New Boston is a bucolic, historic New England town with a Norman Rockwell central village. A quiet, rural town, it is convenient to major highways, and is only 20 minutes to the Manchester airport. The Piscataquog River runs through the town, providing year-round recreational opportunities such as kayaking, fishing, bicycling, snow shoeing, X-C skiing and nature walks.

The town was first settled in 1736 by grantees who were former residents of Boston, MA. The name of New Boston was first used by the township in 1751. New Boston recently celebrated its 250th anniversary of incorporation.

During the Revolutionary War, New Boston militia under the command of General John Stark helped defeat Hessian troops at the Battle of Bennington. The cannon used, named the Molly Stark Cannon, was awarded to this militia by General Stark. On display at the Historical Society, the cannon is still maintained by the New Boston Artillery Company and is fired every year as part of the 4th of July celebrations.

The town's history is rooted in its agricultural past. When the railroad came to town in 1893, entrepreneur JR Whipple supplied his 3 Boston hotels with fresh farm products from the town. Passenger train service to New Boston ended in 1931, and the railroad was abandoned in the 1970's. Today the railroad bed has been converted to a walking/biking/skiing trail enjoyed by the residents of New Boston.

In World War II, Joe English Pond was used for target practice. This area became the New Boston Air force Base, and satellite tracking antenna were installed. In 1948 Roger Babson established the Gravity Research Foundation, drawing notable scientists to conferences held here -The Gravity Center of the World. The Foundation was relocated to Babson College in the 1960s, and still holds its annual essay contest.

Today the townsfolk of New Boston love their community! Excellent schools, preservation of country character, and strong community spirit make New Boston a special place to live. Come find out why New Boston could be the perfect community for you!

New Boston is blessed with a natural environment that is conducive to many outdoor recreational activities and conservation of land resources is a high priority. As of 2012, there were 10,486 acres in Current Use, 2,589 of these with documented stewardship. Many of the properties have public access on them. In addition to conserved land, the 3 branches of the Piscataquog River flow through New Boston.
