Minute 29 – Hearing Stream 3 Follow Up Matters

- As part of its Stream 3 Reply, the Council provided, at our request, a large-scale map of the Titahi Bay beach area showing additional features to assist our understanding of the implications of the Environment Court's Consent Order finalising the provisions of the PNRP in relation to Titahi Bay beach.
- Subsequently, on 28 February, the Council provided us with a revised plan, explaining that the previous plan was an error because the GIS data supplied to Council by Greater Wellington Regional Council did not accurately reflect the Consent Order.
- 3. In the circumstances, while minded to accept this revised plan so as to have reliable information of the situation, the Hearing Panel determined that it should provide Mr Ebbett, who had presented submissions on behalf of the Titahi Bay Residents Association Inc, with the opportunity to provide comment.
- 4. Mr Ebbett's Memorandum dated 6 March records his understanding that Greater Wellington Regional Council is still working on an accurate digital representation of the Environment Court's Order. He requests that we wait for that information to be supplied to the Council so that it might then produce a further revision of the plan it has supplied.
- 5. Council is requested to advise in the first instance whether Mr Ebbett's understanding is correct and, if so, when it is anticipated that Greater Wellington Regional Council will have finalised digitised mapping of the Titahi Bay beach area for the purposes of its Proposed Natural Resources Plan,

and accordingly, when Council might be in a position to supply an updated version of its plan.

6. The second point to note on this subject is that Ms Robyn Smith provided a Memorandum dated 5 March 2022, seeking leave to respond to the Council's Memorandum and supplying maps and survey plans of the Titahi Bay beach area. The material supplied aids our understanding of the situation on the ground at Titahi Bay, including the matters put in issue by the Residents Association submission, and is accordingly helpful. We accept that material into the hearing record for Stream 3.
