As we begin to take the steps from lockdown, and as a society, we discern what our communities will be like and how we will learn to live with COVID it is appropriate that we as a Parish community reflect on the year that is past and what influence that will have on us as we move forward.



We are all aware that the experience of COVID and the various lockdowns has been significant, both on us as individuals and as communities.



It would be wrong to assume that on 21st June (or any arbitrary date) we will simply flick a switch, and all will be as it was, and we simply pick up what we were doing and carry on.

We need to be honest about the fact that we

have changed and been changed by the events and experiences of the last 18 months.

There is a further consideration, as we plan for the future, which is the wider picture. The national church has been considering for a number of years the best way to use our clergy and our buildings.





There is a need to move to a better use and management of our resources to ensure they serve God and us, rather than constraining who and what we are.

COVID has highlighted these pressures and have exacerbated the situation – particularly with regard to finance and resources.

Alongside all of this there have been many positive aspects for the last few months.

As a Parish we have been able to focus on our vision and sought ways to be with God, with each other and the rest of creation.

We have discovered how we can share our life of prayer and worship online and through social media.

We have reshaped our liturgy and use of space to respond to the situation we are in.

We have focused on the importance of pastoral care and contact with each other.

We have a stronger sense of being a community and serving a wider community.

We need to reflect on the positive lessons of the pandemic as well as the challenges.

As a result from 30th May (Trinity Sunday) we will make some changes:

Private Prayer and Public Worship

St Mary's will continue to be open each weekday (Monday to Friday) from 9am – Noon for Private Prayer

At Noon on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at St Mary's there will be a Eucharist (which will continue to be streamed - for

instructions on how to access live streams please see below).

In addition, on Tuesday at 9.30am at St Faith's and on Thursday at 10.30am at



St Wilfrid's there will be a Eucharist (these will not be streamed)

There will be a streamed reflection around Noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

We will be ceasing Saturday Stillness with thanks to Canon Bruce for his contributions over the

last year.

Sundays there will be services at 8am and 10am at St Mary's;

9am at St Faith's and I I am at St Wilfrid's.

Coffee and Chat in the Churchyard

Weddings and Christenings



We will be setting up a new opportunity for people to 'Just Ask' about arranging christenings or weddings.

This will be on **Saturdays at 10am** – anyone is welcome to come and join us for a coffee as

we welcome those who come to make arrangements.

Being with others

We want to ensure that everyone can come and feel they are entering a safe space.

So, for the moment we will **not be permitting any physical contact at the sharing of the peace** in the churches.

Likewise, please **be aware or others and respect their space** outside of the church – not everyone will want to be hugged!

Once the social distancing rules change, we will also ensure that in each church there continues to be an area that retains social distancing and those who wish to can sit and communion will be brought to that area.

We will explain more of this when the moment comes.
