	Scheme	Number of Lessons	Notes
1	Reading Comprehension	6	These six lessons guide your class through the whole story of 'Floodland' from beginning to end. The children will develop various reading skills as they read and/or listen to the story from start to finish.
2	Newspaper Reports	4	These four lessons focus on the concept of rising sea levels and the consequences this might have on the population of Norwich. The lessons could be taught at any point, but are best used in context at near the beginning of the story.
3	Character Analysis	3	These three lessons focus on using the skills of inference, deduction and empathy to analyse the main characters' words and actions. They will need to have finished reading the book before you begin to teach these lessons.
4	Narrative	4	These four lessons explore how authors use backstories to reveal more about a character, before writing their own backstory for one of the characters. They will need to have finished reading the book before you begin to teach these lessons.
5	Speech Writing	3	These lessons focus on Eels Island as the children write a speech to determine the leader of the island. They need to have a good knowledge of Dooby as a character and a leader to make the most of these lessons.

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
