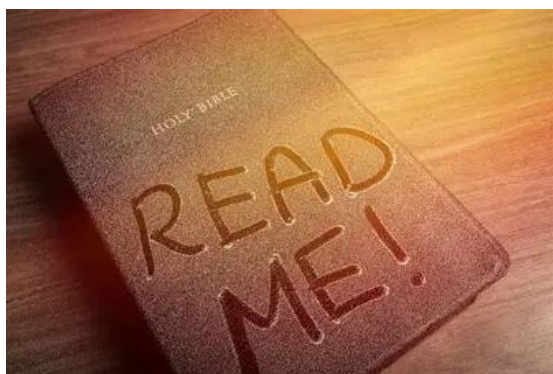

Mens' Group Outing - The National Army Museum – 9th April

The National Army Museum is located in Royal Hospital Road, Chelsea. It collects, preserves and shares the history of the British Army, and the soldiers who have served in it. The museum spans centuries and continents, from the time an official organised British army was set up at the time of the British Civil Wars by Oliver Cromwell in 1660; to the Army's role today.

The museum was nearing the end of a special exhibition that it was holding titled 'Beyond Burma; Forgotten Armies' marking the 80th Anniversary of VJ Day which added to the interest of the visit.

About a dozen of us made the journey to the museum, just a short walk from Sloane Square underground station taking us past the Royal Chelsea Hospital.



We were treated to a short introductory talk by one of the Guides, explaining the purpose and layout of the museum; and then we were left to browse the many exhibits and informative explanatory written displays. There was much to see, read and digest! Needless to say, the acquisition of knowledge is a task which requires the little grey cells to be adequately nourished and happily there was an excellent Café on hand in the museum which fulfilled this role handsomely!



We were pleased to include several ladies on our outing, as well as men from our membership.

As a group we try to include some outings on our programme to destinations, or events, which some of us have been meaning to visit (often for many years) and this was one of those.

We were pleased that it appealed to a number of people; and it appeared to have been enjoyed by all those who attended.
