Many thousands of people are displaced and in need of the most basic help and care. This Diocese is an important provider of medical care, as well as helping to provide hospice and rehabilitation centres. There are also schools and residential homes for those who have lost families. The need is great and is ever increasing.

Continue to pray for peace with justice for all people of Gaza, the West Bank and Israel. As we think of all those who have been affected by this terrible war and its consequences – what gift could you offer? Even if the amount is small, money given will help the Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East to do as much as it can to help those who have so little to feel they are cared for and not forgotten.
