

Two teams:

Prize: Donuts (incl. vegan)

Distribute the quotes in half. Distribute the prompts in half.

Team 1 has 30 seconds to pick a quote but doesn't read it aloud.

Team 2 has 30 seconds to pick a prompt. They read aloud what the prompt is gonna be.

They are welcome to make up their own prompt.

The team can either have a member read the prompt aloud or insist the supervisor read it for 1 point. If the team reads it, they get 2 points. Same person can't be the quote reader twice in a row.

Then that team chooses the next prompt.
