REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Today is Remembrance Sunday, 2022, a year in which we have again commemorated some important anniversaries - including the 40th anniversary of the Falklands Conflict which began in April 1982. It is also the 75th anniversary of the beginning of the Cold War. The uncomfortable alliance between governments of East and West working together against the common enemy of Nazism had served its purpose, and only two years after the Great War ideological battles, barriers and proxy wars began. This year we have witnessed the worst kind of turbulence, violence and a return to Cold War tactics with horrific consequences for the people of Ukraine.

Today we remember and honour those who have sacrificed themselves to secure and protect our freedom. At the end of the service, we will gather at the War Memorial in the Churchyard where wreaths will be laid and poppy crosses placed in the ground, and we will have opportunity to pay our respects to all who have fallen in battle.

The War Memorial bears the names of some of those who died fighting for their country, and declares: "All ye who pass by, remember with gratitude the men of this place who went forth for God and Country. The names of those who returned not again are hereon described. RIP"

As the Austrian writer, Karl Kraus, once observed: "War: first, one hopes to win; then one expects the enemy to lose; then, one is satisfied that he, too, is suffering; in the end, one is surprised that everyone has lost."
