
Journey into July 2021

Sadly, some couples have had to postpone again as the restrictions that remain still affect them and we continue to hold all the couples in our prayers. As well as weddings we are

seeing a rise in Christenings and over the next few weeks we will be welcoming a number of children into the 'Christian family'.

Private Prayer and Public Worship



St Mary's is open each weekday (Monday to Friday) from 9am – Noon for Private Prayer

At Noon on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at St Mary's there is a Eucharist (which is also streamed).



In addition, on Tuesday at 9.30am at St Faith's and on Thursday at 10.30am at St Wilfrid's there will be a Eucharist (these will not be streamed)

Sundays there will be services at 8am and 10am at St Mary's; 9am at St Faith's and 11am at St Wilfrid's.

We will continue to explore and seek to maintain that deeper sense of being a community together that has grown over COVID. The Standing Committee, when it met recently, agreed to continue to suspend the 3 DCCs until we can meet together, there will be a **PCC** on July 27th in the evening (the timing and format to be decided). We need to identify how best we can make up our shortfall (in current climate we suspect that will be approx. £30k) as well as agree a priority and range of 'projects' that will need funding found for them.
