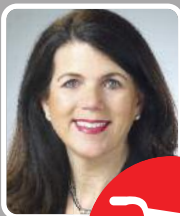


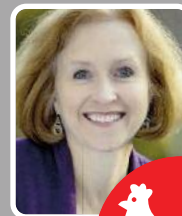
First JOBS

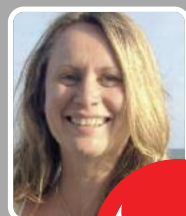


Christine Pierre ran a babysitting club and provided babysitters to neighbors.

Mauricha Marcussen mowed lawns.

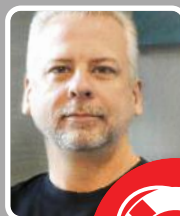
