VISION STATEMENT & GOALS

The Village of Adams has evolved from its historic roots as a sawmill community into a forward-thinking village that cultivates economic, educational, and recreational opportunities for residents and families of all ages. Covering 1.5 square miles and bordered by the Town of Adams, the Village values its historic character, with its downtown recently designated as a historic district on both the State and National Registers. The presence of the South Jefferson School District, the vibrant downtown core, and convenient access to Interstate-81 have catalyzed economic growth and positioned Adams as a hub for community activity. The Village's compact, walkable settlement pattern is complemented by natural assets such as Sandy Creek, providing environmental, recreational, and aesthetic benefits. Through collaboration with residents and partners, Adams continues to preserve its heritage while implementing transformative projects—from accessible parks and trails to downtown façade enhancements and public art—that enhance quality of life, strengthen economic vitality, and ensure a thriving, inclusive community for current and future generations.

PAST INVESTMENT & FUTURE POTENTIAL

The Village of Adams consistently demonstrates its proficiency in overseeing and implementing large-scale capital projects that significantly contribute to the health, welfare, and quality of life of the entire community. Key projects include the \$450,000 Water Storage Tank Improvements Project, the \$4 million Water System Improvements Project, the \$4.5 million Water Pollution Control Facility and Collection System Improvements Project, and the \$2.5 million Water Source Development and Water Distribution System Upgrades Project, all funded through a combination of local contributions and state support. These critical water system upgrades significantly enhance reliability, quality, and accessibility, ultimately supporting public health, economic growth, and long-term sustainability for residents.

Over the past ten years, the Village has also invested in other infrastructure initiatives, including a \$250,000 sewer relocation, roadway improvements, and a \$1.4 million fire station renovation project. A notable recent accomplishment is the new Playground in Adams Community Park, which features inclusive playground equipment, seating, pathways, shade trees, and other amenities. This project was made possible through \$322,000 in funding from the Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) Environmental Protection Fund, \$160,000 raised locally by the Adams Revitalization Committee, and additional ARPA funds. The Revitalization Committee's continued fundraising efforts for Phase 2 demonstrate strong community engagement and a sustained commitment to creating vibrant, accessible recreational spaces for residents of all ages and abilities.

Building on this momentum, the Village is also upgrading its primary youth baseball field, serving U6 through U12 teams. Improvements include new fencing, upgraded bleachers, expanded parking, a modern scoreboard, and enhanced storage facilities. These upgrades will ensure a safer, more accessible, and enjoyable experience for players, families, and spectators. The project, supported in part by a \$50,000 DASNY grant, strengthens Adams' reputation as a family-friendly community and fosters youth engagement while creating opportunities for tournaments and events that attract regional visitors.

With essential infrastructure upgrades, streetscape improvements, and park enhancements, the Village envisions a downtown that is a lively cultural hub, recognized for community events and its vibrant core. The parade route engages residents and visitors alike, drawing tourists from across Jefferson County. Monthly upgrades to downtown decorations and plantings provide seasonal interest year-round, and memorial banners honor military heroes and veterans. Recent growth in local entrepreneurship has further strengthened Adams' identity as a thriving downtown, featuring shops and eateries such as Stefano's, Belloff's, Adams Cheese Shop, Gram's Diner, Adams Gift Shop, and Camille's Bakery & Cafe.

These past investments, combined with active community involvement, extensive public participation, and preliminary project planning—including discussions with numerous local business owners and the development of project sheets—position the Village of Adams to submit a compelling application for NY Forward Round 4 and DRI Round 9 funding. The Village's proven ability to leverage state and local resources, paired with strong public support and a history of successful project implementation, ensures that proposed initiatives—including parks, downtown revitalization, infrastructure upgrades, and cultural enhancements—will be fully realized and transformative. By building upon these successes, Adams is ready to further enhance its downtown, strengthen economic vitality, and improve quality of life for all residents and visitors alike, with a focus on inclusive and accessible improvements that honor the Village's small-town historic charm.

RECENT & IMPENDING JOB GROWTH

The Village of Adams firmly believes that a thriving community depends on robust employment opportunities within and around its historic downtown. The downtown area is home to more than ten active small businesses, including Stefano's Pizzeria and Adams Gift Shop, which collectively provide numerous positions for residents. Additionally, the Village is fortunate to host Great Lakes Cheese, an expansive and growing cheese production facility that employs several hundred individuals directly. Beyond these direct jobs, these businesses generate "spin-off" employment in distribution, raw material sourcing (such as milk for Great Lakes Cheese), and service sectors. To support this economic activity, the Village has proactively added staff in the sewer department and a part-time employee in the Department of Public Works to ensure reliable services for both residents and commercial facilities.

The Village's strategic location along Interstate-81, within 40 minutes of Fort Drum and Syracuse, NY (where the proposed Micron mega-project is planned), positions Adams as an attractive destination for businesses and skilled employees alike. With sufficient capacity in its sewer and water systems, the Village is well-prepared to accommodate industrial, commercial, and mixed-use growth. With the assistance of additional funding through programs like NY Forward Round 4 and Downtown Revitalization Initiative Round 9, Adams envisions the creation of a vibrant commercial hub that draws new businesses, expands employment opportunities, and revitalizes idle commercial spaces in the downtown core. Local business owners are eager to develop and expand but often face financial barriers; grant support could catalyze these projects and unlock additional jobs for residents.



The entrepreneurial spirit of Adams' local businesses reflects the vitality of the community itself. By leveraging state support, the Village aims to enhance the economic landscape, provide quality employment, and ensure that downtown Adams continues to thrive as a hub for commerce, services, and community life. With these businesses, the Village has added additional staff in our sewer department and a part time employee in the DPW to provide quality services for the residents and commercial facilities alike.


The Village of Adams is uniquely situated along Interstate-81 and within 40 minutes of the Fort Drum Military Installation and Syracuse, NY (where the mega project for Micron is proposed). Additionally, the Village of Adams has the capacity in our sewer and water systems to provide additional industrial and commercial growth. We envision, with the assistance of additional funds from programs like NY Forward and the Downtown Revitalization Initiative, and the above-mentioned systems and location, that a commercial hub can be formed and attract a wide array of skilled employees and diverse business to the area.

UPCOMING PROJECTS

The Village of Adams is actively pursuing several community-focused projects in the coming months to enhance public spaces, strengthen downtown vibrancy, and support local economic growth.

Key near-term initiatives include the revitalization of the youth baseball field on Spring Street, where the Village DPW will replace the base pathway with sand, upgrade the pitcher's mound, install new fencing, and improve parking access. These enhancements will create a more accessible, safe, and user-friendly space for residents and visitors, while also improving access to the Sandy Creek Picnic and Fishing Area, further promoting outdoor recreation and tourism. These projects also create short-term employment opportunities for local contractors and DPW staff.

In the downtown core, the Revitalization Committee is procuring new and enhanced Christmas decorations, which the Village DPW will install, and is continuing the "Hometown Heroes" banner program, through which 94 banners honoring local veterans have already been purchased by community members. These initiatives foster civic pride, strengthen community engagement, and create seasonal economic activity by drawing visitors downtown, supporting local businesses, and generating potential part-time employment for installation and maintenance.



The Village is also moving forward with Phase 2 improvements at the Community Park, building on recently completed Phase 1 investments. This project will expand recreational opportunities for residents of all ages, incorporating inclusive play equipment, accessible pathways connecting to the existing sidewalk network, green infrastructure, native plantings, restrooms, and a rentable pavilion. The park will continue to serve as a central hub for events, strengthen local connections, attract visitors, and create construction and maintenance-related jobs, further supporting economic vitality and reinforcing Adams' reputation as a welcoming, vibrant community.











QUALITY OF LIFE

The Village of Adams offers a vibrant and inclusive quality of life, grounded in its rich history, strong sense of community, and forward-looking vision. Holiday parades light up the streets, cultivating camaraderie and joy, while the Summer Concert and Movie Series transform warm evenings into memorable community gatherings. Fireman's Field Days provide thrilling entertainment for all ages, and the Community-wide Yard Sales encourage neighborly interaction and treasure hunting. Even regular events like Bingo foster connection and friendly competition. Collectively, these activities create a rich tapestry of life in Adams, reinforcing local pride and making the Village a lively, welcoming destination throughout the year.

Recognizing the importance of housing to support a thriving community, the Village Board adopted a "Pro-Housing Community" resolution at a 2024 meeting, with official acceptance received in July 2025. The Village is committed to meeting the housing needs of current and prospective residents, balancing growth with thoughtful planning. Adams has consistently supported housing and commercial development through clear and reasonable zoning codes and enforcement. Village Staff and Planning Board Members actively facilitate commercial and residential permitting and approvals, holding meetings as needed to prioritize community development. DPW staff are proactive in assisting prospective residents and commercial entities with sewer, water, and other utility connections to ensure projects move forward smoothly.

The Village Staff and Board take pride in being true partners with local developers, residents, and prospective homeowners. Community feedback is actively welcomed and acted upon, ensuring that improvements reflect both public input and the Village's strategic vision for a vibrant, sustainable, and inclusive community.



ADMINISTRATIVE CAPACITY

The Village of Adams demonstrates strong administrative capacity to secure, oversee, and execute grant-funded projects that enhance the community's quality of life and downtown vitality. Village staff, including the DPW Superintendent and Village Clerks, are experienced in managing complex capital projects and grant award processes, ensuring transparency, accountability, and compliance. The Village Board consistently ensures projects are "shovel ready," a practice that has enabled the successful pursuit and completion of numerous local, state, and federal funding initiatives.

The Village maintains strong relationships with regional partners, including leadership from the Town of Adams and Jefferson County, and recognizes the value of engaging specialized expertise. A well-respected engineering and consulting firm supports the Village in project design, construction, and grant administration, providing professional oversight and timely execution.

For the NY Forward and Downtown Revitalization Initiative programs, the Village will employ a tiered administrative approach. The Village Board will act as the lead agency, supported by a dedicated "NY Forward and DRI Subcommittee" comprising representatives from Jefferson County (including Ryan Piche, County Administrator, and the County Planning Department), the Town of Adams, and appointed community members. The Downtown Business Fund will operate through a formal RFP process, soliciting project scopes and funding requests for subcommittee review and Village Board approval. Evaluation criteria will emphasize community enrichment, job creation, project readiness, and alignment with the Village's revitalization goals.



Through this structured and proven approach, the Village of Adams is well-prepared to successfully administer NY Forward and DRI funds, ensuring projects are implemented efficiently and effectively, and contribute meaningfully to the community's downtown revitalization, infrastructure improvements, and overall quality of life.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

A critical part of the Village of Adams' planning process has been ensuring strong community participation. Village leaders have made it a priority to actively involve residents and stakeholders in shaping the future of downtown through both planning and grant application efforts.

As part of preparing this NY Forward Round 4 and DRI Round 9 application, the Village hosted two well-attended public meetings that drew broad participation and generated valuable input on community priorities. These meetings built upon years of engagement around projects across the Village, such as the playground improvements at Adams Community Park, workshops, open houses, and other loca events — all of which have demonstrated the strong public support behind this revitalization effort.

The input gathered has directly informed the vision, goals, and projects reflected in this application. With residents, businesses, and local leaders working together, the Village of Adams is building on its momentum to pursue transformative

investments that will strengthen Main Street, enhance public spaces, and create a more vibrant and livable community.

The Adams Revitalization Committee, who has an active presence in the community and on social media, was created over 10 years ago by residents who live and work within the Village and Town to "improve downtown and surrounding areas and to make Adams and Adams Center more attractive and appealing for businesses; support and encourage business and the local economy; and to provide good quality of life.



TRANSFORMATIVE PROJECT OPPORTUNITIES

The Village of Adams is proud to submit a package of transformative projects for this year's NY Forward and Downtown Revitalization Initiative applications—initiatives designed to enhance quality of life, strengthen economic vitality, and celebrate the Village's small-town historic charm. These projects build on years of community engagement, reflect strong public input gathered through surveys and well-attended meetings, and are informed by direct discussions with numerous downtown business owners. Recreational improvements begin with a new community park featuring fully accessible walking paths, a dog park, and inclusive play areas, which connect seamlessly to the rehabilitated youth baseball field and the Sandy Creek fishing and picnic area with accessible docks. These sites not only provide diverse opportunities for active living but also encourage residents and visitors to explore and engage with downtown, creating a natural flow between recreational, cultural, and commercial spaces.

Downtown enhancements—such as building façade and awning upgrades, historic signage improvements, and a small business fund to support mixed-use redevelopment and entrepreneurship—work hand-in-hand with these recreational spaces, attracting residents and visitors to experience the Village's historic core. Active transportation improvements, including on-street bicycle facilities, trail connections, and a pedestrian bridge across Sandy Creek, tie together neighborhoods, parks, and downtown, ensuring safe, inclusive, and accessible mobility for all.

Public art and a welcoming mural on the CSX bridge will mark key entry points into the Village, while sustainability measures such as energy efficiency programs and EV charging stations advance New York State's climate goals. Enhancements to the parade and festival route will connect downtown events to surrounding community assets, reinforcing Adams' reputation as a regional destination for inclusive celebrations and cultural gatherings.

By integrating recreational, cultural, transportation, and economic initiatives, these projects collectively tell a story of a Village committed to cohesive growth and community well-being. 1 ADAMS COMMUNITY PARK PHASE 2 IMPROVEMENTS

Have image of current space

Type: Recreational

Description: The Village of Adams will expand and enhance the existing Community Park to create a fully inclusive, multi-generational recreational hub. Building upon recently completed Phase 1 improvements—including a playground, accessible loop trail, signage, seating, and native shade trees—Phase 2 will add additional inclusive play equipment, accessible pathway connections to the existing sidewalk along Wardwell Street, green infrastructure, pollinator plantings, restrooms, and a rentable pavilion. A new outdoor pickleball court will also be added, providing a popular, low-cost recreational option that appeals to a wide range of ages. Together, these enhancements will strengthen the park's role as a central gathering space for residents and visitors, promoting active, healthy lifestyles and community engagement.

Other Considerations: Phase 1 improvements were successfully completed in summer 2024 with grant support and assistance from Village DPW staff. The Village has increased seasonal DPW staffing to maintain the highly used park, and the Revitalization Committee continues to fundraise for Phase 2. The pickleball court complements existing amenities, encourages social interaction, and attracts visitors, further activating the park as a vibrant community destination.

DOWNTOWN COMPLETE STREETS IMPROVEMENTS

Type: Public Realm / Streetscape

Description: The Village of Adams will enhance the downtown streetscape along West Church Street to North Park Street to create a safer, more accessible, and visually appealing corridor for residents and visitors. Improvements will include upgraded sidewalks, curbing, crosswalks, street shade trees, and other streetscape amenities designed to facilitate comfortable access and optimal viewing for parades, festivals, and other community gatherings. These enhancements will not only improve the day-to-day pedestrian experience but also help attract additional attendees to the Village's numerous events, supporting local businesses and boosting downtown economic vitality

Other Considerations: The Village hosts a variety of parades and festivals throughout the year, including Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Christmas events, the Adams Cheese Festival, and a concert series. Streetscape improvements will prioritize accessibility for all users, safety, and enhanced visibility of events. Phase 1 improvements have already been completed, including removal and replacement of the top and binder course of East Church Street (\$150,000) and LED streetlight upgrades throughout the Village, providing a strong foundation for this project. These enhancements align with the Village's ongoing commitment to creating an inviting and vibrant downtown that encourages community interaction and supports local economic growth.

Cost: \$1,500,000

VILLAGE OF ADAMS WELCOME SIGN

Type: Public Art

Description: The Village of Adams proposes a comprehensive restoration and aesthetic enhancement of the CSX Railroad Bridge, a key entry point into the community. The project will include structural painting, artistic design elements, and welcoming signage to create a visually striking gateway that reflects the Village's character, history, and vibrancy. By transforming this bridge into a memorable entry feature, visitors and residents alike will experience a stronger sense of place and pride in the community.

Other Considerations: The Village has proactively engaged with CSX regarding coordination and safety requirements. This improvement aligns with NY Forward and DRI goals by enhancing placemaking, strengthening the downtown gateway, and supporting economic vitality. It will reinforce Adams as an inviting destination, complement other downtown revitalization efforts, and provide opportunities to incorporate local history, art, and storytelling. Visitors' first impressions of the Village will be elevated, encouraging longer visits, repeat tourism, and stronger support for local businesses.






SANDY CREEK SCENIC OVERLOOK


DOWNTOWN HISTORIC SIGNAGE & WAYFINDING INITIATIVE

Type: Public Art / Wayfinding

Description: This project will install approximately ten (10) historical interpretive signs perpendicular to building façades along the downtown streetscape. The signage will provide wayfinding for visitors while celebrating the Village's rich history, connecting historic narratives to current businesses. By being visible from the street rather than mounted on buildings, the signs will enhance downtown legibility, encourage exploration, and create an engaging visitor experience. This project strengthens the downtown's sense of place and highlights Adams' unique heritage as part of a broader revitalization strategy.

Other Considerations: Historical photographs indicate that perpendicular signage and awnings were common features in the Village, making this approach both historically appropriate and visually cohesive. By linking past and present, the project supports local businesses, encourages pedestrian activity, and complements other façade and streetscape improvements.

Cost: \$250,000

DOWNTOWN BUSINESS FACADE & AWNING IMPROVEMENTS



Type: Village Downtown / Building Revitalization

Description: This initiative will restore and upgrade building façades, awnings, and storefronts throughout the Village of Adams' downtown. The project aims to preserve and highlight the historic architectural character while incorporating modern, energy-efficient materials where appropriate. Enhancing façades and storefronts will create a visually cohesive and inviting streetscape that attracts visitors, supports local businesses, encourages upper-story residential occupancy, and increases property values. These improvements contribute to a vibrant, active downtown that reflects the community's pride and identity.

Other Considerations: Many downtown buildings feature street-level retail with upper-floor apartments, offering opportunities to support mixed-use vibrancy. Local business owners are engaged and eager to participate, providing matching funds for improvements. This initiative complements other planned streetscape, signage, and public space enhancements to strengthen the overall economic and social vitality of the downtown core.

Cost: \$750,000





DOWNTOWN BUSINESS FUND

Type: Mixed Use / Economic Development

Description: This initiative will provide targeted funding for projects that support job creation, foster economic growth, and encourage affordable housing options within Adams' downtown. The focus will be on developing mixed-use spaces with vibrant commercial or retail activity on the first floor and residential apartments above, enhancing downtown vitality and contributing to a more active, walkable community. By leveraging private investment alongside grant funding, these projects will help position Adams as a dynamic destination for residents, visitors, and businesses alike.

Other Considerations: A broad range of committed stakeholders have expressed interest in participating, including Extreme Sports Complex, Belloff's, the Cleveland Block, Hotel Adams, Adams Cheese Shop, Gram's Diner, Adams Gift Shop, Camille's Bakery & Cafe, China Wok, Rhode Center, SJ South Jeff Rescue Squad, Brick Hair Co., Adams Veterinarian Clinic, Stefano's Pizzeria, L. Rosa Boutique, and the former Redemption Center. The Village has already received preliminary project sheets from these stakeholders, demonstrating strong community support and providing a foundation for developing a competitive application.

Cost: \$600,000



DOWNTOWN MURAL & PUBLIC ART INITIATIVE

Type: Place Making & Community Engagement

Description: This initiative will transform underutilized walls and building facades in downtown Adams into vibrant, locally inspired murals and public art installations. By promoting cycling and walking, this initiative supports sustainable transportation, encourages healthy lifestyles, attracts eco-tourism, and strengthens the village's role as a regional destination.

Other Considerations: Aligned with Adams' Arbor Day Village identity, this project demonstrates a commitment to green infrastructure and climate-conscious planning. Educational and interpretive signage will highlight local history and landmarks, creating a unique cultural and recreational experience. Increased bike and pedestrian traffic will support downtown businesses, foster social engagement, and enhance accessibility for all ages and abilities, contributing to a more vibrant, connected, and resilient community.



Cost: \$500,000

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION INITIATIVE

Type: Sustainability & Transportation

Description: This initiative will install Level 2 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations in strategic locations throughout downtown Adams, supporting sustainable transportation, attracting eco-conscious visitors, and positioning the village as a forward-thinking destination. Placed near high-traffic businesses, public parking areas, and key attractions, the stations will encourage longer visits, increase foot traffic to local shops and restaurants, and enhance the overall visitor experience. By investing in modern transportation infrastructure, Adams demonstrates its commitment to environmental stewardship, community innovation, and future-ready economic growth.

Other Considerations: This project aligns with New York State's decarbonization and climate action goals while improving downtown accessibility for modern travelers. Partnerships with local businesses will ensure visibility and encourage community engagement. In addition to supporting EV adoption, the initiative will help Adams stand out as a regional hub for sustainable tourism and innovation in small-town infrastructure.

Cost: \$75,000-\$150,000

11 YOUTH BASEBALL FIELD INITIATIVE

Type: Recreation & Youth Development

Description: This project will upgrade the Village's primary youth baseball field, serving U6 through U12 teams, from tee-ball to Little League. These upgrades will ensure a safer, more accessible, and enjoyable experience for players, families, and spectators. By enhancing this central recreational space, the Village strengthens its reputation as a family-friendly community and creates opportunities for tournaments and events that attract visitors and encourage longer stays in Adams.

Other Considerations: The Village has secured a \$50,000 DASNY grant to support the upgrades. This field is a cornerstone of youth engagement and community pride, hosting local leagues, events, and seasonal programs. Investing in its long-term quality aligns with the Village's broader goal of providing inclusive, active, and vibrant recreational spaces that benefit residents and draw regional visitors.

By integrating energy efficiency into revitalization efforts, the Village ensures that improvements are not only visually appealing but also economically and environmentally sustainable, lowering operating costs and strengthening downtown businesses for the long term.

Other Considerations: The Village of Adams will collaborate with NYSERDA's Clean Energy Communities Program and local energy providers to secure funding and rebates

for participating businesses. This initiative supports state decarbonization goals, encourages investment in the downtown, and positions Adams as a forward-thinking, sustainable community. By helping businesses reduce energy consumption and expenses, the program also enhances the attractiveness of downtown for new ventures and patrons alike.

Cost: \$250,000



SANDY CREEK FISHING & PICNIC AREA

Type: Recreation & Public Space

Description: This project will revitalize the public fishing area adjacent to the Village's baseball field, creating a welcoming, family-friendly space that encourages outdoor recreation. Improvements include a covered pavilion, picnic areas, accessible pathways, and a modern dock on Sandy Creek. These enhancements will provide residents and visitors with opportunities to gather, fish, and enjoy the scenic creek, while connecting to nearby recreational facilities.

Other Considerations: Building on the recently funded \$50,000 baseball field rehabilitation, this project strengthens community engagement, supports youth and family activities, and enhances Adams' reputation as a destination for recreation and eco-tourism. The project also aligns with the Village's broader downtown revitalization efforts by promoting public access to natural assets and increasing local visitation, benefiting nearby businesses.

Cost: \$450,000





ADAMS COMMUNITY DOG PARK & ACCESSIBLE WALKING PATHS

Type: Recreation, Connectivity & Public Health

Description: This project will create a new, fully accessible community park in the Village of Adams, featuring a fenced, inclusive dog park and an integrated network of safe walking and jogging paths.
