Together with churches around the world, we set aside the ten days between Ascension and Pentecost for particular prayer to God as in the Lord's Prayer:

Only last week, I heard and reported to the Sanderstead Parochial Church Council that, with the creation of a new Sanderstead Team, the Bishop of Croydon will carry out a Review of the current Team set-up to provide the best structure for God's mission in this area. An Archdeacon from a neighbouring diocese will be invited to come and carry out the Review and report back to the Bishop with their findings and firm recommendations. No date for this Review has yet been given, though I hope it will ASAP.


The girls keep arriving to find a safe haven from forced marriage, wanting only to continue their education, so the home is full and they are considering building another dormitory. The home has had their first graduate, Josephine, who recently qualified as a lawyer. Her father and village who previously scorned her and beat her mother for allowing her to run away, now consider Josephine a trophy and are celebrating her success, which was featured on national TV.

Gerard Brooks (Charlotte's husband) put on a wonderful concert and raised nearly £1000. Patrick had wanted to come to UK to raise fund to buy cows but was refused a visa. But unexpectedly the Kenyan Government has just donated 10 cows to him. So now he will have funds to build a cowshed. Praise God!

Update on Sugandh, New Delhi



The Annual Report for Sugandh is now available at the back of All Saints Church, please help yourself to a copy. As in previous years there are wonderful accounts of the ways that lives have been changed through the work of this small charity in New Delhi, which All Saints supports.

Sugandh's work is based in two communities: one is a large slum which is the home and workplace for "rag-pickers", families who seek out a livelihood from collecting and recycling rubbish. The second is a more established community of modest brick built homes, known as a resettlement area. In both these marginalised communities, the focus of Sugandh's work is:

- women's Self-Help Groups
- holistic child development
- vocational training
- advocacy to access government service provision.

One of Sugandh's many successes is its support, delivered through tuition classes, to help children stay in their local schools. Sugandh also has a well respected track record of helping women help themselves through their self help groups. You can read more about what the women have done through this in the Report.

All the money raised in the UK for Sugandh is sent via South Asian Concern and a few copies of their Spring 2018 newsletter, Concern, are also at the back of the church. The article on "Training Leaders for the emerging churches in North India" is well worth a read. In the last 10 years, over a million people have turned to Christ. This article explains how new Christians are being discipled and given the skills to teach the Bible, preach effectively and be church leaders in a village context.



Sanderstead Bible Week – The Word of God, Fresh for Today 13-17 August 2018

I was really pleased by last year's 2017 Bible Week, not only because the speakers were so encouraging and helpful, but also because of the comments I received on the feedback forms. For example, "Enjoyable and helpful. Each day I came away with something new to think about... I was encouraged to look at the Psalms in a new light... I feel very pleased to have attended. A splendid idea!.. I looked forward to attending each day... All of the speakers were excellent"

Bible Week this year, 2018, will run from Monday 13th to Friday 17th August, in All Saints Church with meetings at 3pm and 8pm. The aim is still the same: to help us go deeper into our faith in Jesus Christ, and to enjoy God more. Bible Week is for anyone who wants to learn to follow Jesus, read the Bible with understanding, and gain spiritual food from it. As it says in 1 Peter 2:2, 'Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation'.

The speaker's programme is close to being sorted. I am delighted that Rev Dr Simon Stocks is once again coming to speak at our 3pm meetings. He'll pick a theme from the Old Testament, maybe on the biblical vision of life devoted to the one true God, or looking at some of the 'problematic' issues, e.g. creation and evolution; violence and holy war; sacrifice; slavery and patriarchy. We wait with interest to see what Simon decides on!

The theme for the 8pm meetings will be 'The Names of Jesus'. Among the speakers are: Richard Moy, vicar of Christ Church Chiswick. I met Richard earlier this year and was so encouraged and impressed by his warm love of the Lord and the bible. His topic will be 'The Good Shepherd'. It will be biblical and also practical. Then there's Tom Thompson, senior minister at Croydon Vineyard church. Tom and Lesley his wife started the church a few years ago from scratch; now they have well over 200. Tom's preaching is clear, incisive and honours the Lord. I hope that your appetite is suitably whetted!


There is no advance booking, and no charge, though we do ask for donations to cover expenses and a gift for the speakers. But please do put the dates in your diary... now!






