Advent Greetings from all at St Mary's - especially from the Ministry Team!



There has been a lot of discussion and speculation on Christmas being different this year.

Many of the comments tend to err to the negative about what we have lost and what we won't be able to do.

However, I hope we can also reflect on how Christmas can be different in positive ways as well and especially for us as a Church how Advent can be different.

As I write this we have just heard the Government's proposals for what will happen after December 2nd.

It is still not certain which tier we will be in, and the full implications of what has been announced, but it is clear that we will be able to resume public worship.

I am very grateful for the support of colleagues who have been part of our discussions about what we will do to help everyone 'keep Advent' and prepare to welcome Christ at Christmas.

As always our aim in all that we are doing is to seek to provide as safe a space as possible for everyone to be able to be with God, be with others and be with the rest of creation.

We are trying to ensure we support everyone, whatever they are able, or not able, to do.

If we can help or support, you further please do let us know. Please see the list attached on possible events and activities- and consider if you wish to join us.



I would normally start by sharing with you much of what has been happening – but as we wish to share our thoughts for Advent I will limit it to a short summary.

Thank you to Verger Rosie and those who have helped her, St Mary's has remained open for private prayer every day from 9am to

Noon – this has been highly valued by many who have called in for some stillness and space.

Thank you also to Brian our Director of Music and Matt our Assistant Organist, who have enabled us to continue to share music in our Sunday streamed services and to Grant and the small group from the Choir who have been part of that.

We have been fortunate that despite the restrictions the organ builders were able to continue their work and it has been fascinating to see how much was hidden behind the Organ console and screens.

There is a good photographic record of the whole process much of which has been shared on <u>facebook.com/theorganproject</u> and <u>theorganproject.org</u>. We hope that by the time we reopen for public worship the scaffolding and organ contents will have left the church.



So, looking forward we would like to invite you to join in an Advent journey with us. At St Mary's this year it will be different as we will not be juggling numerous carol services and events, but can for one year focus on the Advent season and prepare ourselves for Christmas

On Saturdays at Noon we will be sharing an Advent Reflection with talks from Canon Bruce as well as the daily reflections from the Ministry Team.



From Dec 3rd we hope that those who wish to will be able to join us for the Eucharist at St Mary's at Noon and on Sundays we will resume our Sunday services at 8am & 10am at St Mary's; 9am at St

Faith's and 4pm at St Wilfrid's .

If you would like to block book, or simply attend a particular service it would help if you could contact me in advance.

In addition, we will share on You Tube and Facebook at 4pm on Nov 29th a service of Advent Music and Readings.



but on Christmas Eve we are expecting to hold a Nativity Service at 5pm and a Midnight Mass at 11.30pm at St Mary's (please apply for a place); and Masses of the Night at St Faith's and St Wilfrid's (earlier in the evening at a time to be arranged).

Then on **Christmas Day** there will be a **I0am Mass at St Mary's** which will also be streamed.

As in previous years, we will be inviting people to place stars on our Christmas Trees to remember those they have loved who have died.

The Church will continue to be open from 9am – Noon for anyone to come and pray, place stars on the tree and light a candle.

You may also want to help us to decorate churches for Christmas (and for our streamed services) with flowers.

We are grateful for those who have been providing flowers for our 3 churches over the last months – and would like to invite you to make

donations in thanksgiving or in memory of loved ones (contact me if you are interested).

At St Mary's we hope to raise £300 to cover the cost of flowers over the coming weeks.

Finally, a small group have been working with the Hope into Action charity: they will be supporting a family who will be housed in the Parish.

We will share fuller details of this when we have them, but to help cover the costs of welcoming the family we are launching **The Great St Mary's Bake Book** (to help raise funds for Hope into action). Marie writes:

We request that all who attend public worship in our Churches wear a face covering unless they are in a group which is exempt from wearing them (see Government guidance or contact one of the Ministry team for details).
