Our keeping of Holy Week and Easter were very different this year and we have been thinking afresh about the Gospel accounts as we see them from our current context.

After the Resurrection the disciples continued to meet for a while behind locked doors out of fear. But in the midst of their fear they found the joy and

peace of the risen Lord.

He comes to them, where they are, and reassures them that he is with them. Perhaps this is something we can reflect on and discover as we are 'locked' behind doors sometimes surrounded by fear and uncertainty.

**Pause and Pray** 

Each day we are inviting you to pause and pray with us at 9am and 5pm.

There was a <u>link to a simple service</u> in the previous mailing. Mthr Charlotte has prepared the suggested readings and psalms for the next 3 weeks - which are included on the link above.

Alternatively, at those times simply be still and either light a candle, or read a short passage of scripture and be aware of Christ's presence with you as light in the darkness, and be aware of the love and support of all those praying with you at that time.

Also each day at **Noon we are sharing a celebration of the Eucharist 'Easter in our Homes'** streamed to our webpage

(www.portseaparish.co.uk) from the Vicarage.

If you have access to the **YouTube Channel on your TV** then you can also share in the celebrations by searching for the

'Portsea Parish' videos.

If you have someone who can help you see this then please do join us – you can watch the celebrations at any time of the day.

Likewise, on Sundays we are celebrating at 10am.

If you want details or help to access please contact us.

In addition to this there is also the access to the daily reflections via a phone line which has the recordings of the Daily Reflections we are providing alongside the Eucharist.

There are 6 options – myself, Revds. Sue, Sam, & Marcus, Mthr Charlotte and Canon Bruce.

You simply dial in, select the option and then you can listen to the reflection.

They last between 5 & 10mins and the call costs Ip per minute (from a landline).

The number to call is 02393 190 916. The reflections will be updated every Wednesday and Sunday.



Finally, as a resource for our prayers we have access to material that we normally use for our young people on a Sunday, but which has been extended to provide material for adults.

Please don't wait for us to contact you, or hesitate to ask, there is sufficient supplies of everything in the city and we will happily help you to have what you need.

Also, if you are worried, or uncertain about anything, then just pick up the phone and call us or leave a message – key phone numbers are at the end of this letter.

I need to end mentioning that as a Parish our finances have been severely affected by the loss of income from bookings and events such as the May Fayre, as well as the weekly giving through the plate.
