**Green Team Tip of the Week** to help you be even better stewards of God's lovely creation (and probably save you money too!).

### **Tip 10**

**When washing up, don't run the hot tap for rinsing (in fact, if you don't over-dose the water with detergent, wasteful in itself, then the minuscule amount of washing up liquid left on dishes doesn't need rinsing) but if you MUST, then at least use COLD water.**

**The nerdy research bit:** A sensible dose of 2-3 cm<sup>3</sup> (ml) in 5 to 10 litres of water gives a solution which is 0.03% soap. Approximately 98% of that drains off, meaning that you might ingest about 0.0002g of soap when you next use the plate, which is less than 1/5,000 of the amount you would need before "any noticeable physiological effect" according to my research.

If you really are paranoid about the health effects of ingesting 0.0002g of soap... just bear in mind that alcohol is a known neuro-toxin, lethal at just 7g per Kg of body... and we seem to manage that risk quite well, cheers! ☺
