

Revd Jeremy Groombridge writes ...

I don't mind admitting to a heavy reliance on being "connected". I'm one of those sad people who feels almost naked without my mobile/iPad/MacBook/iWatch, and I'm still fascinated by the technological miracle that allows us to be connected wherever we are in this world. Even recently, while we were travelling within the Arctic Circle we were able to track our route on our mobile maps in the remotest locations.



Nowadays, I wouldn't dream of embarking on a journey without tracking my whereabouts on a SatNav or mobile map. I like to have a clue where I'm going. Of course, we've all heard of strange cases where drivers have ended up in fields or rivers - and of course, that's one of the risks of overusing humanly designed technology. But these navigation systems are really helpful in providing a guide and helpful reassurance that we are on the right track.

I wonder, then, why I am so often willing to embark on parts of the Christian journey without seeking God in prayer and asking for help in discerning the way forward.

In James 4:2 we read these words: "You do not have because you do not ask God." And in 1 John 5, we read: "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him."

We've got a lot to learn about prayer; and we've got even more

to learn about discerning what is “according to his will”. But we are called to be God’s faithful people, and that means exercising faith in this whole matter of prayer. At this moment in the life of our parish God is opening up some wonderful opportunities for us to engage in mission. We’ve been praying about that for a long time, and it is now happening before our eyes. But we also have some big decisions to take about the future shape on that mission, and its practical implications for ministry. Now that both St Edmund’s and St Antony’s have closed for Sunday worship, how does God want us to move forward? What opportunities to develop new ministries and to work with new partners might be opening up in these parts of the parish?

Quite simply, if we do not collectively seek God’s guidance about the way forward, we will be confused and we will keep going round in circles. If we do not ask, we will not receive. A number of options are under consideration by the PCC, but first and foremost we need to discern God’s will for the future by spending time together in prayer. That is why we have set aside some specific times over the next few weeks to gather as a body of his people to pray together. These are the times we have set aside:

- **Sunday 1 March** 2.30-4pm at St Edmund’s
- **Tuesday 10 March** 8.30-10pm at St Antony’s
- **Sunday 29 March** 3.30-5pm at All Saints (St Catherine’s Aisle)

I do hope we will all make every effort to participate in at least one of these times of prayer. Don’t feel you have to stay for the full duration every time - come when you can, and go when you must! Either Martin or I will be there throughout.

And as we enter this time of Lent, let us make prayer one of the disciplines we follow. I’m rarely convinced by folk who promise to give up this, that or the other - I’m much more interested in what people are going to take on as we each embark on the journey of Lent. If we all agreed to commit to pray, I’m sure that would make a permanent difference rather than temporarily giving up our favourite tipple or TV programme.

In order to maintain the momentum, we are also setting aside lots of time during Lent for more general prayer. So on **Saturday 29 February** we have our normal 9am "Monthly Prayer" at All Saints (which is open to everyone) and we will be thinking specifically about FairTrade fortnight as well as other things that are on our hearts.

Then on **Saturdays 7, 14, and 21 March** we will meet for breakfast (bacon butties) at 8.30am and have a service of Morning Prayer at 9am for about half an hour. Then on **Saturday 28 March** we will have another Monthly Prayer time. I cannot stress strongly enough that these times of prayer are for everyone, not just the dozen or so who come regularly to Monthly Prayer. If we do not ask, we cannot expect to receive!

Don't forget, Churches Together will be running School of the Spirit with some superb speakers over the 5 weeks during Lent. There's a separate notice about this.

As if that were not enough, we are planning special times during Holy Week to meet together. Again, there's a separate notice about these events. New this year, in addition to the **Good Friday** Family Service, there will be the Walk of Witness at 10am, beginning at Sanderstead Methodist Church. That will be followed by our three-hour meditation, led this year by Bishop David Atkinson.

And on **Easter Sunday morning** we will begin with a Sunrise Service on the recreation ground - a 6am start, so possibly not for the fainthearted!

My prayer is that we will all experience God's presence and blessings during the journey of Lent, and that joy will fill our hearts as we greet the risen Christ!

We were made for relationships with God and one another

You probably know the word-picture in John's Gospel of Jesus as the *Good Shepherd*, the one who cares for the sheep and knows them by name. Indeed, the sheep know him and his voice too. So, Jesus wants to be the *Good Shepherd* for us today as well; he wants to include us in his love, concern, belonging and care.

I heard recently of a documentary about a new craze sweeping through young people in China. The film, *'People's Republic of Desire'*, is about "live-streaming", essentially broadcasting live videos of yourself over the internet for others to watch. The documentary follows the lives of two 'hosts' who have achieved fame and great wealth through live-streaming themselves in this way. And yet, away from the cameras, they struggle with loneliness, brokenness and family breakdown. One Chinese reviewer feels that the documentary; "*gives insight into contemporary Chinese society and how desperately the youth of China longs to be seen, heard and remembered*". Whether hosts, fans or wealthy sponsors, it appears they are all searching for belonging, significance and relationship.

The problem may be particularly and especially acute in China, but it is present among us in the UK too.

At John 10:14, Jesus said, "*I am the Good Shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me*". It may sound like a bit of a cliché, to say, "Jesus loves you", but it's true. We all need to know the love of Jesus, personally. And once we do know him personally, we will want to help others to know him too. That, above all, is what we as a church are here for.

Do you know Jesus as our personal Good Shepherd? We can; this is why he gave his life for us.







Through experiments and fun games, we will be finding out who God is, discovering the wonders of the world (and beyond!) and how the God behind it all wants to get to know us too.




