This is a submission on the Proposed Porirua District Plan (the Plan).

The specific parts of the Plan that the Ministry's submission relates to are the proposed definitions and provisions that either directly or indirectly have the potential to impact on the Ministry's interests and ability to achieve its purpose.

Background:

The Ministry is the Government's lead advisor on the education system, shaping direction for education agencies and providers and contributing to the Government's goals for education. The Ministry's overall purpose is:

'Lifting aspiration and raising education achievement for every New Zealander'

Amongst other educational matters, the Ministry has a responsibility for managing all education property owned by the Crown. The Ministry also has a role in ensuring that education providers have the resources and support they need to deliver services to students. The safety of students and teachers is a high priority and as such, the Ministry monitors and responds to land use consent applications and plan changes that may have a potential impact on the operation of a school or the safety of teachers and students.

The Minister of Education is a requiring authority as defined in Section 166 of the Resource Management Act. The Minister typically designates existing and proposed state school sites as an effective way of managing the Government's school network. Within Porirua, there are 28 sites designated for Education Purposes by the Minister of Education, with a further five sites that were provided Notice of Requirements for during the designation confirmation in 2019. These five sites have been recently designated within the Proposed Porirua District Plan.

Outside of the designation process, the Ministry has responsibilities in respect of state integrated schools and other education facilities that are not, or are yet to be, designated. In that sense, the Minister is eager to ensure that Educational Facilities in general are well provided for in the country's planning documents, in a way that recognises and reflects that all Educational Facilities are important community assets and play a vital role within their communities.

Given the Ministry's overall purpose, it has a strong interest in how Educational Facilities are provided for in the Porirua District generally.

Ministry involvement in the Proposed District Plan:

In July 2019, the Minister confirmed the designations to be rolled or with or without modification for inclusion in this Proposed District Plan and included Notices of Requirement for 5 additional schools to be designated.

In September 2019, the Ministry provided early feedback on the draft district plan which outlined to the Council some of the areas of interest to the Ministry. This initial feedback focused on a number of key provisions, being:

- The definition of 'Educational Facility';
- Transport and parking rules for Education Facilities;
- Objectives providing for a safe, efficient, resilient and well-connected transport network; and
- Activity status for Education Facilities in the various zones.

The Ministry largely supported the draft provisions that pertained to the Ministry's interests, though, did highlight a few concerns specifically around the activity status of Education Facilities within the Future Urban and General Rural zones and the activity standards that were applicable (a 4-child cap) to Education Facilities.

The Ministry then attended a meeting with Porirua City Council to discuss our feedback and the then anticipated Plimmerton Farm Plan Change. The Ministry appreciates the early engagement and involvement throughout the Proposed District Plan process and looks forward to continuing to work together throughout the development and implementation of the Plan.

The Ministry's submission is:

The Ministry has particular interest in the parts of the Proposed Plan that, either directly or indirectly, have the potential to impact on the Ministry's interests such as the management and operation of existing schools or establishment of new Educational Facilities. The provisions that most directly impact on the Ministry are the proposed definitions, transport provisions, and the activity statuses of Educational Facilities throughout the various zones. The Ministry's general comment on these provisions are summarised in the below tables. The submission points in full can be found as **Appendix A**.

Table 1 General comment on the proposed definitions that are relative to the Ministry

Special Purpose Zone			

As currently drafted, the PPDP has a strong policy intent to enable and provide for infrastructure (for example network utilities, pipelines, transport), however, does not specifically provide for social infrastructure (for example community facilities that provide for education, health, social services, recreation and sport). New Zealand's policy framework continues to develop in terms of better recognising the need to plan and provide for social infrastructure together with infrastructure as defined in District Plans.

The National Policy Statement on Urban Development 2020 requires Council to plan for additional infrastructure, such as schools, in planning for growth and in documents such as the District Plan. It also includes a definition of additional infrastructure (emphasis added for social infrastructure) as provided below.

Additional infrastructure means:

- a. public open space
- b. community infrastructure as defined in section 197 of the Local Government Act 2002
- c. land transport (as defined in the Land Transport Management Act 2003) that is not controlled by local authorities
- d. social infrastructure, such as schools and healthcare facilities
- e. a network operated for the purpose of telecommunications (as defined in section 5 of the Telecommunications Act 2001)
- f. a network operated for the purpose of transmitting or distributing electricity or gas

Our submission identifies possible provisions in the PPDP where this could be achieved. This includes proposed definitions for 'additional infrastructure' or a more focussed definition of 'social infrastructure'. It is noted that proposed objective FC-01 relating to enabling infrastructure includes a requirement to enable people and communities to provide for their health and wellbeing. There is opportunity in this objective to more overtly enable social infrastructure. The Ministry is keen to work with PCC to develop the most appropriate way to provide for social infrastructure throughout the District Plan.

Additionally, there are further proposed provisions that indirectly have the potential to impact on the Ministry's interests, specifically those of the Noise (Noise Sensitive Activities, Insulation Standards) and Heritage Chapters (Restrictions on Scheduled Buildings/Sites). While the Ministry has not submitted on these provisions specifically, it is noted that the Ministry is generally supportive of them and their purpose.

The Ministry has cross-checked the Schedule of Designations and designation details within our confirmation of designation (dated 02 April 2019) and confirm that the designation boundaries and details have been correctly adopted into the Proposed Plan.

Finally, the Ministry reaffirms that the management of Educational Facilities will, primarily, continue to be done through designation mechanisms.

The Ministry seeks the following decision from Porirua District Council

That the specific amendments, additions or retentions which are sought as specifically outlined in Appendix A, shown in red and are struck through or underlined, are accepted and adopted into the Plan.

The Ministry wishes to be heard in support of their submission.

Finally, the Ministry wishes to communicate an eagerness for, and the importance of, having strong lines of communication with the Council for planning for growth and local school networks planning throughout the District. We would be happy to meet to discuss these matters, and any other matters that you believe would be helpful when progressing through the Proposed District Plan process, to improve the provisions for Education Facilities and aid the Ministry in achieving its purpose.
