At the heart of Christmas

As we draw towards the end of Advent, we once more become aware of the confusion and darkness of the world around us. There is an air of

uncertainty and concern as well as unease at the impact of Omicron and Plan B. If we are honest, I think we are all struggling to work out what is best and right.

What has got us through the last 20 months is our focusing on God and seeking to be the body of Christ –rooting ourselves in prayer, supporting one another, and respecting the different views and

feelings, while seeking to create a space so that as many as possible can be with God and each other. As we all grow increasingly weary and confused by the twists and turns it gets more difficult and I hope we can all look out for each other and find ways to support each other as we together seek to serve the wider community.



Advent is about us preparing to discover the presence of God in the reality of our lives and world. The Christmas story is, behind all the gloss we have added over the centuries, a messy and

tough story of the birth of a child in challenging circumstances. But those who focus on that baby discover something wonderful and peaceful in the midst of the chaos and mess. Perhaps we can each this Christmas seek to discover where God is in this current mess and how we can share that peace and wonder with those around us. Perhaps we need to focus on what we can do – and do it well – rather than become distracted and frustrated at what we cannot do, or by those who seem to be making the situation worse. Let us seek to do all we can in our worship, in our music, in our care of each other, in our welcome of the stranger etc so that we may be the body of Christ in the midst of the uncertainty of the world.

We will further adapt the guidance we have previously put in place. It is now a legal requirement for face coverings to be worn in Church. Please consider whether you wish to remove them when singing or not. We will restore all our seating to being spaced out and will resume administering communion to each person where they are. Tea and Coffee will be served, but please be sensitive to others and do not crowd around the serving tables, and only remove face coverings when actually drinking.

We appreciate that for some these moves will not be enough while for other they may be challenging and unsettling. Please do let the Ministry know your feelings and thoughts and we will be adapting and developing as we believe is best for the common good. Please continue to show the care and respect for each other- and our worship and love of God – that you have shown in such depth over the past months.

We hope that you will be able to share with us as far as possible in our life of prayer, worship and reflection. We have made some changes to our Advent programme and events. What follows is a list of services and activities – but please be aware these may change and be further adapted as things change around us.

Advent Book Club. There will be an opportunity for the last 2 Wednesdays of Advent to meet on Zoom for an hour from 7pm to explore a book with Revd Sam & Fi. The Book is the 'Music of Eternity' – meditations for advent with Evelyn Underhill. If you would like to join, please contact Revd Sam as soon as possible,

Fellowship Lunches These will meet on **Wednesday I 5th &** 22nd **Dec** and they will include a discussion on some of the themes in the book led by one of the Ministry Team. This will be after the Noon Mass – please bring your own lunch. Seats will be set up socially distanced.

The themes for the last 2 weeks are

Advent 3 Recognising God's coming

Advent 4 Embracing God's coming

Also, the rhythm of Parish life will continue – giving you opportunities to pause and reflect on the presence of Christ with you in your lives and of his light and peace in the gloom and confusion of the world.

Private Prayer and Public Worship

St Mary's is open each weekday (Monday to Friday) from 9am – Noon for Private Prayer

At Noon on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at St Mary's there is a Eucharist (which is also streamed).

In addition, on **Tuesday at 9.30am at St Faith's** and on **Thursday at 10.30am at St Wilfrid's** there will be a Eucharist (these will not be streamed)

There will be a streamed reflection around Noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Sundays there will be services at

8am (not on 26th) and 10am at St Mary's;

9am at St Faith's (not on 19th or 26th Dec)

and I am at St Wilfrid's. (not on 19th or 26th Dec)

Just Ask Saturdays 10 – I lam at St Mary's – a chance to come and explore arranging Weddings and Christenings or 'just ask' the clergy anything!
