are unable to help. Alex is at College at John Ruskin in Selsdon, and he works in the Hilton Hotel at the weekends, so they are desperately seeking a place to stay in the area. They both speak quite good English. The Government is still offering paying the Sponsor a 'Thank You' gift of £350.00 a month for accommodation for a further six months.
