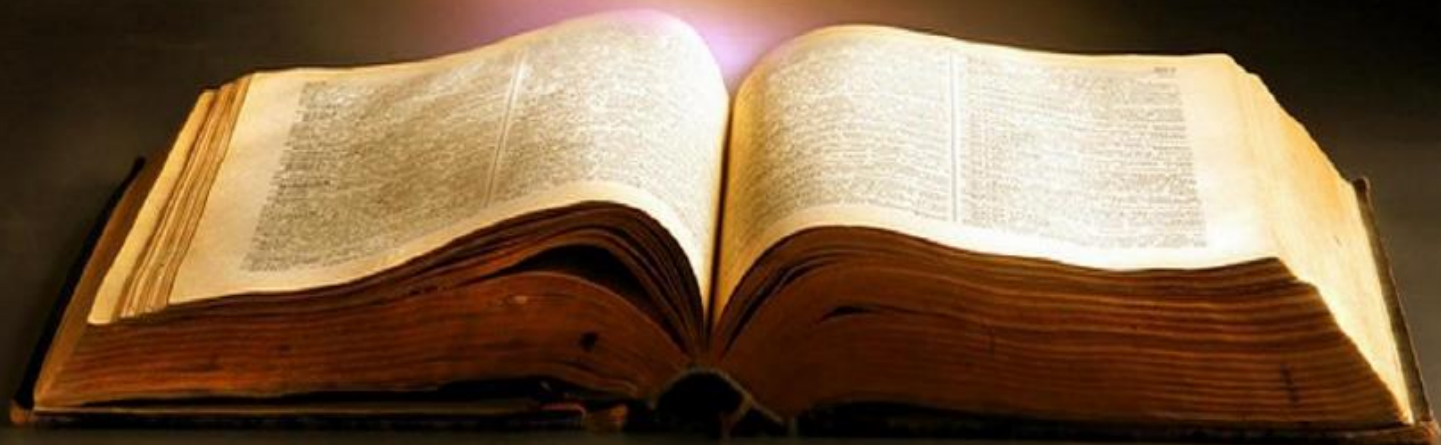

personare = per + sonare

- 1. per = through, by means of**
- 2. sonare = make a sound, utter a voice**

Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit
the Old Testament prophets
sometimes "personate" Jesus.

This means that instead of speaking *about* Jesus,
they sometimes speak *as* Jesus.
