### 1) Using your printer

Re-cycle  ✓	Put the used sheet in the paper recycling	You're good	Better than sending it to landfill
Re-use	If the second side is blank, turn it over and pop it in your printer again, or use it when the grand kids want to draw	You're very good © ©	Great! You just cut your usage by 50%
Don't use ✓ ✓ ✓	Don't print it at all. Look at it on your screen, and email it if you need to show it to someone else.	You're super duper good!	Congratulations! You just cut your usage by 100% That tree can stay in the forest!

### Did you know...?

In the UK alone, we use about 10 million tonnes of paper and cardboard each year.

Each sheet of paper consumes 5 litres of water in its production.

The pulp and paper industry accounts for **over a third** of world timber use.

The UN FAO estimates that 10 million hectares of forest are cut down each year.

In the last 10,000 years, we have cut down one third of the world's forests.

But the really scary bit is that the first half of what we've used lasted us 9,900 years...

We've gobbled the other half up in just the last 100 years alone! Apage 2 of 4
