

## Between the time Feb 2022



This week we marked the end of the Christmas Season and for a period returned to what in the Church's calendar is called 'Ordinary Time'. The colour changes from White to Green and from this Sunday we will count down the

Sundays till Lent. This is one of those year's where that period between Christmas and Lent will be the whole of February as Ash Wednesday is March 2<sup>nd</sup>. That sense of between the times extends beyond the church's calendar. We have moved out of Plan B in response to COVID but still are in a period of care for each other and caution.



The PCC and Standing Committee are regularly reviewing how we continue to ensure as possible can share in our life in as safe a way as possible, currently we are encouraging everyone to wear a face covering in

our churches, and to be sensitive to others and the space they need around them. If you wish to remain in seats which are set apart then in each church, there are seats set distanced for you to use. We are also aware of our need to ensure that our hospitality is offered as safely as we can so are ensuring that those preparing and serving Tea and Coffee etc are wearing a face covering and if possible, wearing gloves to handle mugs etc. If you are sharing in tea and coffee, please continue to be sensitive to others and do not crowd around the serving tables, and only remove face coverings when actually drinking. We will review again and are considering any other changes to happen at Ash Wednesday,

We appreciate that for some these moves will not be enough while for other they may be challenging and unsettling. Please do let the Ministry know your feelings and thoughts and we will be adapting and developing as we believe is best for the common good. Please continue to show the care and respect for each other- and our worship and love of God – that you have shown in such depth over the past months.



Part of being between times is a sense of looking forward. Over the next few weeks there are some things we can begin to look forward to. On **March 12**<sup>th</sup> we will as a Diocese be welcoming our **Bishop**, **Jonathan**, as he begins his ministry with us. We also look forward to welcoming **Fr Rajiv as a curate**. You will find some words from him

introducing himself. There will be a small service of welcome **at 6pm** on March  $I^{st}$  (Shrove Tuesday) and that will be followed by Pancake Races, Food and a Quiz – you can join in some or all of those things!



Another thing to look forward to (and hold in prayers) will be a **Confirmation later in the year**. On Candlemas we welcomed those exploring their faith — **Aimee, Alana, Harry, Linda, Lizzie, Maisie, Rachael, Samuel, Teela-May — and we will announce when the confirmation is, once** 

Bishop Jonathan has arrived. If you would like to explore our faith with them then please let one of the Ministry Team know.

Also looking ahead there is the joy of the **Parish Panto** – which is resuming rehearsals – on **Saturday March 26**<sup>th</sup> – we hope you can join us at **2.30pm or 7pm**.



One of the areas the **Social Justice Group** is focusing on is our response to the Environment and how we can be better stewards of creation. We were delighted that they have been successful in being given a grant to help us

develop sustainable transport. The first sign of this is **the 6 new Bike Stands on the North side of St Mary's** – we hope people will begin to use these and consider cycling more often. There are further items to appear ... but more on that next time!



Inside St Mary's the Organ Project has seen the return of the restored pipes which are now in the North Aisle. Currently the Screen is being cleaned and the angels on it

re-gilded. If you get the chance do call in and see the work in progress. It's also still not too late to sponsor a pipe – please contact Matt Dixon for details.

In this in-between time, we will continue to invite everyone to **pause** and pray with us at 9 and 6 each day. Also, to share in daily worship either online or at our churches.
