Something old, something new ...May 2022









There have been a number of signs of life blossoming as Spring develops towards Summer. There has been our celebrations of Holy Week and Easter with a re-establishing of elements of our liturgy (including at St Mary's the first use of the High Altar on Holy Saturday). Thank you to all who contributed to the services and preparation of the Churches – and to our preachers in Holy week and the Archdeacon over the Tridium. There has been the much awaited return of the May Fayre – a great event. Many have commented on the atmosphere and the number of people there - St John's Ambulance estimated 15,000! Thank you to the huge Army of volunteers (nearly 90) from across the Parish who worked together to hep us raise over £12K! Then this weekend sees the first of our **Summer weddings** – with 2 couples who have been waiting since 2020! - and the joy those services bring.

One of the phrases associated with weddings is '**Something old, something new** ...' and if you want to know the rest and what it means ask any of those who have listened in the past to Deacon Ken's wonderful 'traditions of marriage' talks. As we move through Spring into Summer that is a phrase we can reflect on.

The last 2 years have had a deep impact on all of us and we have to recognise that we are not ethe same as we were – all of us have changed and our view of ourselves, the world and God may also have been affected. So as we begin to return to some familiar things, we will find in them somethings old – but we will also find somethings that are new, It would be interesting to hear from you what you have valued and learnt about yourself and God over the last few months – and what you have valued about the way we have grown as his people and

how we share our life together. Please do share your thoughts with one of the ministry team.



As Ascension Day approaches on May 25th so it is time for us to review again our response to COVID and how that shapes our worship. We will continue to ensure that the churches are as safe a space as they can be for all to gather together, and within

each church we will maintain areas where people can continue to sit at a safe distance from one another and in those areas to use face coverings etc.



However, the Parish Wardens and Ministry Team are suggesting that from Ascension Day we cease to encourage people to wear a face covering in Church. It will become 'optional' (unless seated in the seats set at a distance). The ministers

administering communion, however, will continue to wear a covering. **Hand sanitiser** will also continue to be available at the door (and will be used by those administering communion). If you have any concerns or views on this then please do let Fr Bob know.

We have decided to continue to **administer Communion** in both kinds with the Priest intincting in the chalice – but will be exploring extending this to other services beyond Sunday morning, We will continue to keep this under review and will reflect when it will be appropriate to restore a full sharing of the Chalice.

We appreciate that for some these moves will not be enough while for other they may continue to be challenging and unsettling. **Please do let the Ministry team know your feelings and thoughts and we** will be adapting and developing as we believe is best for the common good. Please continue to show the care and respect for each other- and our worship and love of God – that you have shown in such depth over the past months. The rhythm of Parish life also continues

Memorial to all who died over COVID



One of the new things at St Mary's from COVID has been the moving of the reserved Sacrament to the High Altar - as a sign of Christ's presence with us through all we have faced. The Diocese have now approved plans

drawn up by our Architect for this to be a permanent feature and to improve the layout of the area around the High Altar. We will also (post Organ Project) be re-ordering the Boniface Chapel into a space for us to support the bereaved and those who come seeking conversations and support. We will later in the year be re-dedicating the East End in memory f those who have died over the last 2 years. Another 'old, but new thing' is the completion of the restoration of the organ, The good news is the scaffolding has already been dismantled and we can see the visual transformation of the case and gold pipes. It is hoped we will begin to hear the instrument being

A further new thing has been the appearance of our new Electric Cargo Bike – this will be used by us for moving things between the 3 churches and to help us to reduce our carbon footprint. Alongside this is the news that we have been granted **a Silver Award** as

an EcoChurch by A Rocha. (We are the only Silver award in the Diocese, the only Gold Award is on the Isle of Wight). We hope this will encourage all of us to look at how we respect the gifts of creation and consider what we can do together and alone to move us from Silver to Gold!



Another change that is about to happen is the **Revd Sue will be moving from St Faith's**. As you may be aware Revd Sue began a full time job in the Autumn at the FE College – and that along with other calls on her time mean that she is unbale to

do as much in the Parish. After discussions with the Archdeacon and Father Bod it was agreed that she will reman part of our Parish Ministry Team, but not have any particular responsibilities within it. She will say farewell to St Faith's on May 22nd and move to St Mary's as her main Church from Ascension Day. Revd Sam supported by Revd Kate will take on the responsibility for leading the community at St Faiths and sharing in ministry there with Revd Jenny and Jenny Stemp. As we give thanks for Revd Sue's ministry there let us pray for that community over the coming weeks.
