Friday 28 March MEN'S GROUP – Visit to Croydon Astronomical Society Kenley Observatory, 7.30pm

We have a tour of CAS Kenley Observatory arranged for Friday 28th March at 7:30 pm at a cost of only £3 per person. Numbers will be limited due to the size of the Observatory, and I will take reservations on a first come first served basis. Please let me know asap if you would like to join this visit and if you can offer lifts or if you would like a lift.

Total visit likely to be in the order of 1.5 hours and will comprise a presentation on the sort of observations CAS Kenley have made and if the sky is clear that night a look through their telescope. Please note parking is in on the road in Hayes Lane near RAF Kenley Tribute with a short walk up Waterhouse Lane and a track to the observatory and clubhouse. Also note there are eight narrow steps leading up to the observatory viewing area and two steep steps in the clubhouse. *Please let Tony Robinson know if you would like to join us for this event.*

Forms must be returned to the Parish Office no later than 30 March 2025 and are available in Church, or from the Parish Office, or from the Electoral Roll Officer. Your timely co-operation in submitting the forms would be greatly appreciated. The new Electoral Roll will be published and take effect on 10 April 2025.
