Harvest 2022

Listening to creation - with thankful hearts!



This is the time of year when we would normally have been sharing a leaflet and asking you to reflect on how you will celebrate Harvest this year. As we noted in last week's leaflet our preparations for Harvest and the Autumn Term were affected by the death of the Queen.

It seems to be that such an event makes us all stop and think about our own lives and the values and priorities we live by. Her Majesty's example of Christian living was one which has had a huge impact on so many lives and relationships and her death and the way we have mourned together has also made us aware of the importance of our common life.



Just before her death the new Government had announced its initial response to the fuel crisis, and we will soon hear (or have heard) more of their response to the cost of living situation and the economic challenges we all face. One of the signs of

this growing pressure on our lives and our society has been the increasing usage of Foodbanks, Pantries and Larders - and they in turn reporting a reduction in supply and provision available to them. It was in the light of this that we have joined with others in our city to call all of us to respond with thankful hearts for what we have, by sharing some of our resources (especially food) with those who may be under increasing pressures. But, this year, we are asking people not just to do this at Harvest; we are asking people to make a commitment to support a food provider for a year with regular donations and supplies.



In the Parish we are asking you to donate food at our Harvest celebrations on Oct 2nd for us to share with The Roberts Centre – and then we will have collecting boxes in Church each week for you to make a donation into as regularly as you are able. This food will be shared with Landport Larder

and (once opened) with the St Mary's Pantry with Fratton Big Local which will be in the Bridge Centre. Once we have details of this opening, we will be asking you to consider donating some of your time

to help run it as a volunteer a couple of hours a week. More information will follow in the coming weeks.

Alongside having an impact on individuals lives the cost of fuel and other items will also have an impact on our Churches. Our expenses will be rising over the coming months, and we need to find ways to help raise the money we need to cover our costs - just as any household would need to. We appreciate that finances are going to be tight for everyone but would ask that if you are able to make a regular commitment to support the Parish that you either continue to do so, or start. It is easy to do and we can provide with envelopes for you to use to make a regular donation; bank account details so you can set up a Standing Order; or information about a national scheme which will both collect funds for us and monthly (if you are eligible) claim back the Gift Aid (Tax paid) on your donation for the Church to use. Please do ask one of the ministry team or Paul Morgan for more information. There is a supply of request slips in Church for you to use to hand to us for a meeting or to set up a process for you.

However, you wish to respond with thankful hearts we hope you will join us as we celebrate Harvest in the Parish. There are a number of different ways you can share in our celebrations, and we look forward to seeing you at some of them.

Finally on Saturday Oct 8th there will be a Quiet Day and an opportunity to 'listen to the voice of creation' at the Sustainability Centre at East Meon – this will be led by Revd Kate. We need a minimum number of people to sign up to make this possible, and so far have not reached that level. Please contact Revd Sam if you want more information or to join us.

Alongside our Harvest celebrations the Autumn sees the resumption of our familiar rhythm of life and also some other special events.

As COVID is still around in the community we have decided to not make any significant changes to our church routines for communion etc for a few weeks as we wait to see if the Autumn will see a resurgence of infections.



We will be continuing to invite you to pause and pray with us at 9am and 6pm each day. We will also be streaming our Noon Mass on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and our main Sunday Service at 10am. However, we will be ceasing to post a weekly set of reflections – if you feel we should continue then please

let Fr Bob know. Thank you to all who contributed regularly to these, especially to Fr Nicholas for his weekly offering until the Summer.



We will be holding a **Parish Autumn Fair on Saturday Oct 29th at 10am** at St Mary's – as with the May Fair and other recent events we will be combing the talents and skills of the 3 Churches. **If you**

Patronal Festivals – this year we will be celebrating the Patronal Festival for St Faith's on the eve of St Faith's Day – Wednesday Oct 5th. There will be a Mass at St Faith's at 7pm on that evening and we will welcome Revd Annie McCabe (Associate Area Dean and Vicar of St Luke's) as our preacher. Come and give thanks for the life of that Church and the community of Landport of which it is a part. The following week we will begin our 'farewell' to St

Wilfrid's Church building. As you may be aware the decision has been made to re-develop the site as it is not sustainable as it is. We will be spending time over the coming weeks giving thanks for all that has been and sharing our memories. This will lead to a Requiem

Mass in early November and then supporting the worshipping community in settling into other churches before the final service at the end of November, when Bishop Jonathan will join us. Our first celebration in this journey will be on **Wednesday Oct 12th at 7pm at St Wilfrid's**. We will be joined by Bishop Jan Brackley, one of the assistant bishops of

some further investigations and recently shared this with the Fellowship lunch. If you would like to know more then ask her ... or wait to hear of the report from the Art Restorer.


