Green Team Tip of the Week to help you be even better stewards of God's lovely creation (and probably save you money too!).



Tip 11 – LIGHT BULBS



If you haven't already, switch to LED light bulbs everywhere; they use up to 80% less energy than traditional bulbs and should last longer.

Don't feel like you have to replace every bulb at once, though—.

Just swap them out one by one as the old ones flicker.

The exception to that (i.e. need to be changed NOW) is floodlights, especially security ones - they can be as much as 500W, FIFTY times more electricity than an LED equivalent. Whilst you CAN change out the bulb, it's often barely any more expensive to change out the whole lamp. Again, your Friendly Neighbourhood Nerd, aka Marky Sparky, can help you here 😊

Finally, remember, even the combined might of All Saints and St Anthony's can't save the planet alone, so SPREAD THE WORD!
