THE BISHOP OF SOUTHWARK'S LENT CALL 2023

"How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?" Psalm 137:4



In 2023, The Bishop of Southwark's Lent Call is raising funds for projects that work to improve mental health and well-being.

Week 2: The Croydon Episcopal Area

Whyteleafe Community Hub collects and donates food, toys & clothes to local people. Their foodbank feeds more than 350 people each month. They offer a befriending service for the elderly, vulnerable and lonely, a Gardening Club & support for Ukrainian refugees.

Ment4 is based in Croydon and has a team of mentors to get alongside troubled young people who have fallen into hopelessness, violence and crime.

Week 3: The Kingston Episcopal Area

The Fircroft Trust works to support adults who have mental health challenges or learning disabilities who live in the local community of Kingston.

The Man Shed is a workshop style environment for 15 men either with mental health challenges or who are at risk of developing mental health issues due to social isolation. It provides a safe environment where participants can make friends, feel valued and talk to each other. More than one in ten men are lonely but would not admit it. Suicide is the most common cause of death for men under 49 years in England and Wales and men are three times as likely to commit suicide than women. The Man Shed is proving very popular and there is now a waiting list.

The AT Beacon Project provides health and well-being services to underserved communities. By working with local faith and community leaders, it runs well-being hubs, community events.
