

Facilitator's Guide: Ensuring Section 508 Compliance in eLearning

Target Audience: Instructional Designers and eLearning Developers

Learning Objectives:

1. Select the key components of Section 508 compliance.
2. Discriminate the benefits of Section 508 compliance for both learners and organizations, including improved accessibility, legal compliance, and enhanced brand reputation.
3. Apply Section 508 compliance principles to eLearning development by brainstorming strategies to ensure accessibility for individuals with disabilities and integrating accessibility features into training modules.

Training Purpose: Provide necessary information for Instructional Designers to create Section 508 compliant eLearning modules.

Producer: Pre-Work	Actions
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. At the start of the session manage the waiting room and allow participants to enter. Continue to watch the waiting room throughout the session. 2. 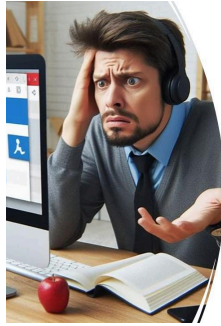

The purpose is to ensure equal access to government information and services provided electronically, promoting inclusivity and removing barriers for people with disabilities. • For eLearning developers, this means mandatory compliance if you're working with federal agencies or any organizations receiving federal funding or contracts. Non-compliance can result in legal repercussions, reputational damage, and loss of contracts or funding. 






Legal Requirements and Implications for eLearning Developers

- Mandatory Compliance
 - Applies to federal agencies and any organizations receiving federal funding or contracts, including educational institutions and private contractors
- Consequences of Non-Compliance
 - Legal repercussions including lawsuits and fines
 - Reputational damage and potential loss of federal contracts or funding

SAY:

- Achieving compliance can be challenging. One major issue is the lack of awareness and understanding among developers about Section 508 requirements. Addressing this through targeted training and awareness programs is essential.
- Budget and resource constraints are another common hurdle. Implementing accessibility features requires investment. Highlighting the legal, ethical, and business benefits can help justify this expenditure.
- Technical limitations and compatibility issues, along with resistance to change and misconceptions about accessibility, can also pose significant challenges. Education and advocacy are key to overcoming these barriers.
