A few weeks ago I finally got to 'open' my Christmas present from Byron – no he didn't misplace it, or hide it – I just had to wait for the nicer summer weather to experience it, as together we enjoyed visiting Eagle Heights Wildlife Foundation for an Owl Experience. We got to handle and fly three different species of owl, a Little owl, a Barn owl and an Eagle

owl. It was an amazing hour; the personalities of the owls were quite different. The Little owl was the mature and sensible one, the Barn owl was the cheeky independent one and the Eagle owl was the baby scared of most things (including butterflies) but not people. It was very clear to us how much they were loved and cared for by the staff.

Then just a couple of weeks ago St Edmund's held a Pet Service where people gathered with their pets or photos of their pets to give thanks for them and indeed all of creation. You can read more on page 4.

I've always loved animals and enjoy little better than being around them or being able to spend time taking in wonderful views of rolling countryside or ocean scenes. One of the new places (for us) that we've discovered is Devil's Dyke. Walking some of the trails just before dusk is an amazing sight and quite unspoiled by human intervention. Unfortunately though as we sat near the car park at the end of the day there was clear evidence that people had been around – discarded water bottles, food wrappers etc.

Similarly when we visit Brighton by the end of the day the bins are overflowing and the beach is covered by all manner of rubbish, which is often being picked over by the seagulls and other birds. We hear so much about the rubbish and plastic in our seas and the awful effect it is having on our sea creatures, fish and birds. It may sound like a distant problem when we are told of plastics washing up on an uninhabited Pacific Island but you only have to see photos of turtles ensnared in plastic to realise it should be a concern for us all.

I am aware that many here in Sanderstead are concerned about our environment and I'm sure that we all do our best to recycle whenever possible and use our "bags for life" but perhaps we can take some extra time as we enjoy our beautiful summer weather to reconsider our choices when it comes to caring for God's creation. For as Christians we are called to be stewards of God's creation, to care for all that he has made.

Biblical Wisdom for an Anxious World




Among the many causes of anxiety in today's world are global concerns to do with social and economic inequality, the importance of sustainable development, and climate change.

These raise human - that is moral and spiritual - questions about who we are, our destiny, how we can be helped to flourish, and what we hope for.

Hope Rediscovered is about being re-oriented in the face of such challenges. Bishop David Atkinson, who has an abiding interest in Christian ethics, pastoral theology and science, has put some key questions to the Gospel of John - a text which says much about human flourishing, and which draws on the Wisdom themes of the Hebrew Bible, about understanding our place in creation, and about practical living.

Like his followers, Jesus was beset with conflicts within 'the world'. The first century Christian community, to which the Gospel was addressed, discovered how to live hopefully in the way of Wisdom, energised by God's Spirit. The focus of this timely book is deep, practical wisdom for a troubled world.



Bishop David Atkinson undertook research in organic chemistry before being ordained. He served as Fellow and Chaplain of Corpus Christi College, Oxford. He was a Canon of Southwark Cathedral and Archdeacon of Lewisham before becoming Bishop of Thetford in 2001. He retired in 2009.

Pets show the power of Love

Dogs, cats, a goldfish (doing circuits in it's tank on the altar), Kiwi and even a Gorilla from Zimbabwe were celebrated and blessed at St Edmund's Pet Service on Sunday 10th June. Pets and their loving owners from Riddlesdown, Reigate and congregation members from the Parish gathered to celebrate ***"every living and moving thing"***.



The service is a key part of St Edmund's and St Antony's joint Mission Action Plan aimed at drawing new people into Church and building awareness of St Edmund's critical role at the centre of the community of Riddlesdown.

It succeeded on both counts since promoting the service gave the opportunity to start conversations with people in the local community about the service, St Edmund's as a local resource and faith and it drew new faces into Church. Not all were completely new though. One teenager looked around the Church in some awe saying "I realise I haven't been in here since I attended Stepping Stones" (a Church-run children's group).

Owners young and old happily joined in the service including a stirring rendition of and adapted old favourite "Old Man Noah had an Ark Ee I ee I O" (Copyright S Atkinson-Jones!) and readily talked about their pets (present and past) and why they were so important to them. These stories including how the love of a pet can strengthen personal well-being were heart-warming. Each owner asked for their pet to be individually blessed by Susan.

After the service everyone stayed for refreshments (clear separation was maintained between the tea and cake and the dog biscuits and cat treats) and chatted.

It was a bit of a leap of faith to try a Pet Service for the first time in Riddlesdown but it was clear, residents of all faiths and none thought it a good thing to do and for those that attended it was a great deal of fun.

The Bishop of Croydon's Review of the Sanderstead Team

An Archdeacon from a neighbouring diocese will be tasked with carrying out the review, and reporting to the Bishop whatever changes he/she recommends.

Once the recommendations of the Review are implemented, the churches will be better placed to think through and live out their Mission Action Plans.

As I write this, no date has been set for the Review. However, Rev Jay Colwill, the Diocese of Southwark Missioner, will be preaching at our Sunday services on 2nd September, and I hope he will help us to see and embrace the mission that God sets before us here.



are a team of trained Christian volunteers (18+) from Croydon churches who care about our community and want to bring the love of Jesus to our streets.


Street Pastors

GDPR Update

Like hundreds of other institutions we are slowly coming to terms with the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) which came into force on 25th May. A number of actions have been taken by various groups in the Parish including amongst other things:

- * Completion of consent forms by around 90 members of the congregation at All Saints
- * Reviewing physical security in the Parish Office
- * The Communications Group are looking at the data we would like to have available and suitable software packages to process it
- * The privacy policy on the web-site has been updated

The more we go into this topic however, the more different implications we uncover, from hall bookings to car park cameras and from gift aid forms to DBS checks, not to mention coffee rotas! Some of these require no action, some require a simple process to be invoked and others will require a change in the way we handle the data.

We have therefore asked Mike Fixter and Dick Hibberd, working with Martin, to pull all this work together and they will be working through a GDPR Action Plan Checklist provided by the Diocesan solicitors in the coming weeks. This will involve meeting with a number of key people within All Saints who hold or process data and this is already in train. If any changes are required to the way we treat our data or use e-mails for example we shall let you know in due course.

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Mike or Dick via the Parish Office and be guided by them rather than making your own efforts to ensure that we comply with GDPR.

Update from the DCC

1. Our Church Architect, Tim Gough RIBA of Austin Winkley & Associates conducted a Quinquennial Inspection on 6th June 2018 (actually 7-years since the previous one in 2011). The report has been issued to the Churchwardens, and can be obtained by email on request from churchwarden@sanderstead-parish.org.uk.

2. The updated Faculty submission relating to the acoustic screen which is proposed to be installed in All Saints' Church Tower (behind the organ loft) to reduce the noise emissions will be considered at the Diocesan Advisory Committee meeting to be held on 10th July 2018. If matters proceed according to timetable it is hoped that Faculty process will be completed during August and the screen installed during September 2018. During the interim period the telecommunications equipment is being shut-down by arrangement for Weddings, some funerals and for the August Bible Week.

MOTHERS' UNION

Not Just Tea and Chat



You may be forgiven for thinking that the Mothers' Union (MU) is a group of women who make tea and chat. It is true that we are often asked to do this but we are members because we want to put God's love into action. We also have a strong relationship with each other, supporting each other and others in Sanderstead Parish.

We have 30 members here in Sanderstead, who are part of a worldwide network of over 4,000,000 members in 83 different countries. Founded in 1876 by Mary Sumner the MU has become the largest lay-led Christian organisation in the world. From the beginning it recognised that strong relationships and the role of family, however defined, are crucial in building healthy communities. The way we operate today is very different from the 19th century but our vision today is still of a world where God's love is shown through loving, respectful and flourishing relationships.

In the local branch in Sanderstead, we support, by our membership, life changing programmes around the world, for example, a literacy programme in 3 African countries, local community programmes in rural parts of Uganda, Parenting training worldwide and in the UK, and more.

In our own Southwark Diocese we have an "Away from it All" Scheme helping people experiencing stress in their family life to have a break together to which our Sanderstead branch has contributed. A typical holiday was Amit and Chloe with their 2 children and grandmother who hadn't had a break for five years. Chloe suffers from anxiety and depression and their son from ADHD and ODD, after bad damage to their home from mould. So this holiday meant a great deal to the family.

Reaching out to the local community, our branch supplies sensory bands, to date 150 to the Dementia ward at Croydon University hospital and many stitched holding crosses to the chaplaincy. In our own congregation we have been able to give prayer shawls to anyone who is suffering from long term sickness and we participate in the many activities of our own church. Ten members will be assisting the Children's holiday programme this Summer and members bake for Coffee Pot.

Most importantly we pray together. As our MU Chaplain Bishop Andrew Proud has said "We are united in prayer - networked together and woven into a beautiful and diverse tapestry of very varied contexts, churches, cultures, needs and gifts. So may our prayer change us - change our Church - and transform this world we are commissioned to serve."

Anyone is welcome to join in our monthly social programme on the second Monday evening of each month in church. We would love to see you. In September Elaine Leck will be our speaker "Listening to God, serving His people, receiving His peace." and in October Peter Hall of the Croydon Refugee Centre will be with us.



13-17 August at All Saints Church

I am looking forward to another successful Bible Week, to build on what was achieved in 2017. Last year's feedback included, "Enjoyable and helpful. Each day I came away with something new to think about... I was encouraged to look at the Psalms in a new light... I feel very pleased to have attended. A splendid idea!"

Once again, Rev Dr Simon Stocks will speak each afternoon at 3pm. Here's what he says about the afternoon Bible readings:

'The Lord is One' : Knowing the one true God *"Throughout the Bible we read about the supremacy and uniqueness of the Lord God of Israel. Other gods make appearances in the story, but usually only in contrast to the true God. But what exactly is the problem with other gods? And what are 'idols'? Simon Stocks will lead us through a grand tour of the Bible, helping us get to know the Lord God much better. We will explore the nature of faith and of worship, as we make contrasts with idolatry. We will gain fresh insight into the extraordinary nature of God reaching out to us in Jesus Christ. And we will arrive at some surprising conclusions about how we talk about God, the way we live and what happens in worship."*

Other speakers will be Tom Thompson of Croydon Vineyard, a church that has grown within a few years from nothing to well over 200. He is skilled in making the words of the bible come alive, and his topic is **'Jesus, son of Joseph'**. Rev Richard Moy, vicar of Christ Church Chiswick, is also coming to speak, on **'Jesus, the good shepherd'**. I'm very pleased too that my friend at Sanderstead Evangelical Church, Pastor Steve Ridgeway, will also come to speak (topic yet to be given). I also will speak one evening on **'Jesus, the bread of life'**.

I am confident that by explaining and applying what the bible teaches about Jesus to our lives, we shall be helped to grow in our understanding and experience of the Lord. The intention is that everything will be encouraging and practical. There is no advance booking, and no charge, though we do ask for donations to cover expenses and a gift for the speakers. Please do put the dates in your diary now.





ADVENTure 2018!

HAPPY CHRISTMAS!

A strange greeting I hear you say, but as of July 1st there are only 177 days left until Christmas 2018. Why is this important for you to know in the middle of summer? Because we are pleased to be able to announce that once again ADVENTure will be taking place in Sanderstead. Anne and I have volunteered to lead and co-ordinate the event, but we will not be able to do it on our own and will need your help and support.

ADVENTure 2018 will run from Saturday 1st December until Monday 24th December. We are aiming to have an ADVENTure event every day between 6.00pm and 7.00pm at various locations around the Parish.

For those new to the church or in case you have forgotten, ADVENTure is a series of displays, usually held in the garage of a member of the congregation, or in other community spaces as they are offered. The display is based upon a theme, pointing to the Christmas message and can be accompanied by music, food and drink. It is an event that encourages us to talk to our neighbours and friends and seek to meet with them regularly on the Christmas ADVENTure. This year the theme will be “The ADVENTure Ark” and every night a different animal will be used to star in the displays.

The strapline we want to use is ***“There’s room for everyone in the ADVENTure Ark!”*** and we would very much welcome as many people as possible taking part.

We will certainly want:-

- Offers of garages/locations for the 24 days – even if you would like to only host an event we will be able to get a team to help run the event in your garage. This worked well for Sheila Lovell for the first two years ADVENTure ran.
- Groups to volunteer to run/host an ADVENTure evening. This can be home groups, Coffee Pot, Family Fun, choir, etc.
- Offers of help to assist others during ADVENTure. This could be help in logistics – setting up the display, helping with refreshments, general stewarding/talking to people, etc.
- People to pray for the event.



More information will be announced in August and sign-up sheets will go up in the church. Anne will be running some training days for those wanting to take part when the details of ADVENTure 2018 will be finalised. These dates are provisionally set as Saturday 29th September and Saturday 27th October at 10.00 am after the monthly prayer meeting and also on Tuesday 16th October at 7.00pm.
