### The Bishop speaks to those to be confirmed

The Bishop asks the candidate for baptism

James, do you wish to be baptized?

Candidate I do.

The Bishop asks the candidates for confirmation who have been baptized,

Have you been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit?

Candidates I have.

The Bishop asks all the candidates

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

lam Candidates

The Bishop addresses the whole congregation Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome these candidates and uphold them in their life in Christ? With the help of God, we will.

#### The Bishop speaks to those to be confirmed

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask these questions:

Do you turn to Christ? I turn to Christ.

All

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

The Bishop	makes the sign of the cross on James' forehead, using the oil of catechumen
saying	Christ claims you for his own.
	Receive the sign of his cross.
When he	has been signed, the Bishop says to him
	Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ

crucified.

All Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

#### We affirm our Faith

The Bishop addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with these candidates the faith of the Church Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? We believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? We believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? We believe and trust in him.

#### This is the faith of the Church. This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Bishop addresses the candidate for baptism by name, saying lames, is this your faith?

he responds:

#### This is my faith.

# The Baptism

The Bishop pours water on him, saying

James, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

#### All Amen.

#### After the Baptism the Bishop prays

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.** 

Almighty God,

we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all who have been baptized into your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

#### All Amen.

The candidates come forward to the font and sign themselves with water. All the candidates then process with the clergy to the front of the Church.

#### We all sing

Take, O take me as I am Summon out what I shall be, Set your seal upon my heart and live in me.

# The Confirmation

The Bishop stands before those who are to be confirmed, and says

Our help is in the name of the Lord who has made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the name of the Lord **now and for ever. Amen.** 

The Bishop extends his hands towards those to be confirmed and says

Almighty and ever-living God, you have given these your servants new birth in baptism by water and the Spirit, and have forgiven them all their sins. Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding; the Spirit of counsel and inward strength; the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord. **Amen.** 

Each candidate is presented by their sponsor. The Bishop addresses each candidate by name

N, God has called you by name and made you his own.

He then lays his hand on the head of each, saying

Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

The Bishop invites the congregation to pray for all the candidates

Defend, O Lord, these your servants with your heavenly grace, that they may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until they come to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

After the introduction

#### We offer our lives to Christ

After the Bishop has recalled the words of Jesus at the Last Supper

Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The prayer continues and at the end all respond Amen.

#### We pray as Jesus taught us

Rejoicing in God's new creation, we pray: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### We break the bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Jesus, Lamb of God, the Word made flesh: Jesus, Son of God, come down on earth:

#### All sing Hear our prayer, have mercy; hear our prayer have mercy; give us your peace.

Jesus, King of glory, Prince of Peace: Jesus shining in our darkened world: **Hear our prayer etc** 

Jesus, King of angels, Lord of joy: Jesus born to save the world from sin: **Hear our prayer etc** 

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

#### We are blessed

The Bishop raises the host and chalice and says The Body and Blood of Christ

#### All Amen

As communion is distributed, wherever you are pray that you may be aware of Christ's presence with you and that you will be blessed and comforted by it

If you are at Church please come forward to the Dais to receive standing – please respect other people's space. If you wish to receive where you are seated at the distanced seats, please remain standing until you have received.

During Communion the Choir will sing an anthem, after which

#### We say thank you

The Bishop offers a prayer at the end of which all say **All Amen** 

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

There will be some notices given

#### We are blessed

The Lord be with you and also with you.

The Bishop gives God's Blessing and all respond Amen.

He who would valiant be 'gainst all disaster, let him in constancy follow the Master. There's no discouragement shall make him once relent his first avowed intent to be a pilgrim.

Who so beset him round with dismal stories, do but themselves confoundhis strength the more is. No foes shall stay his might, though he with giants fight: he will make good his right to be a pilgrim.

#### We sing the final hymn

Since, Lord, thou dost defend us with thy Spirit, we know we at the end shall life inherit. Then fancies flee away! I'll fear not what men say, I'll labour night and day to be a pilgrim.

The clergy give each candidate a lighted candle. These are lit from the Paschal candle.

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light. You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life. Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Go in the light and peace of Christ. Thanks be to God.

Please remain standing while the Bishop leads the newly confirmed to the west end of the Church.

After the service you are welcome to join us and continue our celebrations with a glass of wine or juice served near the Tower.

You are also welcome to join us for a picnic lunch in the churchyard – possibly with a game of rounders! – and then re-gather in the Church at 2.15 for a farewell cake and another glass of wine as we give thanks for Revd Marcus ministry with us.
