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Resolution amending Resolution No. 953 of 2024 which authorized Fifty-Two (52) Open-End Professional Services Agreements with multiple vendors to provide on-call professional services as needed by various Departments of the City of Pittsburgh, with each Agreement being at an amount not-to-exceed One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) annually for a Three (3) year term, by authorizing an additional Forty-One (41) Agreements for an updated total of Eighty-Two (82) Open-End Professional Service Agreements.

Be it resolved by the Council for the City of Pittsburgh as follows:

Section 1. The City of Pittsburgh, through the Office of Management & Budget, is hereby authorized to enter into Eighty-Two (82) Open-End Professional Services Agreements with multiple vendors for Three (3) year terms, in order to provide professional services on an on-call basis as required and/or as needed by the various Departments of the City of Pittsburgh.

Section 2. Because the Agreements provide services on an as-needed basis, expenditures under these Agreements will be identified when work orders are issued. If funding for any work order has not been previously appropriated, funding will be identified and appropriated through subsequent City Council action. Funding is available as appropriated when listed per project in the Operating and/or Capital Budget.

Section 3. No agreement will cost an amount greater than One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) per year. In no event will any estimated work order for a project issued under these agreements exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) in value.

Section 4. Said Agreement(s) shall be approved by the City Solicitor as to form.
