
Appendix 2 - Examples of operative District Plans using the BS5837 tree/roots protection method with 'whichever is greater' caveat.

Dripline – the area beneath the canopy of a tree, measured at ground level from any part of the surface of the trunk, with a radius to the outer most extent of the spread of the tree's branches.

Note: Dripline equals whichever method gives greatest measurement

Below from Wellington City Council Operative District Plan.

DRIPLINE (OF A TREE):

means the greater of:

(i) the line formed when a vertical line from the outermost extent of the spread of a tree's branches or canopy meets the ground; or

(ii) the line formed at a radius of half the height of the tree measured from the base of the trunk.
