Jeremy writes ...

"We are more than conquerors through him who loved us" says Paul in Romans 8:37. I've just been watching a programme featuring Canon Andrew White (the Vicar of Baghdad) who makes this his theme almost everywhere he goes. Few have known more than he the trials and tribulations of ministry in the most extreme of environments - yet he remains positive, joyful and calm constantly quoting those wonderful words.

Something else has also been going through my mind over the past few days. I have been struck by words uttered some 600 years before Christ by the prophet Obadiah (the shortest book in the Bible!): "The house of Jacob shall possess their possessions" (King James Version). That's a wonderful little phrase isn't it - the idea that we might be brought fully into our inheritance. As I was pondering this, for some reason my thoughts turned to the man in John 5 who, for no fewer than 38

years, had been seeking healing for his lameness. He, along with other unwell people, had been lying by a pool by the Sheep Market in Jerusalem where, periodically, a healing angel would some and stir up the water. The first person to step in would be miraculously healed of whatever disease they had. The problem for this man was that he had no-one to help him into the water, and he was unable to move by himself. So he always missed out on an opportunity to be made well.

To tell the truth, what had prompted my line of thinking was simply this: I'd be trying to get an appointment at my GP surgery - and you know how it is, you have to ring on the dot at 8am for the day's appointments. Needless to say, I repeatedly found myself just a few seconds too late so others jumped in ahead of me. It's a sad commentary on the NHS, because you can't seem to get attention until things get really bad. But I'm sure you can see the connection - as a patient needing help, I felt as powerless as this poor man. Everyone else managed to get in first!

Yet when Jesus came along, everything changed! He simply asks: "Would you like to be made whole? Rise, take your bed, and walk!". What a difference Christ makes! He does for us what we cannot do for ourselves and what no-one else can do for us.

There is a very real sense in which we need to turn to Christ and ask him to do seemingly impossible things for us - to help us "possess our possessions". As a church we have for some time now, been standing at the threshold of wonderful opportunities. Sometimes I ask myself: What are we waiting for? We can get all-too-easily distracted by other things - and my goodness we have found plenty of issues to distract us lately. I hope we will use the coming weeks and months to "possess our possessions" and enter into some of the plans that God has in store for us as we seek to serve his mission in our community. I'm really keen for us to resume our Mission Action Planning and move forward - otherwise, we risk languishing on the side-lines waiting for something to happen. God, in Christ, through the power of the Holy Spirit has given us all the resources we need to be "more than conquerors".

On a personal level, can I express how much Sandra and I have appreciated your prayers over the last few weeks. I hope to be restored to full health and vigour after my next bit of surgery in a couple of weeks. And we were both delighted and encouraged to see so many of you at Sandra's commissioning service at the Cathedral. We look forward to continuing to serve you as a team - believe it or not, it's just 4 years since we arrived in Sanderstead! Thank you for all your prayers, cards, messages, emails and words of encouragement - we have felt buoyed and thoroughly loved through the past month!

Mothers' Union:

How the "Away From It All" scheme is providing support and relief for families in need.

Mothers' Union members regularly provide various types of breaks for more than 4000 people a year in the UK & Ireland through our long running "Away From It All" (AFIA) scheme, which is intended to support families who are experiencing stressful times and would otherwise not have the opportunity of a holiday. For example, Sarah and her 10-year old son Michael who live in Wales. Referred by a substance misuse social worker who has been working with Sarah for eight years, she and her son were granted a caravan break from Mothers' Union, following a year of Sarah having been free from alcohol. Despite apprehension if she would be able to take her son and how they would cope with the trip, both of them managed very well. Supported by their social worker who was at hand to offer transport and kept in touch with them daily, they enjoyed new found freedoms such as swimming and Michael riding his bike around the park. The social worker shared that Sarah looked rested after the trip and that she had surprised herself how well she had done throughout the week. This time together away from the daily stress has given them back a lot of self-confidence and Michael for the first time in his life was able to return to school to tell them that he has been on holiday. The relationship between Sarah and her son Michael has also been strengthened by making positive memories of a good holiday together.


Pet Service at St. Antony's (23rd June '19)

Wettern Tree Gardens

An Araucaria Araucana (Monkey Puzzle) tree planted in remembrance of Joy Gadsby

Araucaria Araucana

Araucaria araucana is an evergreen tree growing to 1-1.5m in diameter and 30-40m in height. It is native to central and southern Chile and western Argentina. It is the hardiest species in the conifer genus Araucaria. Because of the longevity of this species, it is described as a living fossil. It is also the national tree of Chile. Its conservation status was changed to Endangered by the IUCN in 2013 due to the dwindling population caused by logging, forest fires, and grazing. So an appropriate choice of tree in memory of Joy Gadsby—not because I'm suggesting that she was a living fossil; although arguably elderly aunts are an endangered species, but because the Monkey Puzzle Tree reflects so many of her interests.

In many ways Joy was, and will remain, a puzzle. Although she could be forthright, she would not listen to evil, she would speak no evil nor see evil in anyone. On the contrary, and she could be quite contrary, she was generous in judgement and self-giving in service, passionate about ecology and incredibly knowledgeable about trees.



Joy's interests were far and wide but none were closer to her heart for conservation than her local interests, in particular Kings Wood and here at Wettern Gardens.

So thank you Richard Bird for organising today. Thank you to the Friends of Wettern Gardens whose fellowship Joy enjoyed so much. Thank you to those of you offering hospitality and thank you to all for coming along to remember an extraordinary person in such a positive and lasting way.

Sandra Groombridge's Commissioning as a SPA at Southwark Cathedral (24th June '19)









"Christ Revealed" Sanderstead Bible Week, 5 – 9 August 2019

This will be the third year of Bible Week, and I am pleased to commend it. Those who came along in 2017 and 2018 found the speakers really encouraging and helpful – as the feedback forms demonstrate ["Enjoyable and helpful. Each day I came away with something new to think about... I was encouraged to look at the Psalms in a new light... I feel very pleased to have attended. A splendid idea!.. I looked forward to attending each day... All of the speakers were excellent"]

The overall theme this year is 'Christ Revealed'.

At 3pm Our speaker each day at 3pm, from Monday to Friday, is <u>Dr Nick Lunn</u>, a Bible Translation Consultant with Wycliffe Bible Translators. He will help us look at parts of nine different books of the Bible, and show how Christ is revealed in the Hebrew (OT) Scriptures. I heard him speak last year and was fascinated by how he brought the scriptures to life and applied them to modern life.

At 8pm Under the heading of "What Jesus Said", we have a variety of speakers, including Trevor Neill, Pastor of Selsdon Baptist Church, Andy Brims and Phil Greaves, pastors at Croydon Vineyard Church, and Sue Clarke, Vicar in the Furzedown Team Ministry, who spoke at Bible Week 2017. The speakers will explain and apply the teachings of Jesus as we find them in the gospels.

I do hope you will do two things. First, please do come yourself; and secondly do spread the word and invite others.






