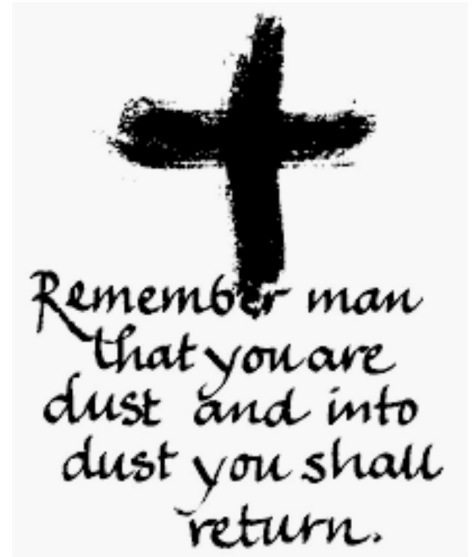

Martin writes ...

“You are dust and to dust you shall return”

Can life begin... when we're getting older?

Something happens around the time we reach our “middle years” – we become aware that we're getting older! Our bodies twinge in ways we'd not noticed before; muscles ache in places where we didn't know we had places. If we are unwise enough to look at ourselves in the mirror for more than a few seconds, we can no longer pretend to be young and perfect! Mentally too we find we are not as sharp as we used to be. We can't remember names, places or facts so well. Can life begin at 50? Isn't that about the time we realise how mortal we are?

Yet researchers have found that, for many in their 50s, levels of stress, worry and anger drop, while happiness and enjoyment rise. One reason for this may be the fact that, by the age of 50, we've come face to face with tragedy and failure. In our youth, we do all we can to avoid them. Yet the years go by and we make mistakes; things in life go painfully wrong. Hopefully, we learn to accept tragedy and failure, and realise that a perfect life is unattainable.

St Paul spent many years seeking perfection but, by the mercy of God, he came to be glad even about his weaknesses and hardships. He wrote, *'The Lord said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness". Therefore, I boast about my weaknesses for Christ's sake... When I am weak, then I am strong'*. (2 Corinthians 12:9-10). In fact, the Bible is always realistic about failure. Abraham was a great, brave believer in God – but not always; he lied about his marriage to Sarah. Moses was an extraordinarily gifted leader, but first he had to make an enormous mistake: his murder of an

Egyptian. He did not always trust the Lord. David was a poet, warrior and king, but his life also involved sexual sin and family break-up. Even Jesus, whose words and whole life were always pleasing to God, ended his life in pain, rejection and apparent failure.

The point is, God does not expect us to be perfect. Putting it the other way round, God does expect us to be sinners! One definition of 'sin' in the bible is 'failing to be perfect'. We need to accept this, otherwise we will never come to know and experience the love of God. God knows that we are weak and frail; we should know it too. Jesus was known as someone who welcomed and befriended sinners. He was clearly happier spending time with weak 'sinners' than those who thought they were righteous. St Paul wrote, *"God shows his love for us in this; while we were sinners, Christ died for us"* (Romans 5:8). Psalm 103:14 says, *"The Lord has compassion on those who worship him; he knows how we are formed; he remembers that we are dust"*.

This is wonderful news; that God loves us as we are, with all our imperfections.

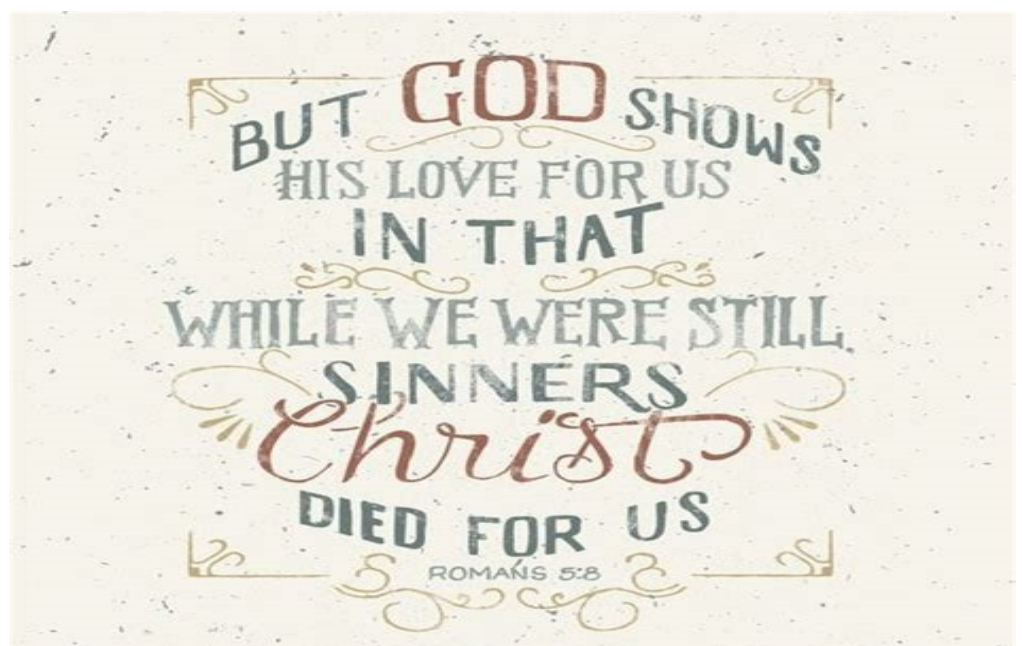
If you have not yet come to understand that God loves us all as tragic, sinful failures, I do hope you experience his wonderful love very soon. And you don't have to wait till you're fifty!

At our 6th March Ash Wednesday services, at 10am & 8pm, you may if you wish receive a mark of ash on your forehead, with the words, *"You are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and follow Christ"*. To be reminded of our mortality can open us to the joy of following Jesus.

All Saints

Annual General Meeting (AGM) / Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

Our All Saints AGM is scheduled for **Sunday 7th April** and will be followed three weeks later on **Sunday 28th April** by the APCM. Formal notices will be posted on the Church notice boards in due course and the agenda and papers for the All Saints AGM will be available from Sunday 24th March.

There will be 2 vacancies on the DCC and 3 vacancies on the PCC to be filled at the AGM and Churchwardens get elected every year. The relevant application forms are already available at the back of Church or from the Parish Office. If you would be interested in standing for election you will need to get your name on the new Electoral Roll (see below), find a proposer and seconder also from the new Electoral Roll then complete an application form. If you have any questions about the application forms or indeed, if you would just like to find out more about what is involved, please speak to one of the Clergy.

Electoral Roll

Every six years we are required to revise the Electoral Roll and unfortunately the next revision is due now, ahead of this year's AGM. You may have seen the various notices around the place. This involves taking all the existing names off the Electoral Roll and starting again. This is a legal requirement affecting all Anglican churches, not just All Saints. We really hope that all the existing members will re-apply, but you do need to re-apply – we cannot just transfer your entry over to the new Electoral Roll.

Parish Communications

At the same time, we are taking the opportunity to address a couple of GDPR related issues. Firstly and rather counter intuitively, although we collect names and addresses for the Electoral Roll, we are not allowed to use this information to communicate with you on various matters without your specific permission!

Secondly, we get a number of requests for people's phone numbers or e-mail addresses from other members of the congregation but we are not allowed to give out these contact details. What we would like to do therefore is to compile an All Saints Directory, containing names and contact details. A paper copy of the Directory would be given to each person listed in it and only to those members of All Saints whose details appear in the Directory. It would NOT be shared electronically and would NOT appear on the website.

It would be really helpful therefore if you could firstly complete the Application for Enrolment on the Electoral Roll and also complete the yellow form about Parish Communications, hopefully ticking both boxes on the latter form. If you prefer not to join in with our communications, you may choose just to complete the Electoral Roll application form.

The closing date for returning each of the forms is Sunday 10th March and there is a box for completed forms at the back of Church. Alternatively, you may hand them in to the Parish Office. If you have any questions, please speak to any of the clergy, Dick Hibberd or Paul and Rosanne in the Office.

Fairtrade Fortnight

Monday 25th February to Sunday 10th March



For two weeks each year thousands of individuals, companies and groups come together to celebrate the people who grow our food, who live in some of the poorest countries in the world and who are often exploited and badly paid. This year during Fairtrade Fortnight the focus is on the people, particularly women, who grow the cocoa in the chocolate many of us love so much. £1.98 is the amount a cocoa farmer in West Africa needs to earn each day in order to achieve a living income. Currently a typical cocoa farmer in Cote d'Ivoire lives on less than 78p a day. Most people are unaware of the extreme injustice in the cocoa supply chain.

For the women, it can be worse because they may plant and harvest the crop on the farm but also are responsible for looking after the children, carrying water, collecting wood and cooking and cleaning for the family.

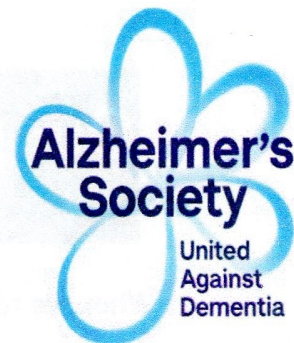
You may have bought 'Divine chocolate' which is a model of an ideal company. The member cocoa farmers own 44% of the company after one of the founders, the Body Shop, gave them their original shares, making them the largest shareholders. They receive the Fairtrade minimum price for their crop, the Fairtrade premium, 44% of the company's profits and 2% of the profits are invested in a Producer Support & Development Fund.

Two members of the Farmers' Co-operative sit on the Board of Directors.

THE APOCALYPSE OF JESUS



A SERIES OF 5 LENT STUDIES ON THE BOOK OF REVELATION
LED BY BISHOP DAVID ATKINSON

The strange Book of Revelation, written in about 95AD, opens up a world in which Christians were under threat from the Roman Empire: some were suffering for their faith. Was it easier to fall in with the ways of the Empire with all its wealth and prosperity, as well as cruelty, than to hold fast in their faith? The prophet John records a vision of the Risen Jesus, which opens for him God's perspective on the Christian assemblies and on the Empire. Written in the sort of poetic literature sometimes called 'apocalyptic', John conveys his message encouraging the Christians to stay strong in their witness, whilst opening up the demonic realities behind the workings of totalitarian Empire, and looking towards God's

ultimate victory over all that is evil in the establishment of his kingdom.

Today we are subject to all the allurements of many different sorts of godless 'empires', tempting us to put other gods in the place of Jesus Christ. Can 'Revelation' encourage us in our struggles and witness in our very different world?
