



18 The Lord appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day. ² Abraham looked up and saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he hurried from the entrance of his tent to meet them and bowed low to the ground.

³ He said, 'If I have found favour in your eyes, my lord, [a] do not pass your servant by. ⁴ Let a little water be brought, and then you may all wash your feet and rest under this tree. ⁵ Let me get you something to eat, so you can be refreshed and then go on your way – now that you have come to your servant.'

17 Then the Lord said, 'Shall I hide from Abraham what I am about to do?



²⁰ Then the LORD said, 'The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sin so grievous ²¹ that I will go down and see if what they have done is as bad as the outcry that has reached me. If not, I will know.'

²²The men turned away and went towards Sodom, but Abraham remained standing before the Lord. [d] ²³Then Abraham approached him and said: 'Will you sweep away the righteous with the wicked? ²⁴ What if there are fifty righteous people in the city? Will you really sweep it away and not spare [e] the place for the sake of the fifty righteous people in it? ²⁵ Far be it from you to do such a thing – to kill the righteous with the wicked, treating the righteous and the wicked alike. Far be it from you! Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?'

26 The Lord said, 'If I find fifty righteous people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake.'

Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the desert and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. 2 There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it was not consumed.

- So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight—why the bush does not burn up."
- 4 When the LORD saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!" And Moses said, "Here I am."
- 5 "Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." ⁶ Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.






¹⁷ Then Manoah enquired of the angel of the LORD, "What is your name, so that we may honour you when your word comes true?" 18 He replied, "Why do you ask my name, seeing it is wonderful." 19 Then Manoah took a young goat, together with the grain offering, and sacrificed it on a rock to the LORD. And the LORD did an amazing thing while Manoah and his wife watched: 20 As the flame blazed up from the altar towards heaven, the angel of the LORD ascended in the flame. Seeing this, Manoah and his wife fell with their faces to the ground. 21 When the angel of the LORD did not show himself again to Manoah and his wife, Manoah realised that it was the angel of the LORD. 22 "We are doomed to die!" he said to his wife. "We have seen God!"

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The Angel of the Lord

- He is also described as 'God' or 'the Lord'.
- He speaks in the 1st person ('I') as God.
- He sanctifies the place where he appears.
- He receives worship as God.
- He receives an offering.
- Those who see him believe they have seen God.


'a temporary manifestation in human form as a precursor to his permanent incarnation in human nature'

IRENAEUS OF LYONS (church father, second century): 'the Son of God is implanted everywhere throughout his [Moses'] writings: at one time, indeed, speaking with Abraham, when about to eat with him; at another time with Noah, giving to him the dimensions of the ark; at another, inquiring after Adam; at another, bringing down judgment upon the Sodomites; and again, when he becomes visible, and directs Jacob on his journey, and speaks with Moses from the bush. It would be endless to recount the occasions on which the Son of God is shown forth by Moses'. (*Against Heresies*, 4.10.1)


JOHN CALVIN (reformer, sixteenth century): 'Christ, who is the living image of the Father, often appeared to the fathers [i.e. patriarchs] under the form of an angel' (Commentary, on Genesis 18:9)

WALTER KAISER (Old Testament scholar, present-day): 'It is clear from this abundance of evidence that the angel of the Lord in the Old Testament was a preincarnate form of our Lord Jesus Christ, who would later permanently take on flesh when he came as a babe in Bethlehem'. (*Hard Sayings of the Bible*, on Judges 6:22–23)
